INTRODUCTION

CHILDREN’S BOOKS WILL ALWAYS BE BIG SELLERS

I am not going to go through all the stats that prove that the children’s book market is continuously growing. I don’t need to show you the sales growth numbers or the children’s book category pie charts or book sales graphs; there is no need anymore because it is common knowledge that kids’ books sell...period!

I am personally involved with a number of different children’s book genres/categories and over time I have noticed these book sales go up each and every year. Just so you know, I never have to update these books...I create them once and they continue to make sales over and over again.

The main reason for this is because most kid’s books are evergreen and this is especially so regarding the early learning genre which is what this course is all about.

Let me also point out that only a small percentage of my books are actually fiction – (children’s fiction being the biggest sellers). Most of my kids’ books are non-fiction and they bring in a good amount of profits each and every month for me.

One of the great things about creating children’s books, (apart from it being a lot of fun), is that there are so many categories, sub-categories and genres to choose from. As a kid’s book author or publisher you can never run out of ideas.

As mentioned above, kid’s fiction books make the biggest sales. A fiction book with a fun story and amazing illustrations can change

an author’s life forever...I am talking buy a brand new car, pay your monthly mortgage type of change! However, there is one downside to creating children’s fiction books...they take a lot of work to get right and unless you are an illustrator it can cost A LOT to create good images for your books.

This course focuses on **non-fiction children’s books**, specifically in the **Early Learning** genre and for children who are at pre-school age up to around Grade 3. I decided to pick this specific age range because I found that creating kids’ books gets much more involved the older the children are.

Truth is I am not much of a story teller and I don’t particularly enjoy writing fiction. So, I try to keep things simple and continue to discover ways to work 80% smart and 20% hard...rather than the other way round. This is why I chose non-fiction.

The children’s early learning book niche requires very little, if any, writing for the author/publisher...YOU. That means with very little effort you can create books faster and with ease once you get the hang of it.

Another great thing about creating kids non-fiction books is that you don’t have to rack your brains trying to think up stories and develop characters. You certainly don’t have to pay for expensive children’s book illustrators.

Many of us just don’t have the time to spend one month creating just one book that may or may not be a big seller. In my experience, it’s better to create a number of QUALITY books QUICKLY in order to get those sales coming in and the easiest way to do this is with non-fiction kid’s books.

BIG SALES ON AMAZON

I am going to provide you with some examples of books that can be created using the methods explained in this course. I am just going to use Amazon.com and Amazon.co.uk as the sources because the bulk of your book sales will most likely come from there.

Browsing through the Amazon book categories is a great way to do book research. It will help you to get ideas for books and also gives you the opportunity to see exactly what types of books are trending at that time.

AMAZON.COM


There are a couple of ways you can find these types of books on Amazon.com. You can just type in a keyword related to your book in the search bar at the top or you can search for books via the category section on the left of the page.

I prefer to use the second option because you can target the type of books you are looking for more accurately.


- 1.** Go to [Amazon.com](https://www.amazon.com) and click to go to the BOOKS category.
- 2.** In the Amazon page scroll down the left sidebar and click on CHILDREN’S BOOKS.
- 3.** Again, in the left sidebar scroll down and click on EARLY LEARNING. In the image on the next page you can see some of the current best sellers in that category.

You can literally start browsing from here if you wanted because, as you can see in the images, there are already a huge list of books to choose from. You can see the lists comprise of the “Best Sellers”, “Most Gifted”, “New Releases” and “Most Wished For”.

The one thing you will notice is that many of these top books are fiction books. Fiction are the biggest sellers so of course they will dominate most category pages but you can still pick and choose non-fiction books to research from the lists.

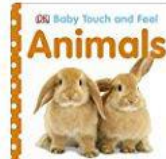

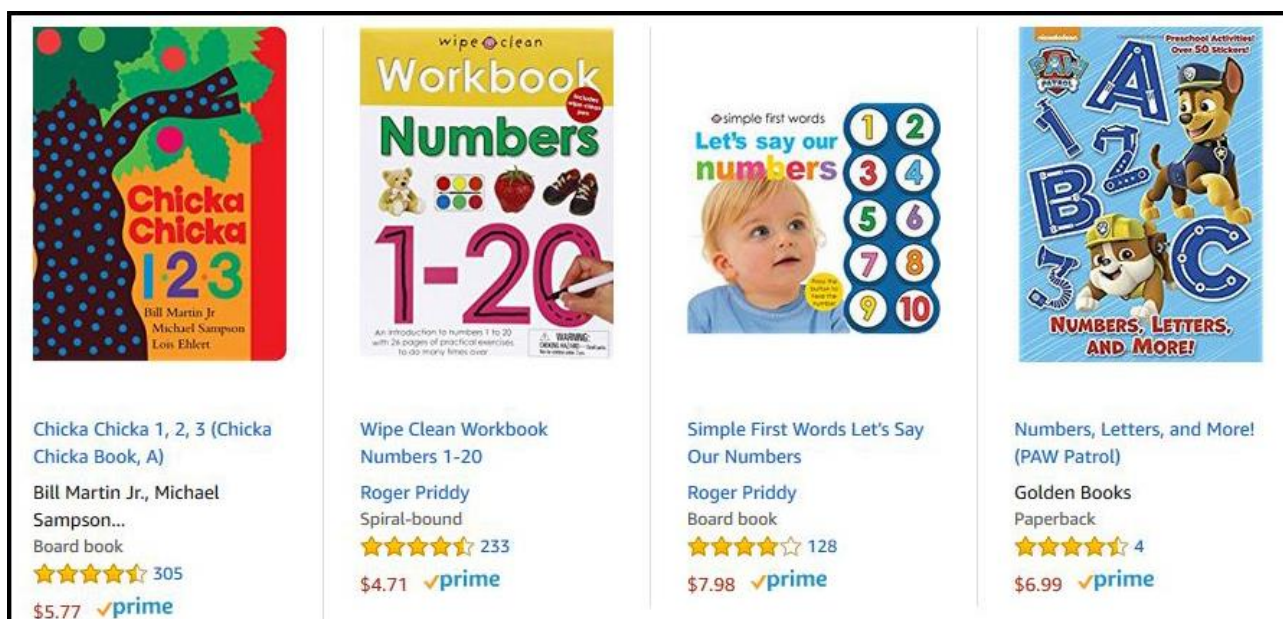
Of course, make sure to read through this whole PDF first so you know roughly what type of books you will be able to create without much trouble.

For example:- You will be able to create math style workbooks for children of all ages. If you look at the “Basic Concepts” category page you will see a sub-category called “Counting”.



If you click that category you will be taken to a page filled with books on counting. Again, many of these will be fiction books but if you do a little browsing you can pick up some awesome ideas for books that you can create yourself...

Pick a few books and click on them to see more details. Check out the interior layout, the cover design, the book description and read the reviews because these can give you an idea of what people are looking for within that sub-category.

You can literally do this for all the “Basic Concept” sub-categories if you wished. How you do this is entirely up to you.

Another example:- In this course you will be able to create word tracing and Alphabet style workbooks. Back to the main Basic Concepts category page, if you click on the “Alphabet” image you will be taken to a page filled with these types of books.





When you click on any of these books you can dig even deeper and discover even more books of the same style to provide you with even more ideas!

So if you clicked on one of the “Tracing” style books and scroll down the page you will come across yet another list of books related to just “Tracing” style books!

The amount of research ideas you can pick up from Amazon ALONE is enough for you to create A LOT of books. You can just keep clicking away on books and keep going deeper into each category and sub-category.

I know at first this may seem a little time consuming but believe me when I tell you that this is vital to help you get an understanding of what type of books you need to be working on in order to get the best results from your time.

As you get further along in the course you will begin to realize that there are countless options available to you - (You will see what I mean in the next few STEPS!). You will be able to create workbooks in almost every Basic Concepts sub-category AND with a little imagination you can even mix categories together to create “Bumper” or “mixed category” workbooks!

So let’s say you wanted a workbook to have more variety, (to keep the child interested), you could create a book that has a mixture of English Lit AND Math!

OR you can focus on making a series of books within just one sub-category such as a series of three books on “Handwriting Practice” or three books on “Phonics” or a series of 6 books on “Addition”. You will see in the next few STEPS that there is no end to the amount of books you can create!

As well as “Category” styles you also have the option to target specific age groups. So, you can do book series targeting pre-schoolers and then do another book series for Kindergarteners and then another for 1st Graders and so on.

You can do this for each and every category and sub-category you see in the Amazon sections we looked at above!

I think you can appreciate the potential for being able to literally build your own children’s workbook empire with this course alone! In time, with some dedicated work, you can gradually build and grow a residual book sales income.

AMAZON.CO.UK

Amazon.com is probably where you will get most of your sales but in my experience the second most popular Amazon site is .co.uk...the UK site.

I first and foremost target the US market but there really is no major difference regarding style of books when it comes to which country you target...unless it’s in a foreign language of course.

All the books you create and publish on Amazon will automatically be featured on ALL Amazon sites so you don’t need to worry about uploading your book countless times to each and every Amazon online.

However, if you live in the UK or you just want to target UK residence then navigating the Amazon.co.uk site for book research will be slightly different. Let me just quickly run through it here.








- 1.** Go to [Amazon.co.uk](https://www.amazon.co.uk) and click to go to the BOOKS category.



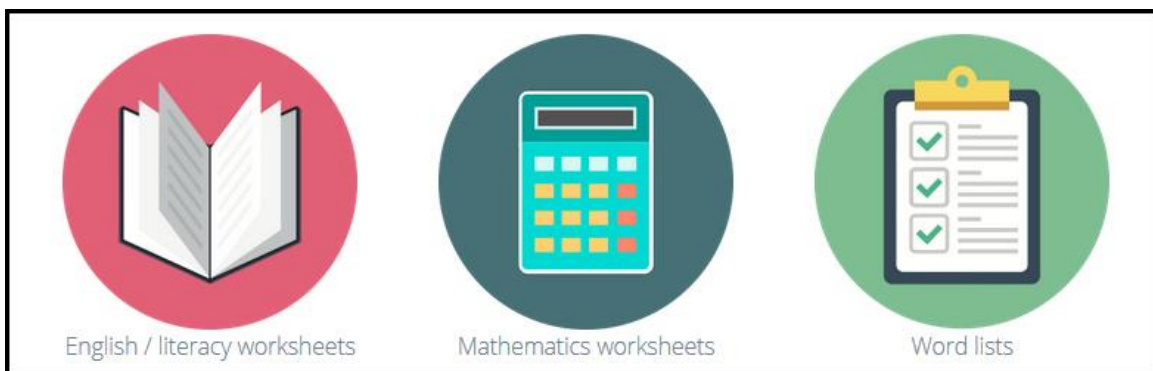
STEP ONE

HOW TO USE WORKSHEET GENIUS

Go to <http://worksheetgenius.com/> and on the homepage you should see something like this:



The three circled images at the bottom are not relevant to this course so we will be focusing on the top three circled images. These are titled – “English Literacy Worksheets”, “Mathematics Worksheets” and “Word Lists”.



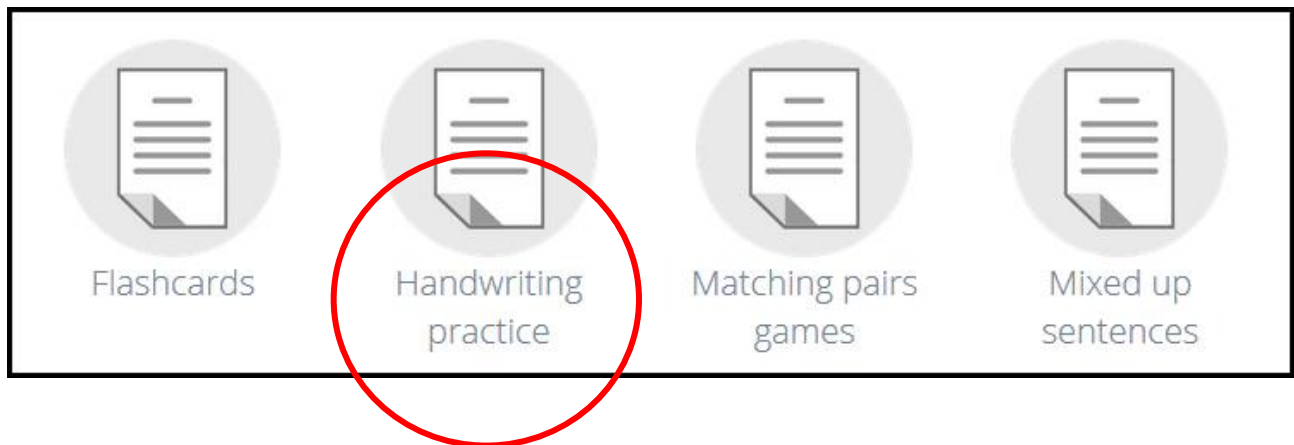
If you click on the first circle – “English Literacy Worksheets” – you will be taken to a page that shows all the options available to you within this category.



All of the worksheet categories here can be created to make either individual category workbooks or variety category workbooks. There are many options available to you...it just depends on how you want to proceed.


Later in the course we will be looking at each category in more detail to help you to decide what type of workbooks you want to create but for now let’s just take a look at one of the category options just to give you an idea of how things are laid out.

Click on “Handwriting Practice”. We will just use this as an example.



As you can see the page has a number of options for you to choose from regarding creating a handwriting practice worksheet. Any of the worksheet categories you choose from will also have very similar options on their page. All options are related to the particular category so they will not be the same.

We will be looking at each of the categories individually later on in the course but for now we will use Handwriting Practice as an example.



Design your handwriting worksheet

Worksheet title


Enter a title for your worksheet.

Instructions (optional)

These are the instructions that will be written at the top of the page.

Text

This is the text that the student will be asked to practise.



Lost for words? Then why not browse our word lists? Just select the words you want and Worksheet Genius will fill this page in for you.

Line guide style

- ☒ Single lower line guide.
- ☐ Upper and lower line guides.
- ☐ Upper, lower and mid-height guidelines.

Copy under lines.

- ☐ No copy under line. Combine this with the grey out text option, to create a worksheet where children practise writing over the top of some given text.
- ☐ Leave a copy under line underneath each row, where the student can practise copying the text.
- ☒ Leave a copy under line, and then same additional padding, so pairs of lines are grouped together.

Height of capital letters

- ☒ Leave a gap between capital letters and the top of the line guide.

Font size.

All you have to do in order to create a Handwriting Practice worksheet is fill in the options on the page that you feel are relevant to you.

So for the above example you have the option to add a title to your worksheet. Personally, I leave the title out because it ends up taking more space on the final worksheet. To remove the default title just delete it.

Below that box you can see the option to add instructions. Again, unless this is really necessary I tend to leave this part out because the text takes up space on the worksheet.

As you scroll down further you can see the word list option:



You will find this option in all the available categories. What it does is provide you with an opportunity to gather relevant word lists from a catalogue of word lists on the website. It basically saves you time and effort browsing Google to find your own word lists. This will all become clear when we look at Word Lists a little later on.

Below this box you can see more available options such as choosing a “line guide style”, “copy under lines”, “height of capital letters”, “font size” and many more.

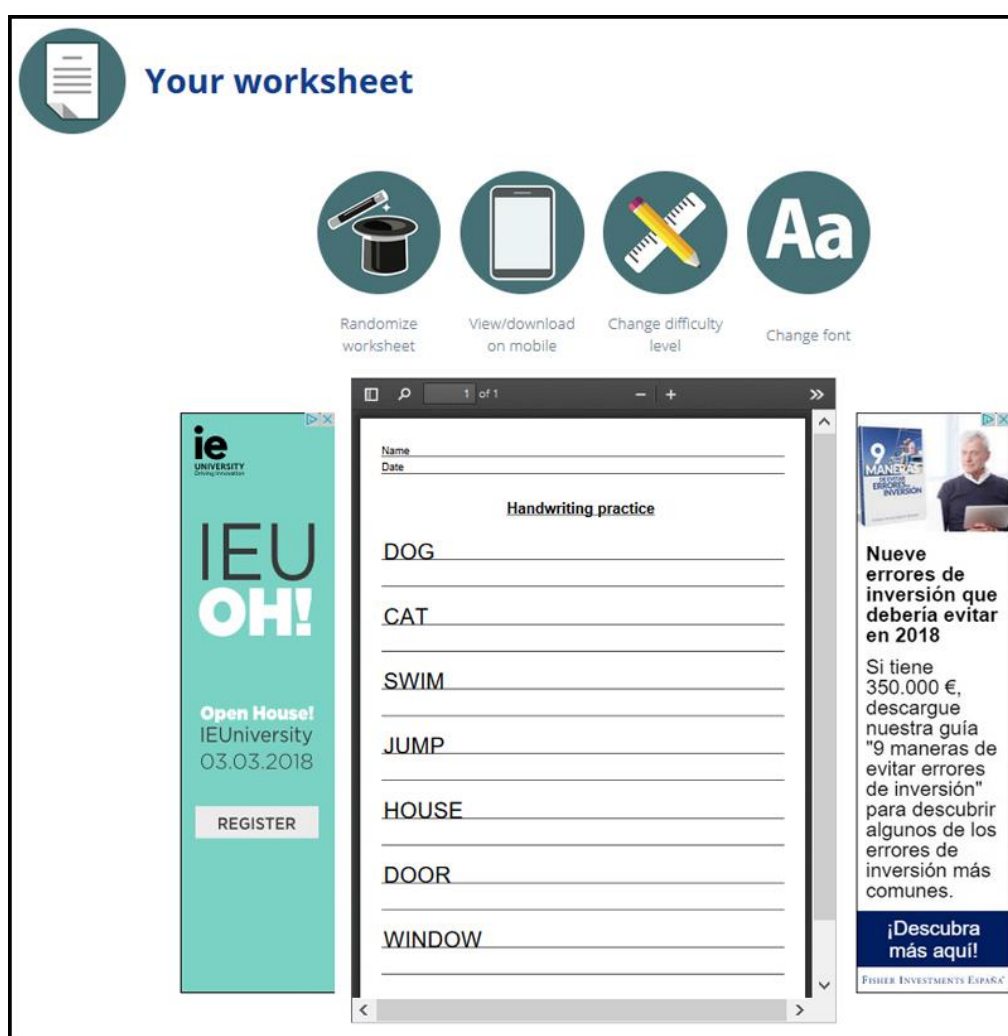
All of these are self-explanatory and just require you to experiment with until you find the options that suit you best for that particular worksheet that you are creating.

If you prefer you can leave everything set as default and the worksheets turn out really good but if you have a specific look in mind for each worksheet then you have the option to change things around.

Once you have decided on how you want your worksheet to look you then scroll down to the bottom of the page and click the green “Create Worksheet” button. This button will be on all category pages.

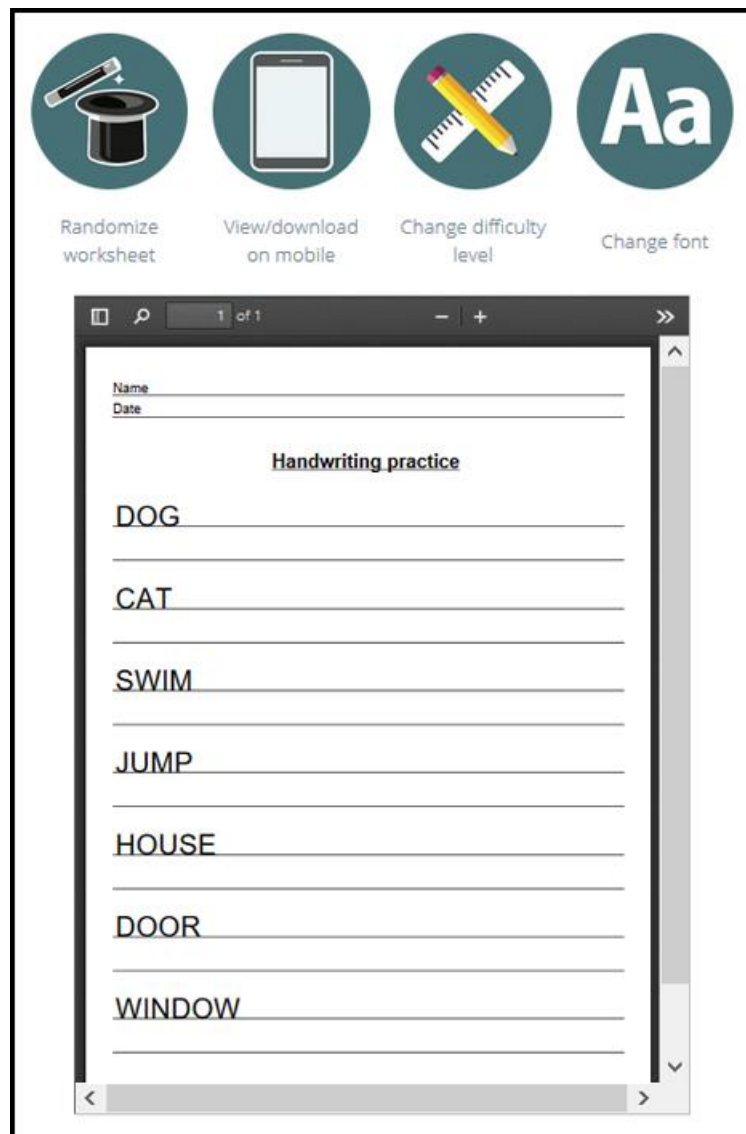
Create worksheet

After clicking the green button your worksheet will now be created. The finished page will look something like this:



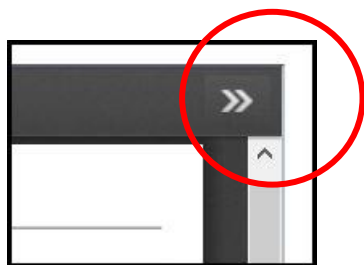
Just ignore all the ads on the left and right of the worksheet...these are there because you are using a free online program. The program creator is allowing you to use it for free so I personally have no complaints regarding the ads.

Ignore the ads and you get the completed worksheet with some new options above it.

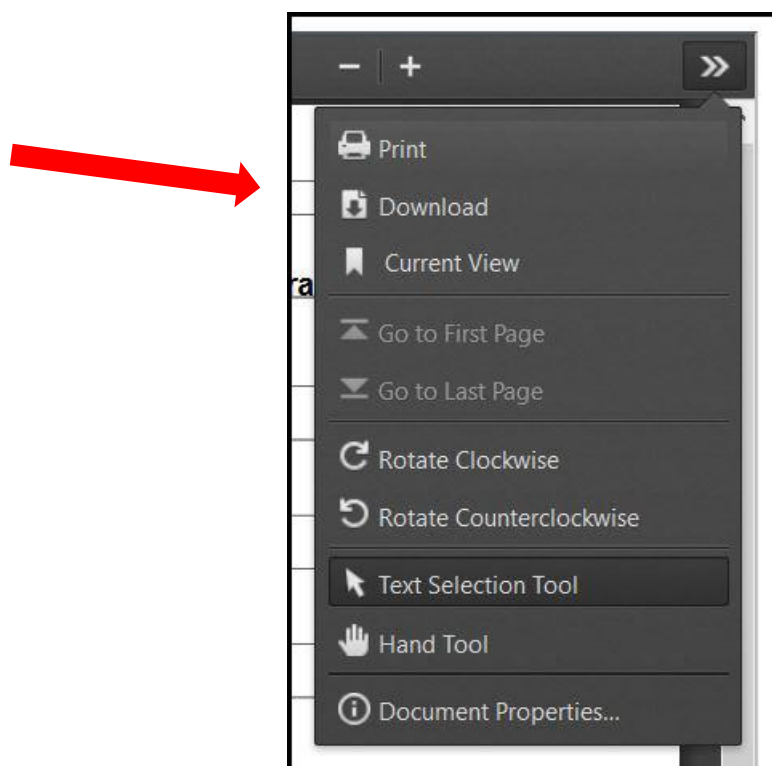


These options are self-explanatory and they are the same on all worksheet categories. Again, you can leave these as default or you can experiment with them to suit your needs.

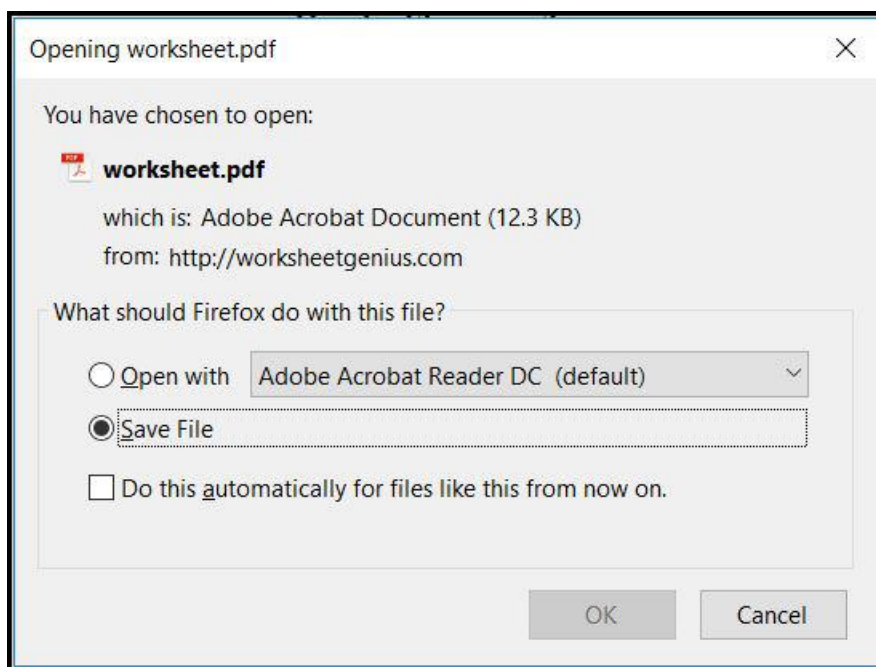
Once you are happy with the worksheet all you need to do now is create it. In the top right corner of the worksheet creator you can see this arrow icon:-



Click on that arrow and a dropdown menu will appear providing a number of options:-



The one option you need to focus on is “Download”. If you click that you will be able to download a PDF version of your worksheet direct to your computer.



Click OK and save the PDF to your computer. Make sure to remember where the PDF is saved. From there I will show you how to convert your PDF worksheets into images to then be inserted into your book templates.


But...not to get ahead of myself, all that will be explained later on in this course. Right now, just click on the Worksheet Genius header at the top of the website page and go back to the homepage.















Click on the “Mathematics Worksheets” circle and you will be taken to a category page with all the math worksheet options:

older children. If you are focused on creating books for preschoolers or kindergarten you can adapt your worksheet creations to keep them as simple as possible. You also have a number of categories that may fit better with a much younger age group such as “Counting”, “Number Lines”, “Bingo”, etc.

Click on the first category, “Addition” just so you can get an idea of what the math layouts look like.

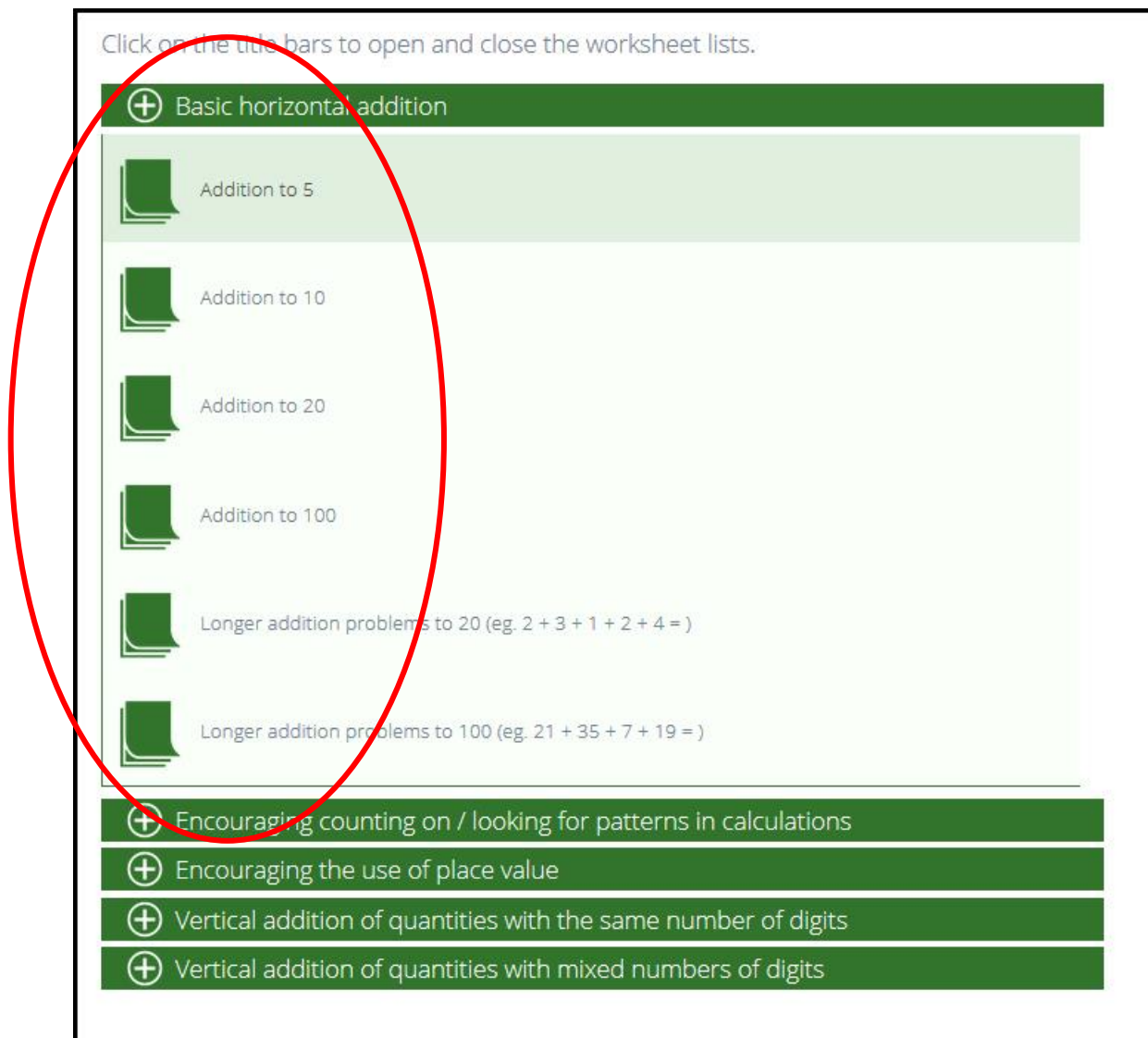

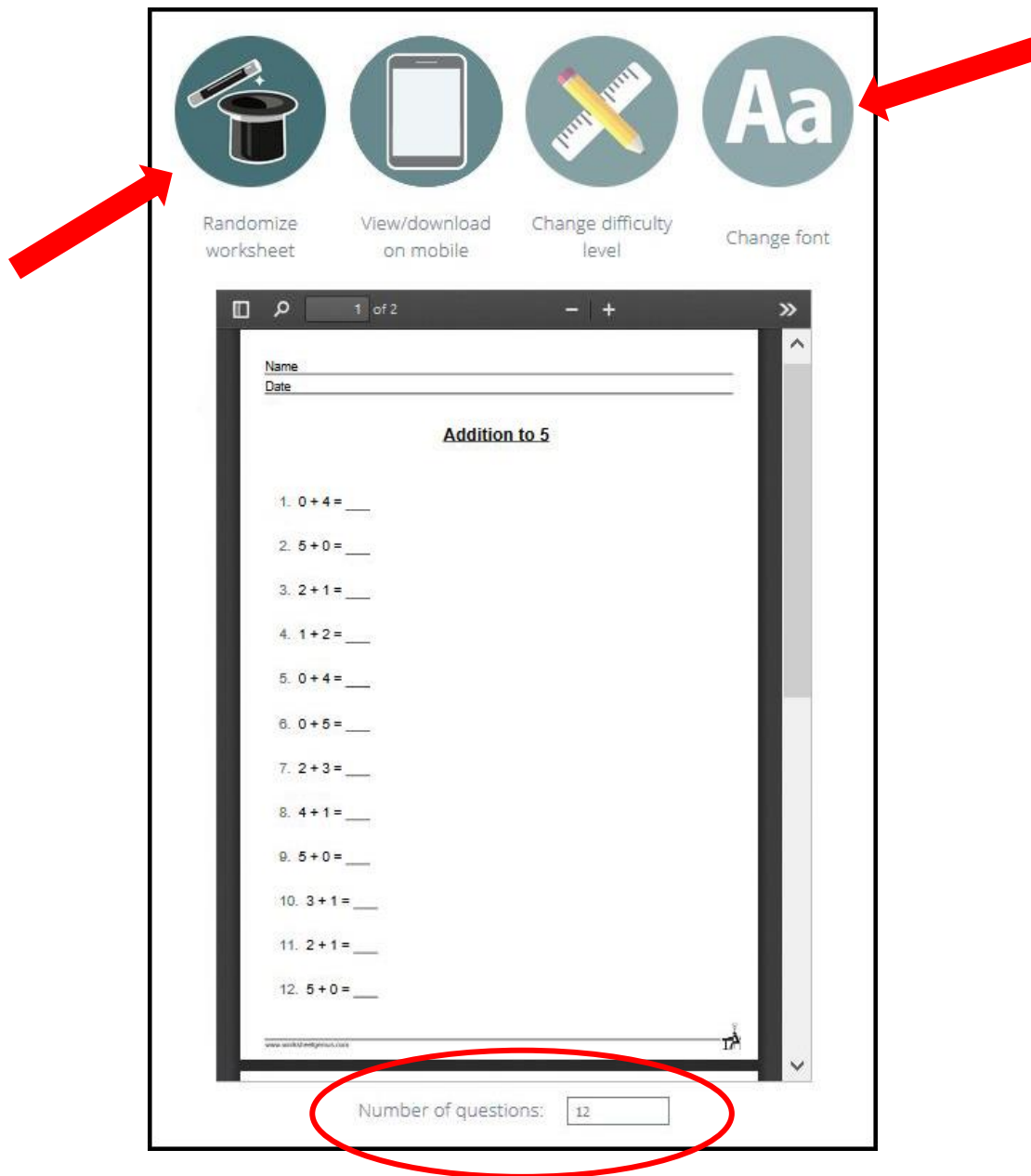

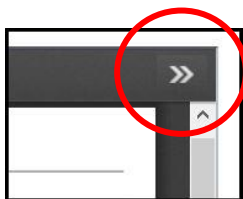
Most of the math worksheet creators look very similar. The green sections give you the option to just quickly create a pre-set worksheet.



You can click on any of the preset worksheets and you will be taken to the worksheet creation page where you have more options to play around with OR you can just download the worksheet as is.



As before, when you are done organizing your worksheet all you have to do is download it by clicking the arrow icon:-



Let’s click back to the homepage and take a look at the final section called “Word Lists”.



The Word Lists section provides you with a huge collection of word options. This list will save you so much time and effort hunting for specific lists to suit the needs of your worksheets.

The list collections include nouns, CVC-(consonant-vowel-consonant), spelling/phonetic patterns, prefixes and suffixes, verbs and much more.

At the top of the lists you can change the spelling type to British or United States. To change the spelling type just click on the dropdown arrow on the right.

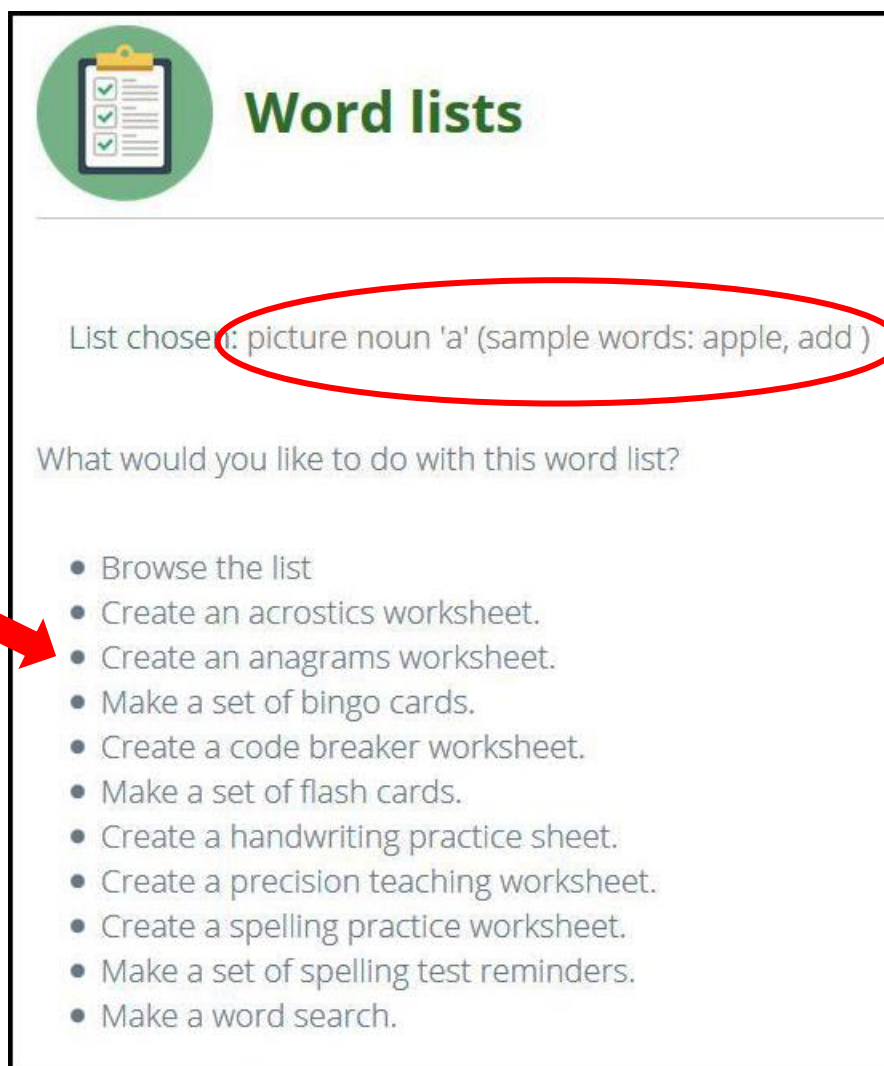

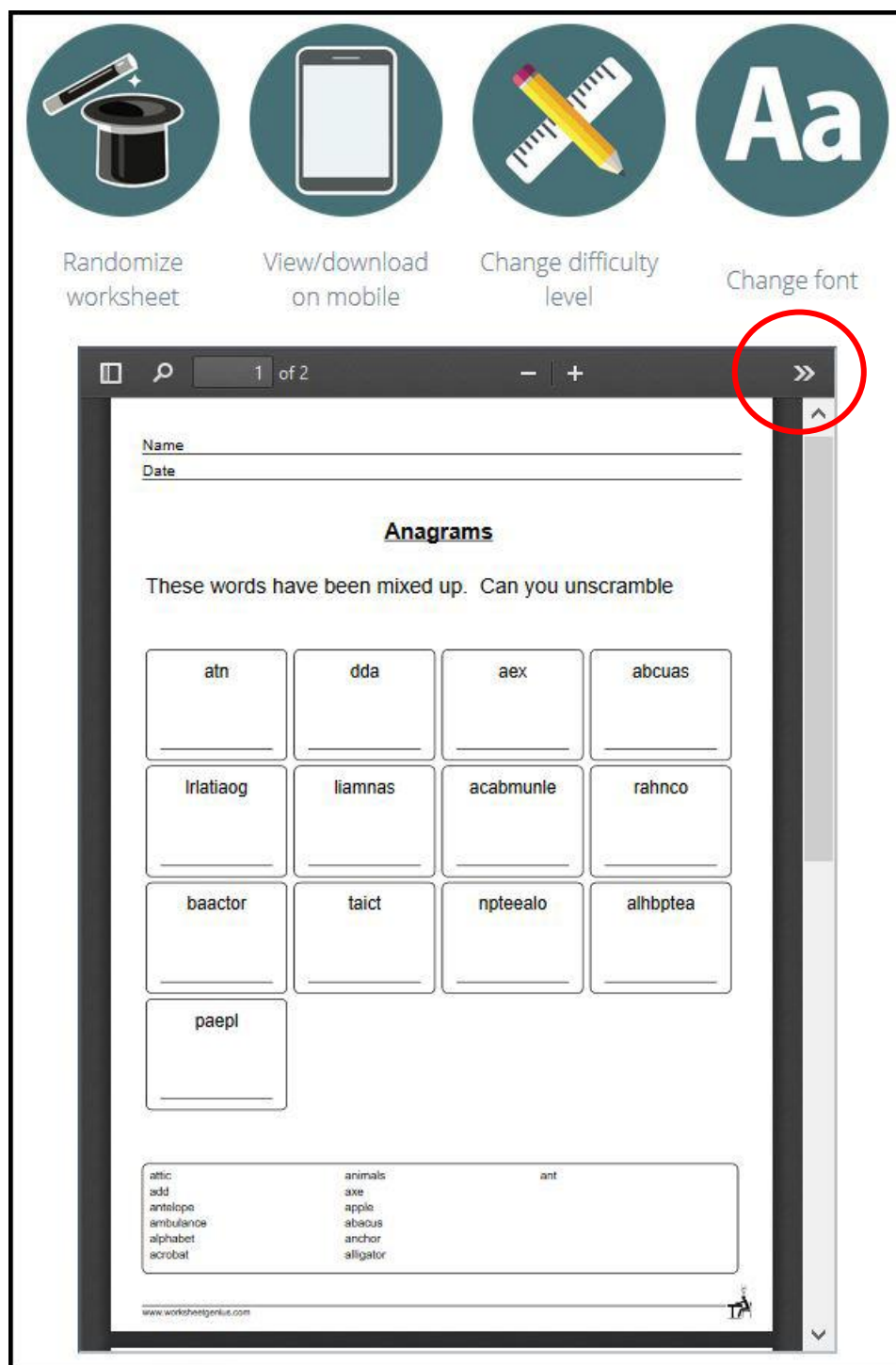

Now you can move onto STEP 2 where we will be looking at each of the individual worksheet categories from the English Literacy Worksheets and the mathematics Worksheets.

2

STEP TWO

BASIC GRADE GUIDELINES FOR ENGLISH LITERACY AND MATH

These are based off of the US grading guidelines but most countries will have something very similar. This is just to help you create age targeted workbooks which is usually how children’s educational books are set out.

- **PRE-K – (Pre-Kindergarten)**

A child’s age for Pre-K would be up to the age of 4 years old. During these times, some children draw or paint, some play house, some play with puzzles while some listen to an adult read a story aloud.

What Do Kids Learn In Preschool?

Numbers, Counting & Pre-Math Skills:- A preschooler will start to learn the foundations of math. That generally includes numbers from one to ten, counting up to ten or even twenty, and even that numbers and objects correspond.

Basic Shapes:- Part of those pre-math skills will also include learning the basic shapes. Basic shapes are the foundations of later learning in geometry!

Colors:- Learning to name and identify colors will help a preschooler with their language development and creativity.

The Alphabet:- Learning the alphabet goes beyond just singing the ABC song. In preschool, kids start to learn that letters correspond

with sounds and go together to make words. These are all essential pre-reading skills.

- **KINDERGARTEN**

In the US, kindergarten is usually part of the K-12 educational system and children begin kindergarten at age 5.

What Do Kids Learn In Kindergarten?

Numbers & Counting:- Learning numbers and counting is a big thing in Kindergarten. Some kids go from learning just to count from 1-10 to learning to count to 100 and beyond. Kindergartners will also learn how to count by 5s and 10s.

Geometric Shapes:- Kids are now learning their basic shapes in preschool, but Kindergartners will still explore shapes. They’ll start to learn about more complex geometric shapes and how they relate to math concepts.

Math Foundation:- Kindergartner math goes beyond basic shapes and counting. Children are expected to get a good foundation in math skills. New standards even have kids doing basic addition and subtraction in Kindergarten.

Letters & Beginning Reading & Writing:- The alphabet is the basis for a lot of learning in Kindergarten. Most children know their ABCs when they enter Kindergarten, but end up learning how to use the alphabet for early reading skills by the time they leave. Kindergartners will learn their ABCs, letter sounds, and about upper-case and lower-case letters. They’ll even learn how to put sounds together to create words and will begin their journey to reading.

- **FIRST (1st) GRADE**

A child usually enters 1st Grade at around ages 6 to 7 years old. In math, students may learn about addition and subtraction of natural numbers, usually with only one digit, and about measurement. Basic geometry and graphing may be introduced as well as clock and calendar reading.

First graders are taught the fundamentals of literacy, including reading sentences, writing very simple statements and mastery of the alphabet.

What Do Kids Learn In 1st Grade?

Enhanced Reading Skills:- A first grader learned how to read in kindergarten, so in first grade they’ll learn how to read even better. First graders will use phonics and word analysis skills to move up on the reading scale. Reading is one of the most important things first graders will work on, because it’s the basis of learning independence at all future grade levels.

Reading Comprehension:- To improve on their reading skills a first grader will also build more reading comprehension skills. When they are reading, they begin to understand what they are reading and able to communicate it back. By the end of first grade, students should be able to recognize and communicate a book’s characters, setting, and plot.

Research & Writing:-

First grade is where writing skills are really developed. A child will go beyond writing their name and simple sentences to writing about a topic with a sense of opening and closing. Through this writing

practice, they’ll also learn proper sentence structure and punctuation.

Math Speed & Accuracy:- First Grade math will continue with addition and add on subtraction with the emphasis on building speed and accuracy. Most of that practice will be within the sum of 20, but a first grader may even dabble in addition up to 100. Aside from addition and subtraction, first graders also begin to explore units of measurement and simple fractions using shapes.

• **SECOND (2nd) GRADE**

A child usually enters 2nd Grade at around ages 7 to 8 years old. In second grade most children practice the skills learned in earlier grades and begin to use them with ease. Second graders apply what they learned about the meanings of letters and numbers to more complicated material, and begin to develop their analytical abilities even further.

What Do Kids Learn In 2nd Grade?

Language & Literacy:- By second grade, most children can read and write at a basic level. They tackle more complex texts as they work to become rapid and accurate readers. The more fluent children become at one level, the more likely they are to become fluent at the next. Children need to be able to read words at each level effortlessly before they’ll really comprehend what they read.

At this stage children also become better story writers as they learn to write basic sentences and short narratives about an event or a character.

Improved Math Skills:- Mathematics concepts become more complex in second grade. Children can order, group numbers, and work with numbers far greater than those they can physically count. They’ll learn to add and subtract two-digit numbers, and to understand the meaning of multiplication and division. The first half of the “times table” can be introduced up to the number five.

- **THIRD (3rd) GRADE**

A child usually enters 3rd Grade at around age 8 years old. In third grade, children start putting the learning pieces together to take on more complicated assignments. As they continue to apply the basic skills they learned in first and second grade, they begin to do some work independently rather than with the explicit directions given in earlier grade levels.

What Do Kids Learn In 3rd Grade?

Language & Literacy:- Third graders learn what it takes to be a good reader. They have a better handle on what to do when they don’t understand a word or passage, like looking at pictures in a book for clues.

Third graders also learn organizational methods that help them prepare for more complex writing assignments. They’ll create maps to plan their work and write reports, creative fiction and personal narratives.

Improved Math Skills:- Math becomes much more challenging in third grade. Children work with larger whole numbers such as numbers in the thousands and also with fractions and decimal

numbers. They’ll look at odd and even numbers, and patterns that involve those numbers. They’ll solve and explain addition, subtraction, multiplication, and division problems.

- **FROM GRADE 4 ONWARDS**

From ages 9 onwards you can expect the language and literacy worksheets to get a little more complex. You can do this by using slightly harder word lists for your worksheets.

This is also the case with math. There are a number of very interesting worksheet categories that would be suited to children over the age of 9. You can include options such as coordinates, percentages, fractions and slightly more difficult division and multiplication sums.

CREATING ENGLISH LITERACY WORKSHEETS

All the categories in this section can either be made into individual workbooks that focus on just one category OR you can create a workbook that has a mixture of all these categories.

There are so many ways to create different types of workbooks here. You can even select a few related categories and put them together in a workbook. You can also create books based on the age of the child.

The possibilities for creating workbooks are endless and the great thing is that they are all evergreen...so the topic will never be out of date!

What I have done in this STEP is go through each of the categories and provide you with enough details to help you create a quality worksheet.

Before you get started creating worksheets I thought it would be a good idea to provide basic grading style guidelines so you know what age group each of your workbooks will be targeting.

Knowing this will help you to create better workbooks for parents, guardians and teachers who are looking for specific grade educational material.

ACROSTICS

This is different to the traditional “Acrostics” and has been simplified for children. If you take a look at the example image you can see that the worksheet was created from using simple words beginning with “m”. As explained in the last STEP, these words were taken from the “Word List” options page.

You can see that beside each letter there is a space for the child to write another word beginning with that particular letter. The purpose of this exercise is to see how many new words the child can create from the vertical word list.

You can make these worksheets as easy or difficult as you want simply by choosing words that fit a particular learning age group. So longer vertical words would be considered more difficult and suited to older children.

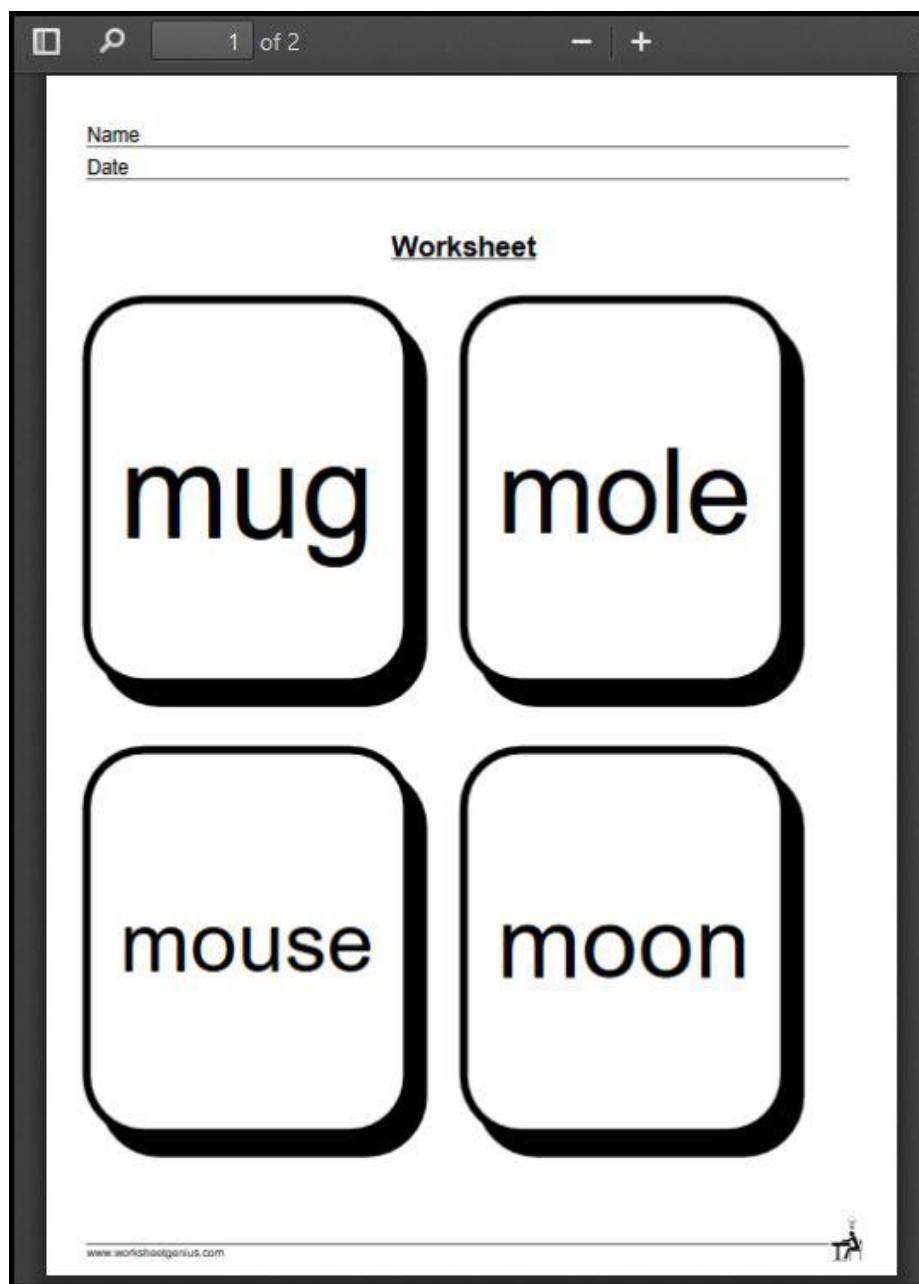





CREATING MATHEMATICS WORKSHEETS

One of the great things about the Worksheet Genius website is that you can create English literacy worksheets AND mathematics worksheets. This means you can target all areas of the early learning market by creating not only books for reading and writing but also books for mathematics. How amazing is that?

You can either keep these genres separate OR you can mix them together by creating 2 in 1 type workbooks that have a mixture of English learning AND math learning. The many types of books you can create from these are endless!

So, we have already gone through most of the worksheet options in the English Literacy section...now let’s see what math worksheets you can create with ease.

I am not going to go through each individual option as I did with the English Literacy Worksheets. The reason for this is because the methods are pretty much the same and most just require a tiny bit of common sense to figure out how to set up the options.

As well as this, you can see for yourself that there are at least twice as many categories in the mathematics section and explaining each of these would just fill up this course with unnecessary pages.

So what I am going to do is just pick out a few areas that may need explaining or repeating just to make sure you have all the information you need to get started.

There are 26 different mathematics categories here and because we are dealing with math many of these tend to target older children. With categories such as percentages, fractions, coordinates, etc, it

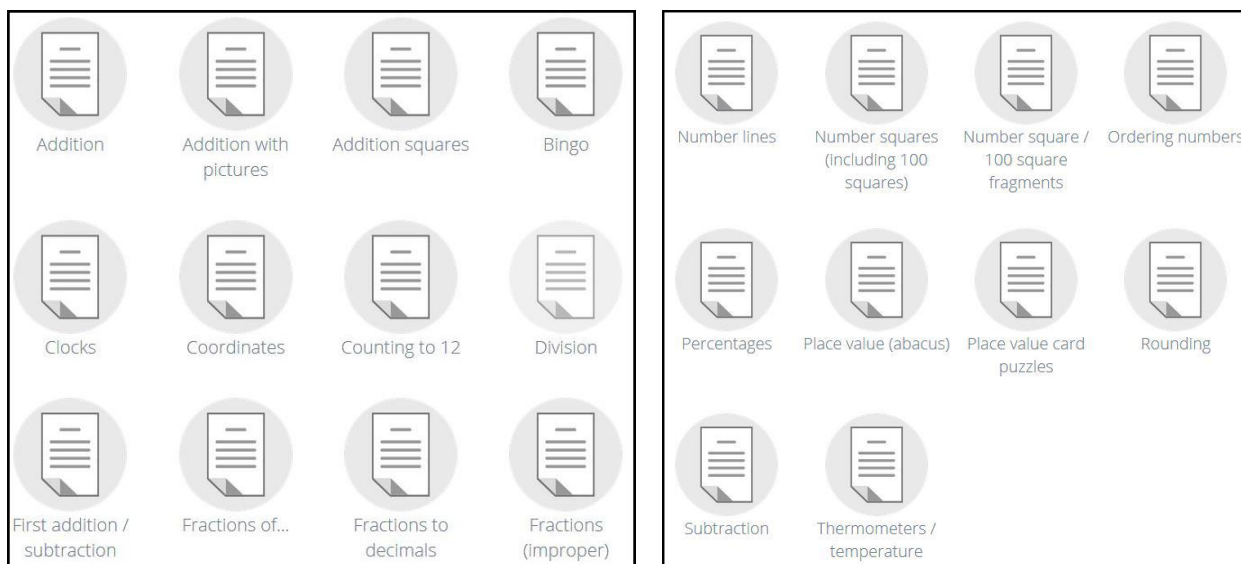
would be hard to create worksheets easy enough for 1st Graders and below to understand but that does not mean you cannot do it. With some experimentation with the available options you can create worksheets for younger children who may be more inclined to understand the equations.

After all, we are not all made the same...so just because a child is 6 years old it does not mean he/she cannot understand coordinates. In any case, I will leave that up to you to decide on your target audience age or intelligence level.

So...from the Worksheet Genius homepage you can click on the Mathematics Worksheets icon...



...and you will be taken to the math categories page:-

You also have the option to “Design Your Own” worksheet where you will be presented with a few additional options to tailor your worksheet to your needs.

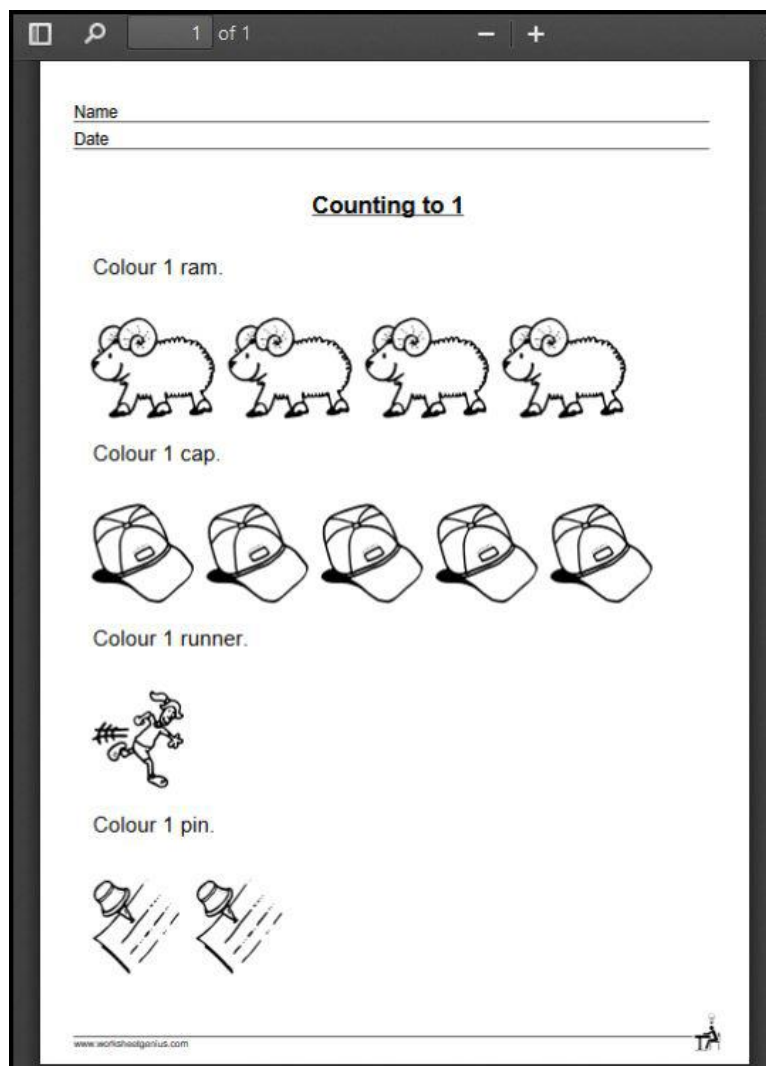
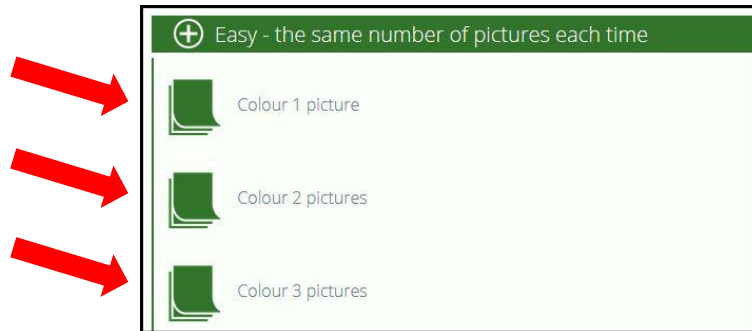


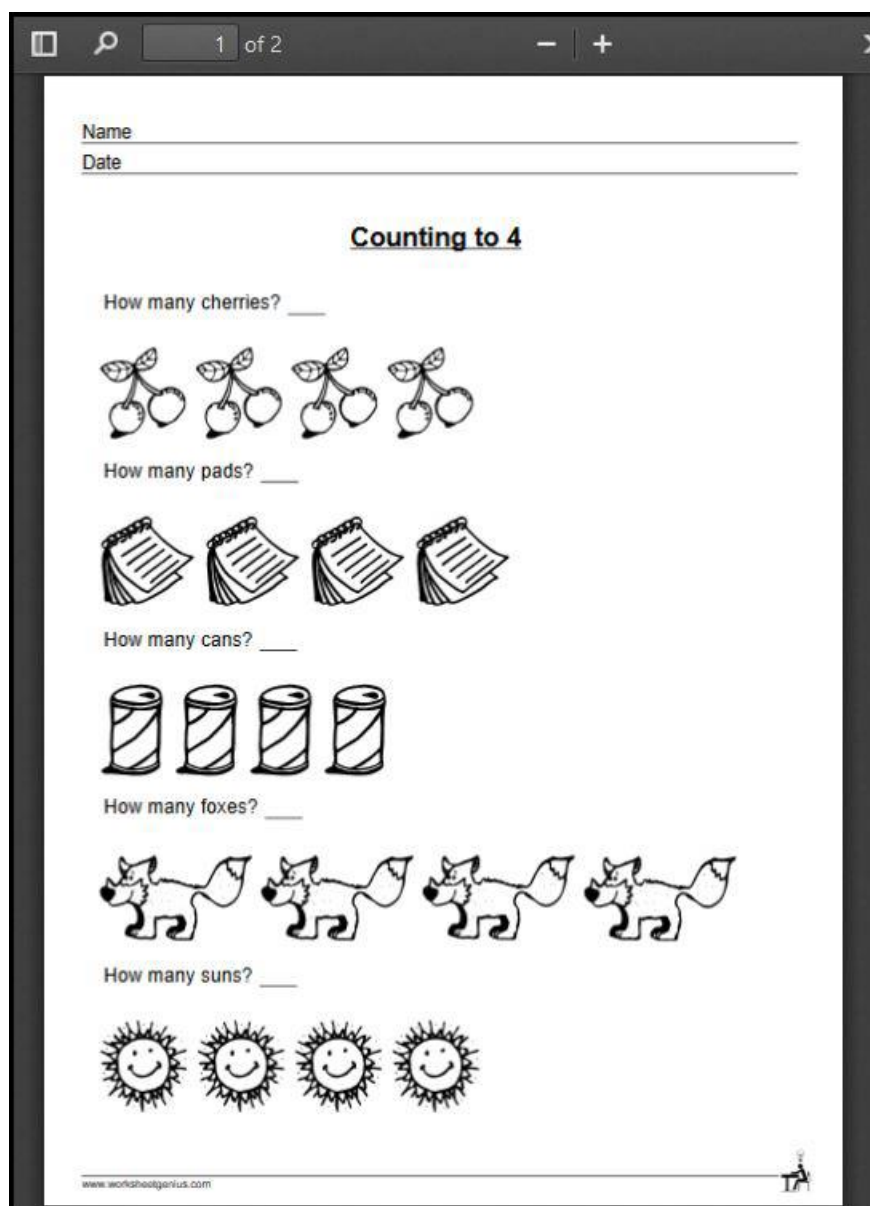
The possibilities for creating math workbooks are endless. You can literally create a single book for each of these categories OR a series of books for each category. If you prefer, you can take a worksheet from each category and create a book of mixed math worksheets.

Some of these categories are better suited to older children but some can also be adapted to target 1st Graders and younger. For example, if you click on the “Counting To 12” category you can see that there are difficulty options available:-



If you click on the “Easy” option and click on one of the dropdown links you can see right away that this type of worksheet would be perfect for 1st Graders and younger.



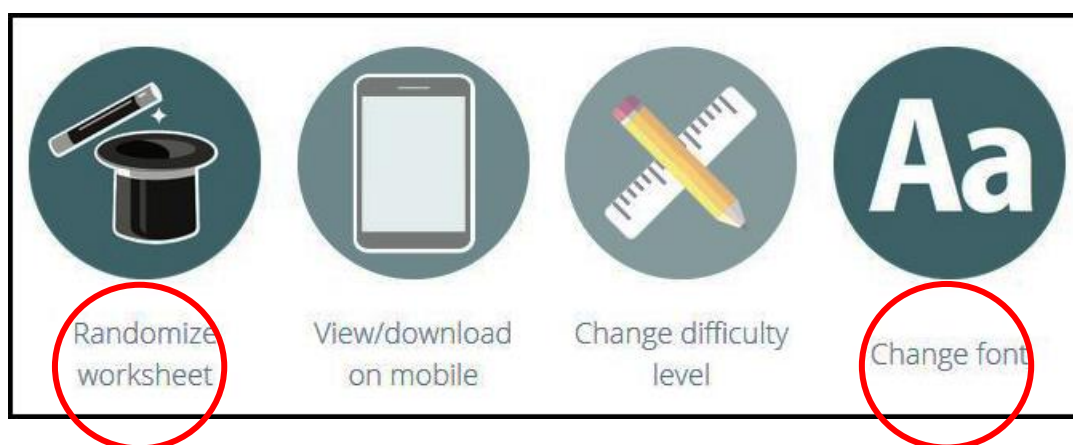


So before you get to work creating these math worksheets go through each category and jot down the ones that would be better suited to your target audience. There are so many to choose from and combined with the English Lit categories there is enough material here to help you create A LOT of early learning children’s workbooks.

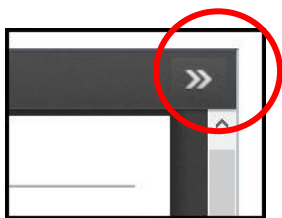
WHAT CAN YOU DO WITH THESE WORKSHEETS?

So there you have 15 different English Literacy category worksheets and 26 different Math worksheet categories that you can create. For each of those categories you have a number of options to individualize each worksheet however you choose.

Remember, once you get to the creator page you have additional options such a “Change Font” and “Randomize Worksheet” to make worksheets even more unique.



Just to remind you – (as explained in STEP 1) – to download the worksheet you just click on the arrow icon in the top right of the worksheet creator.



Go to STEP 1 on page 14 for a more detailed explanation for downloading the PDF worksheets.

With these worksheets you will create children’s workbooks. For the purpose of this course I will be focusing on early learning

workbooks because these tend to be the most popular and in my opinion are the easiest to put together and sell.

However, due to the huge amount of options available to you when creating these worksheets you can easily put together books for older kids.

In the next STEP I will be showing you exactly how to put these worksheets together in order to create a children’s workbook, so be patient because we will be getting to all that stuff soon enough.

So, if you read through STEP 1 and began creating worksheets then in STEP 2 you should be gradually filling up folders on your computer with unfinished PDF worksheets.

I say “unfinished” because you still need to do a few things to the worksheets to perfect them and prepare them for inserting into your book templates.

NOTE: *You will find two book template sizes in the **EXTRAS** folder provided with this course. These template sizes are 10x8 and 11x8.5 and are the most popular in this niche, however there is no reason why you cannot experiment with other sizes such as 6x9 or 8.5x8.5.*

So let’s move on to STEP 3 where I will show you how to edit your worksheets in order to look just right for your finished workbook creations.

3

STEP THREE

PREPARING THE WORKSHEETS FOR ADDING TO YOUR BOOK TEMPLATES

If you followed all the steps so far you should have a bunch of generated PDF worksheets sitting in a folder or folders on your computer. As PDF’s, these worksheets are in a raw state and need to be edited and converted into individual images so that you can insert them into your book template.

You want to edit them to get rid of any unwanted text, images or links that are on the page. How much you edit is entirely up to you but in any case it is a very simple process and does tend to keep your finished books looking clean and professional...which is what you want in order to make sales.

There are a number of ways you can edit and convert your PDF worksheets to images and a couple of options include using premium software such as Photoshop CS or Adobe Acrobat Pro.

I am going to assume that you do not own either of these software – (they are quite expensive) – and so will show you a way you can edit and convert your PDF’s using free online programs.

MERGING PDF’s

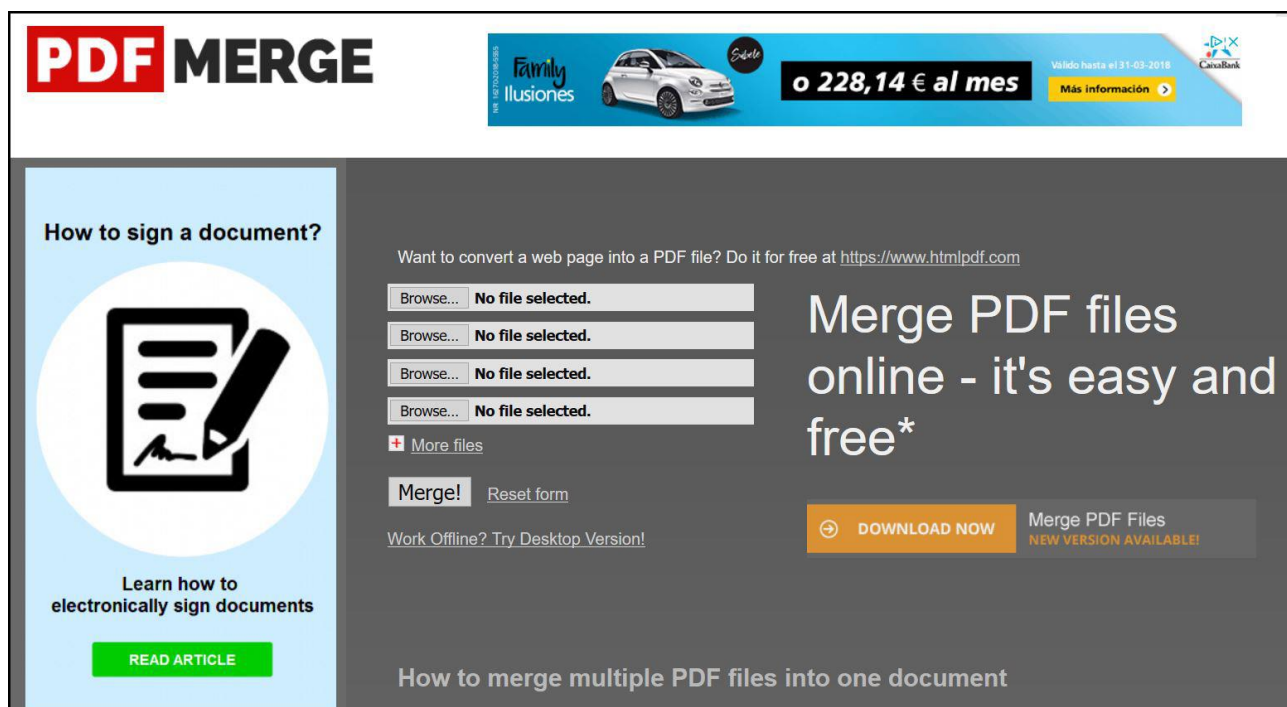
Before the actual conversion process I want to save you even more time by showing you how to first merge all your PDF’s into one. By doing this you will literally be able to bulk convert with ease.

I like to use **PDF Merge** - <https://www.pdfmerge.com> but if you prefer to use an alternative free program then here are a few more:-



Just ignore all the annoying ads because all you need to do now is place the PDF files you want to merge into the program. To do this you click on the “Browse” button and select each of your PDF’s to be merged.



When you have your PDF’s loaded just click the “Merge” button and the program will do the rest. Depending on how many PDF’s you are merging this shouldn’t take too long but I think it would be a good idea not to merge a huge amount of PDF’s at once because it would most likely slow the processing time down quite a bit.

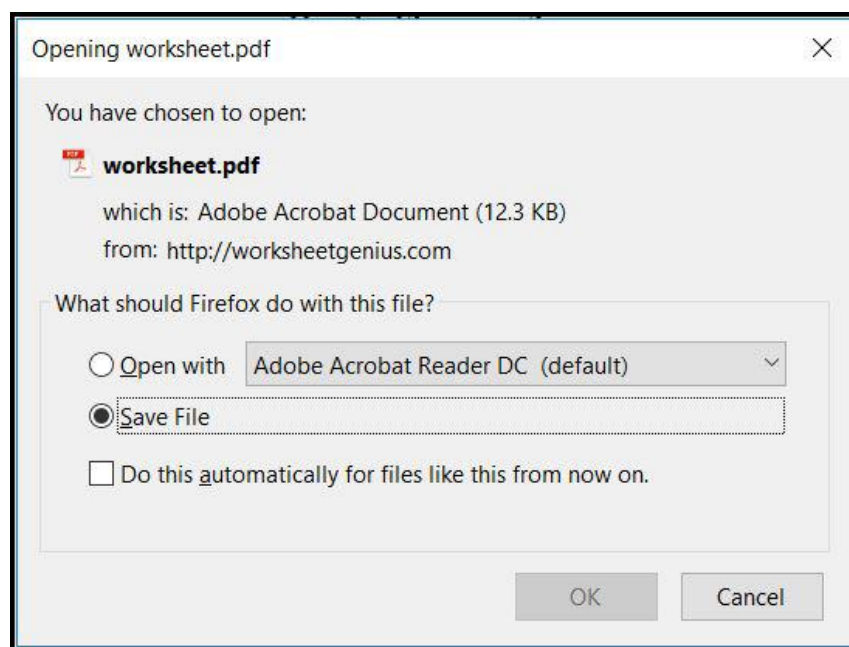

When the process has completed a download box will pop up. Click OK to download the merged worksheet PDF direct to your computer.



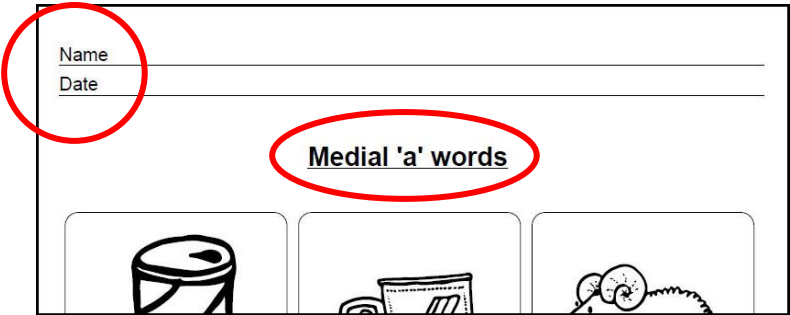
Make sure to remember where the PDF is saved.

EDIT/CROP PDF's

So now you have a PDF with a bunch of merged worksheets inside. What you need to do now is edit the worksheets within that PDF. This is very easy to do and once again you can use a pretty awesome piece of free online software to do this for you.

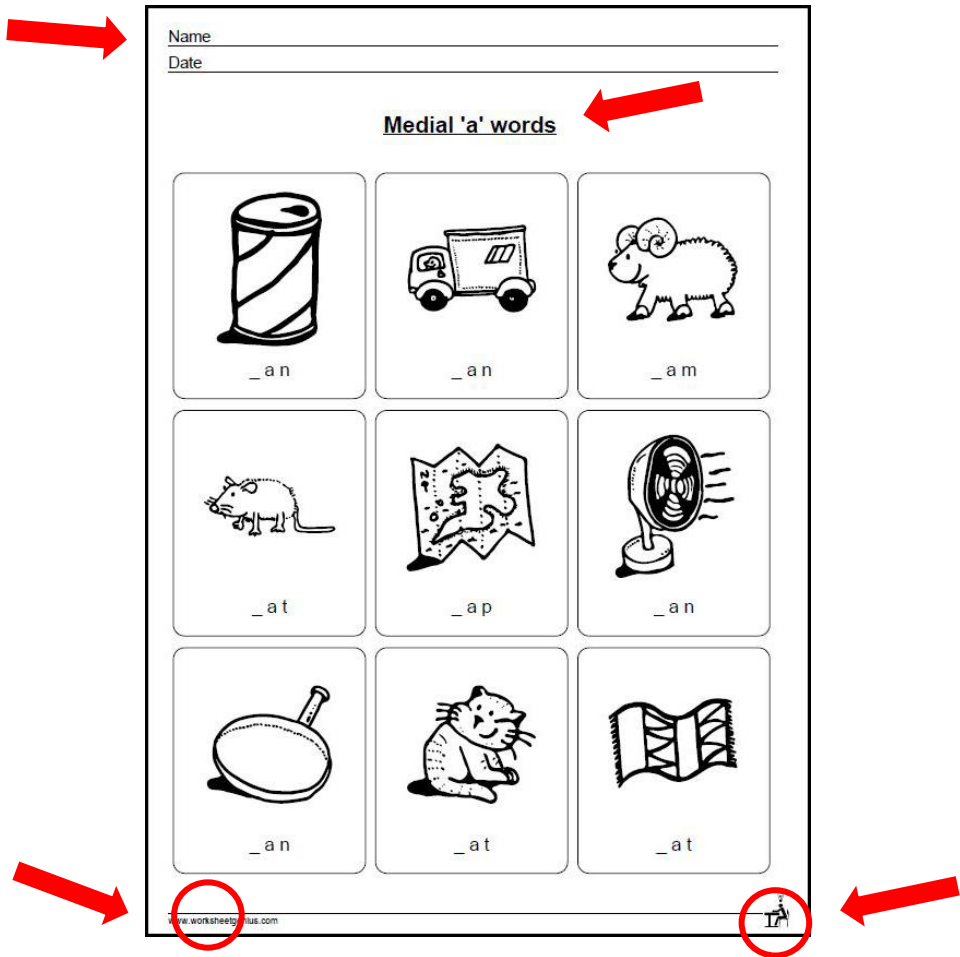
The reason why you need to edit the worksheets is because most have text that you will not want to be visible in your finished book. You can leave them if you want to but I would not advise it.

Here is an example of the kind of text that would be best removed:-

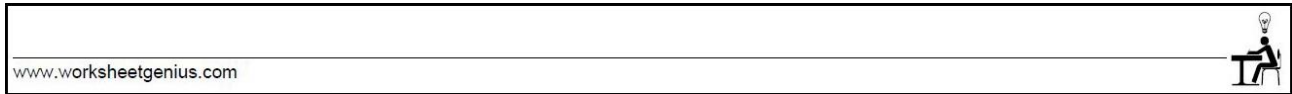


I don’t think it would be a good idea to leave the “Name” and “Date” text on each page and the title for each worksheet can also be removed.

Here is an example of a full PDF worksheet page including the unwanted text:-



NOTE: *If you look at the bottom of each worksheet you will see a link to the free Worksheet Genius website as well as a tiny image icon on the bottom right of the page.*



This text is showing because the software is free to use and so the creator has the right to leave his links on every page if he wishes. Of course, I appreciate the software creator for allowing us to use his program for free but that link and image icon will just not look right in a book.

So I have communicated with the creator of Worksheet Genius and we discussed what we can do so both parties are happy.

OPTIONS FOR EDITING WORKSHEETS

- 1.** You can leave the website link and image icon untouched on all your worksheets. You can remove anything else but you need to leave the credit at the end of each worksheet.
- 2.** You can remove the website and image icon credit from all your worksheets BUT in return you need to have half a page within your book that credits Worksheet Genius.

I personally went for option number two as I am happy to dedicate half a page to the Worksheet Genius website. The creator is allowing us to use his software to create our own books at no cost. He is a very generous person.

What I do is add a dedicated page somewhere at the back of the book. I include an image of the Worksheet Genius homepage and add the required requested information:-

I add a paragraph or two mentioning:

- That the Worksheet Genius site was used to help generate some of the worksheets in my books.
- That Worksheet Genius is like a machine for generating free worksheets that can be randomized.
- The user can also control the exact level of difficulty on every worksheet to meet their needs or the needs of their students.

If you are fine with adding this to a page in your book then the creator is perfectly ok with you deleting the credits at the end of each page.

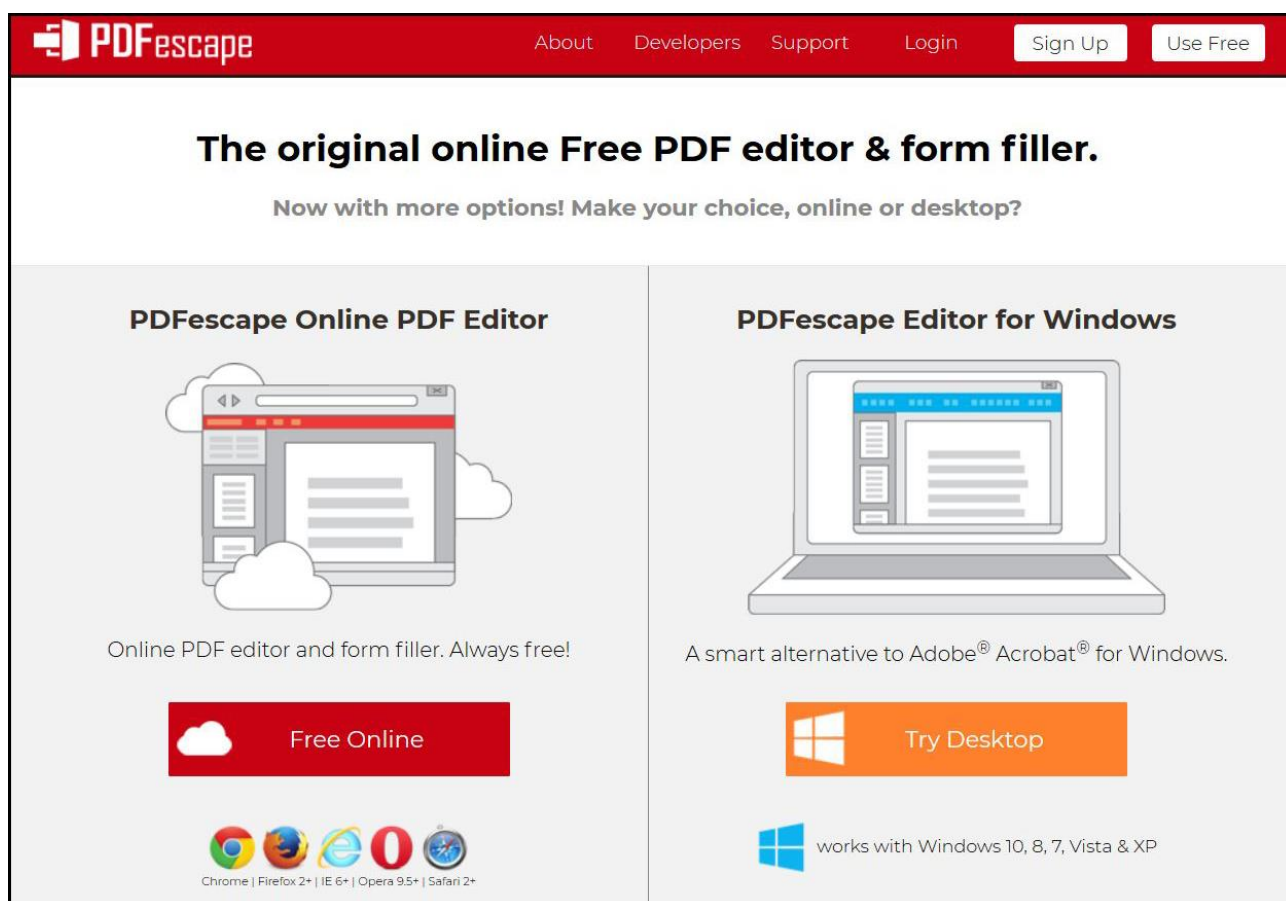
How you write the above information is up to you but try to present some positive feedback regarding the Worksheet Genius site because it is not costing you anything to use.

The creator could have easily charged a fee for his software but he doesn’t and so I think it is only fair that we try to get the word out about his site via the sales of our books. A half page credit to his site in all our books will make a world of difference.



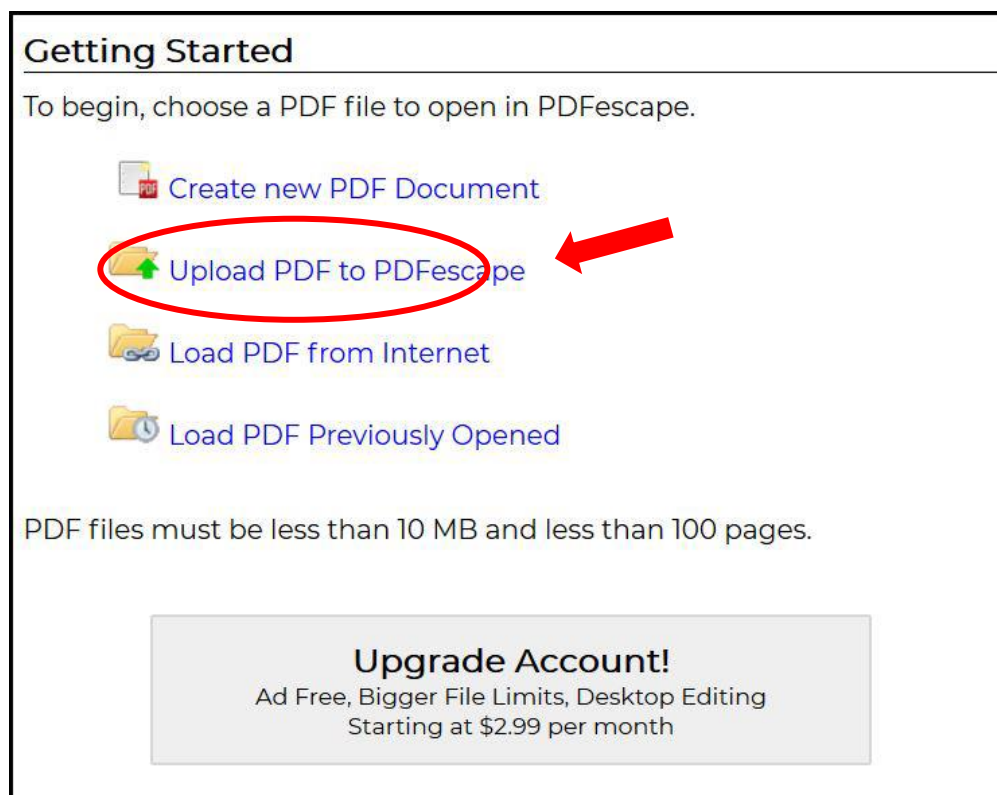
Ok...so let’s get back to your merged PDF download. You have a bunch of merged worksheets on a PDF but all of them have unwanted text on them...what can you do to remove them?

Simple...you can use a free online PDF editor called **PDF Escape** - <https://www.pdfescape.com>.

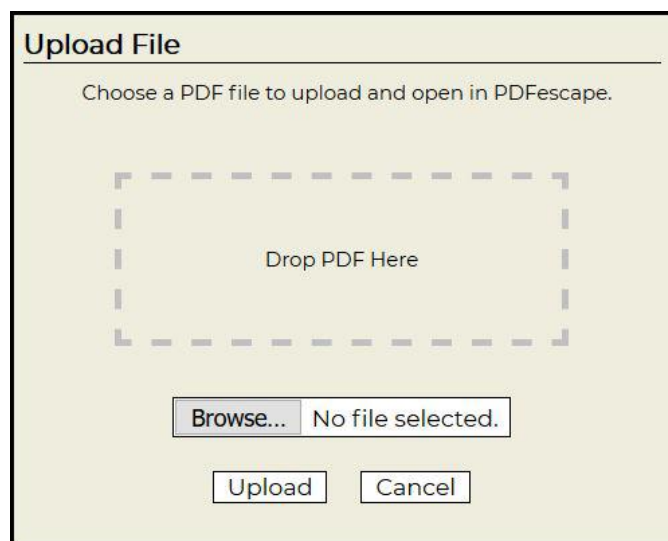


Click on the PDF Escape link above and the homepage will pop up. You want to use this software for free so click the red “Free Online” button.

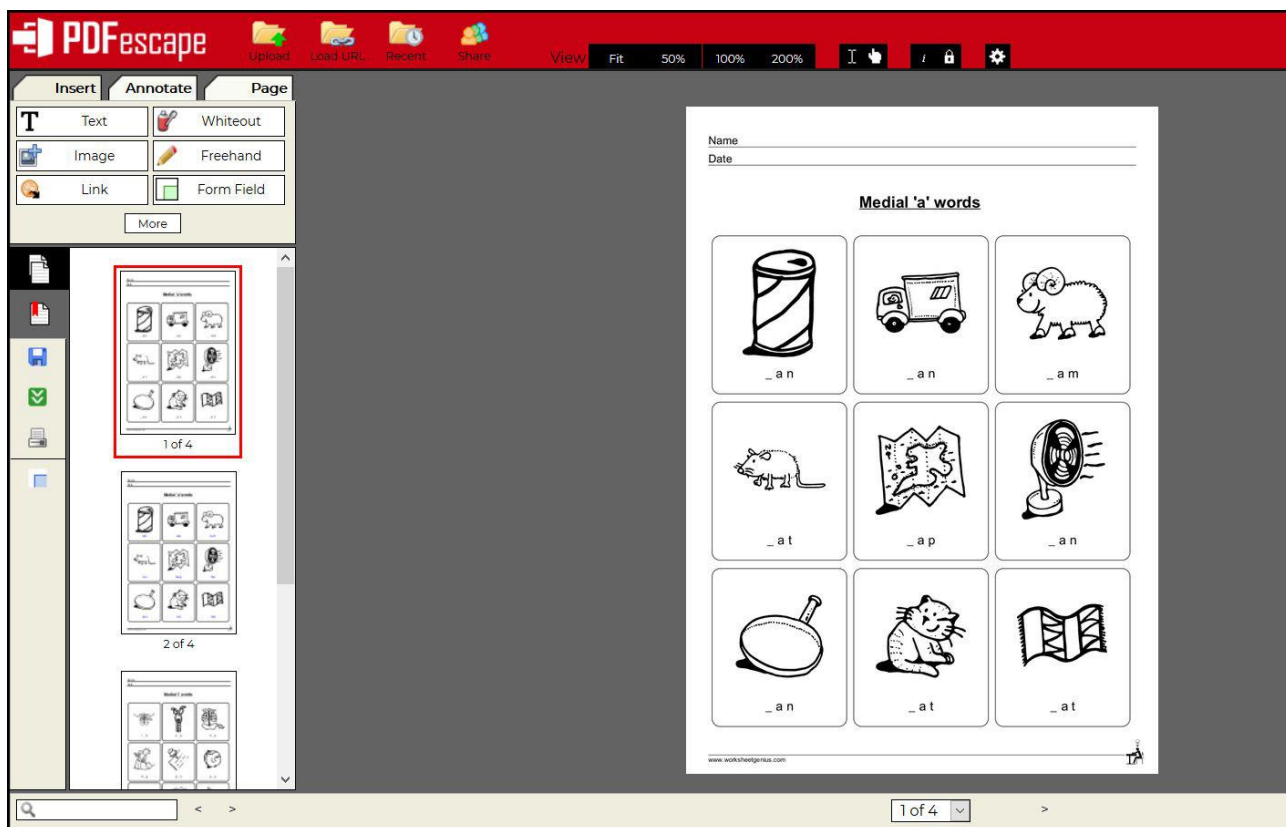
After that the screen will change and you will see a box pop up with a few options to choose from. You just need to click the “Upload PDF To PDF Escape” option.



After clicking that, another box will appear and this is where you upload your merged PDF file. You have two options, you can drop your file directly into the box from your computer or you can use the “browse” option to select your file.



After adding your merged PDF file there will be a short processing time and then your file will appear on the PDF Escape dashboard.



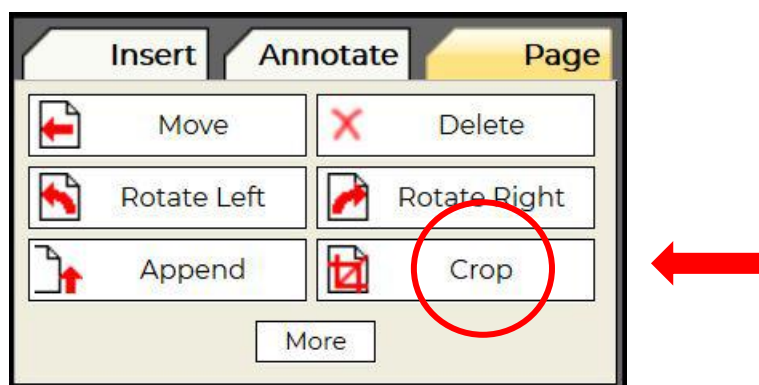
Now...don't be intimidated by all the button options because this is a super easy program to use. Besides, you are only going to use a couple of the options in the dashboard.

There are A LOT of cool things you can do with this program but all you need to focus on is getting rid of the unwanted text on your worksheets.

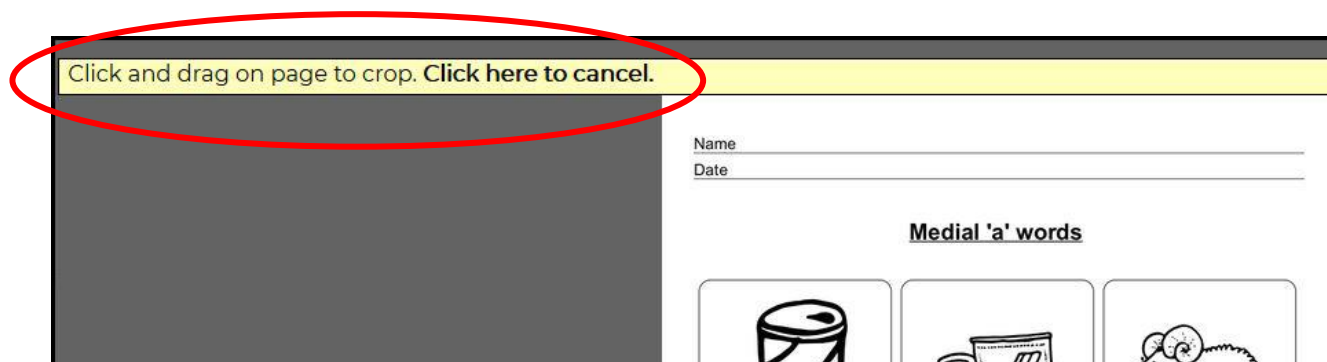
You are going to be using the "Crop" option. In the top left of the PDF Escape sidebar you will see a bunch of button options. Just above those you will see three tabs with titles – Insert, Annotate and Page. Click on the "Page" button.



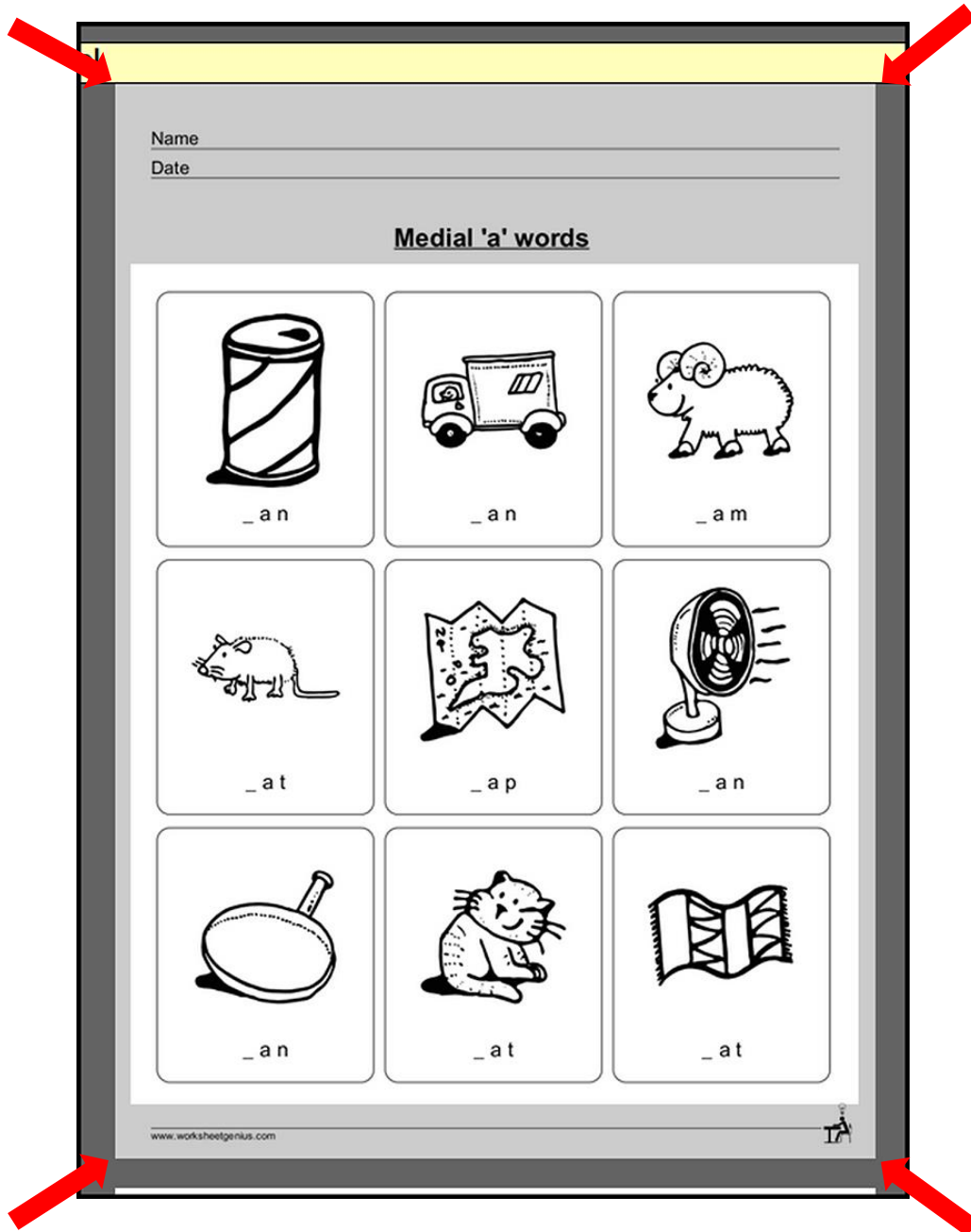
This will reveal new options. Now click on the “Crop” button.



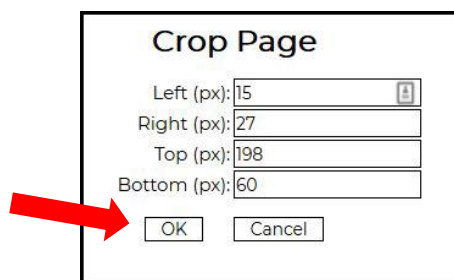
As soon as you click the “Crop” button the dashboard screen changes and you will see a yellow text band just above your on screen PDF. You can now crop the PDF:-



To crop your PDF worksheets you will have to go through them all one at a time...so be patient. Begin by moving your cursor to the top corner of where you want to start to crop your worksheet. Hold down the left mouse button as you drag a rectangle across your worksheet. This signifies the crop, so everything outside that rectangle will be cropped out.



When you are happy with the crop just release the left mouse button and immediately a pop up box will appear. This box is giving you the option to change the size of your crop. You can just leave it as default and click OK.



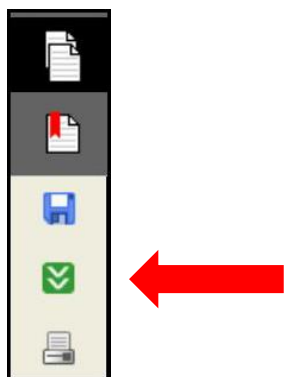
After clicking OK your worksheet will be cropped exactly where you marked it and you will now be left with a clean, text free PDF worksheet.



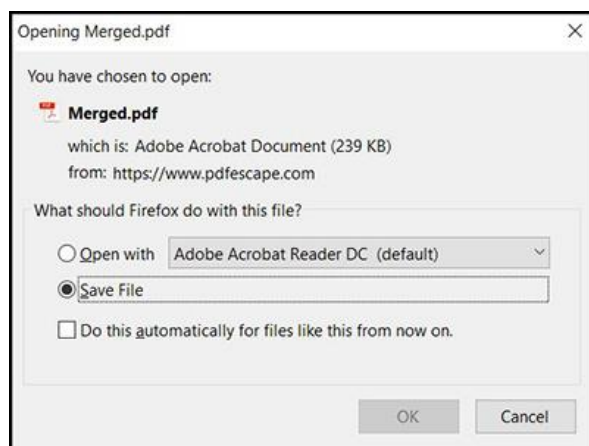
Now follow the exact same process for all the other merged worksheets on your PDF. Try to keep the crop similar for all the worksheets but don’t worry if the crops are not exactly the same because you will be resizing all the worksheets.

You will be bulk resizing multiple worksheets at once so you won’t need to go through them one at a time again.

When you have finished cropping each of your worksheets you just need to save and download the document. In the left sidebar you will see a column of image icons, click the green “Save & Download PDF” icon...



The download box will pop up...just click OK and download the file to your computer.



CONVERT PDF’s TO JPG IMAGES

Hang in there...you are almost done! All you have to do now is convert your edited PDF into individual JPG images. You need to do this so you can easily insert those images into your final book template.

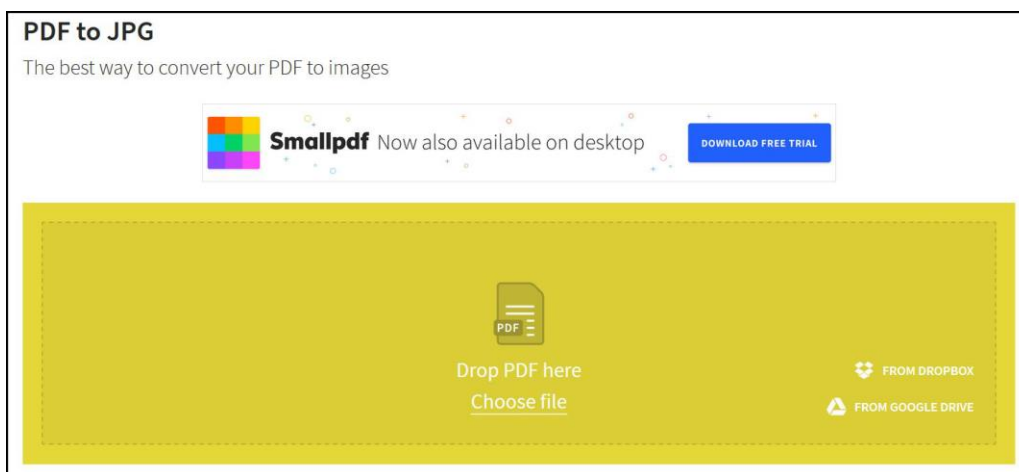
Converting the PDF into images is a simple process and can all be done using a free online conversion tool.

I like to use **Small PDF** - <https://smallpdf.com/pdf-to-jpg> but if you prefer to use an alternative free program then here are a few more:-

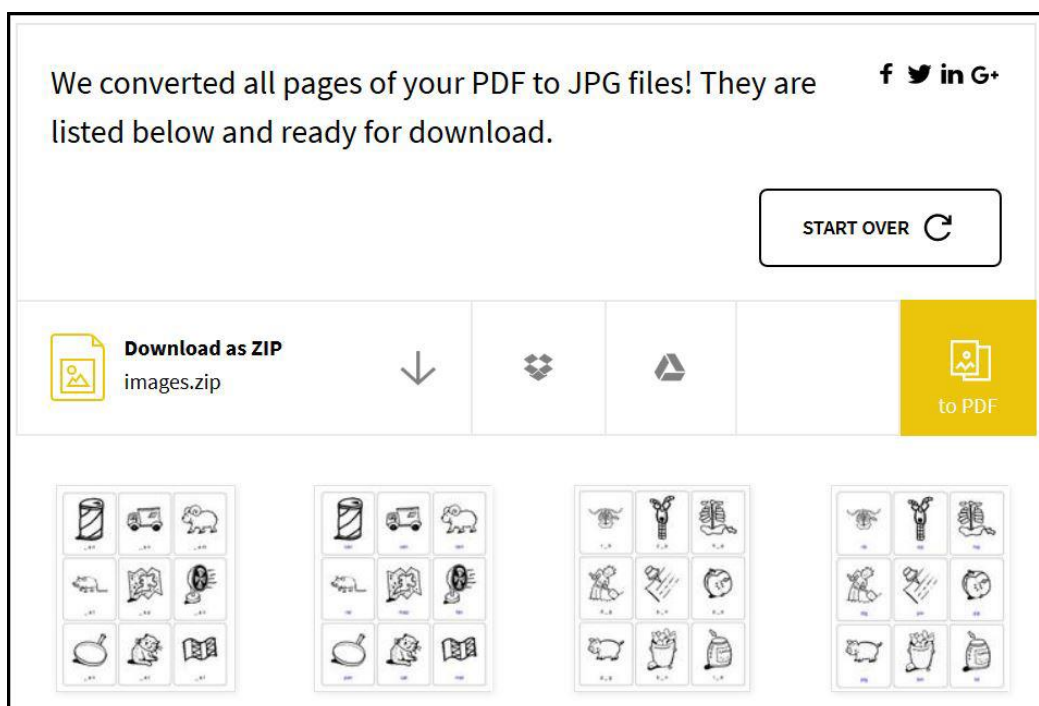
Now simply drop your PDF file into the yellow box or you can click on “Choose File” and upload your PDF that way...



Once it is uploaded you will notice more options popping up on the right of the screen. Click on the “Convert Entire Pages” box and then click the yellow “Choose Option” button that appears below.



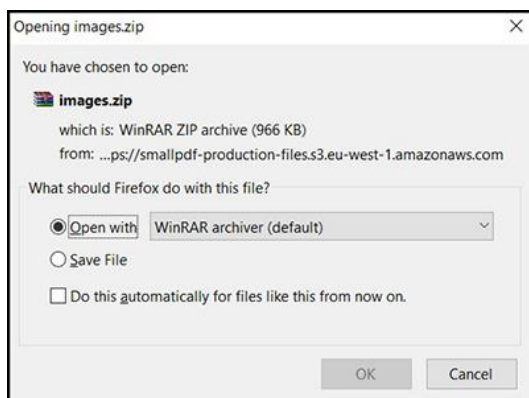
The conversion tool will then begin processing the PDF. If you have a big file it may take a bit of time so be patient. Once the conversion is complete you should see something like this...



All you have to do now is download the zip file of your images. Click the “Download As Zip” button.



As before, a download box will pop up...just click OK to download the images to your computer.



BULK RESIZING THE IMAGES

You will be glad to read that this is the last part of the preparation process. You just need to resize the images to make it easier to insert them into your book template.

Luckily, Small PDF does such a great job of converting PDF files to JPG that the quality of your worksheets will remain top notch.

To resize your images you will use another free online tool called **Bulk Resize Photos** - <https://bulkresizephotos.com>.



















There is no real need to resize ALL your worksheet images unless you just want to lower the size of your completed book file. The only worksheet images you need to resize are the “answers/solutions” worksheets.

Once you have used the Worksheet Genius program and gone through all the category options you will notice that not all categories provide answers or solutions. For some categories these are just not needed.



















However, some categories will have answers/solutions and these will be inserted at the back of your book...just like with puzzle books. Of course, you are not going to add full page solutions because your book will end up being as thick as a Bible!

So by using the Bulk Resize Photos tool you will be able to shrink down the answers/solutions worksheets in order to allow for at least four to be added to a page.

Here is an image example of what I mean by adding the solutions to the back of your book:-

The solutions are the same here because I just copy and pasted to show you the layout.

Before you begin make sure your image files are organized because it won’t be too difficult to mix images up if they are not labeled properly.

A good way to label your worksheets and worksheet solutions is to use numbers and letters. So for the worksheets with solutions you might name them 1, 1a, 2, 2a, 3, 3a, 4, 4a and so on. By doing this you can know straight away that the worksheets with a number AND a letter are the solutions.

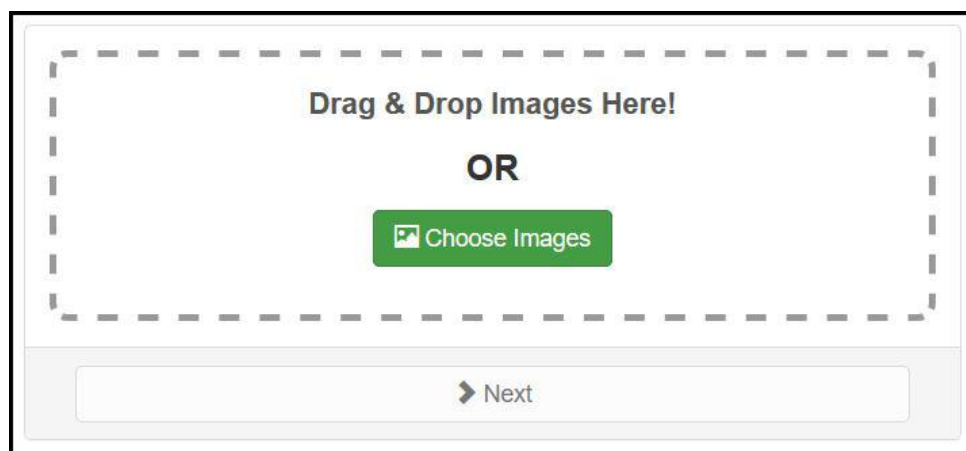
So it would be worksheet 1 and its corresponding solutions worksheet 1a.

Worksheet 2 and its corresponding solutions worksheet 2a.

...and so on.

Ok...it’s time to resize!

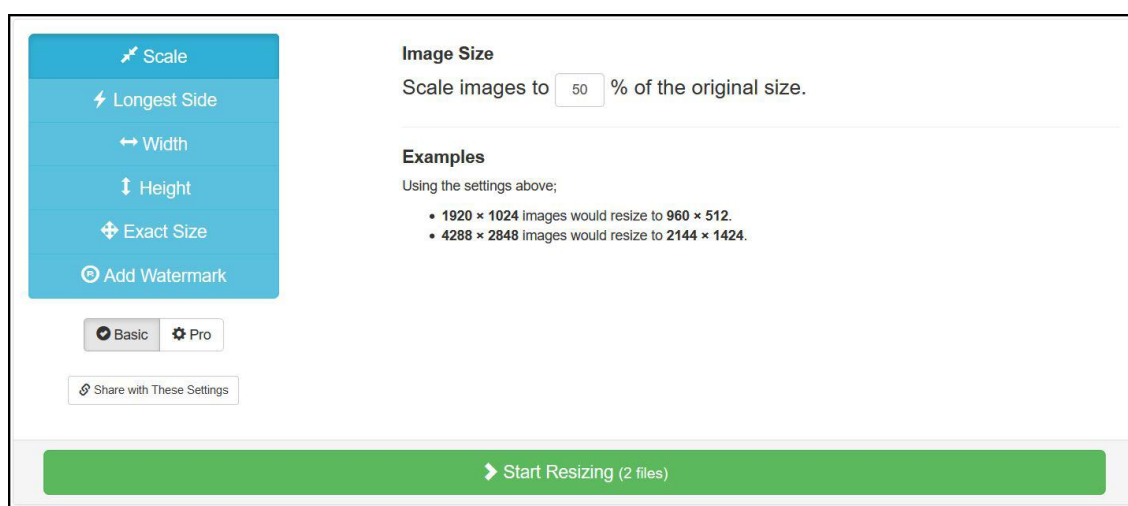
Click on <https://bulkresizephotos.com> and you will see a very plain homepage with an upload box in the center:-



You can either drag or drop your images into the box or you can locate them on your computer by clicking the green “Choose Images” button.

NOTE: *This is a bulk resizer which means you can upload a bunch of images at a time instead of just one. **Make sure to just load up your “solutions” worksheet images only.***

Load up your images and click the “ Next” button below. As soon as you load your images you will see this page:-



On the left side click the “Height” option in the blue box.

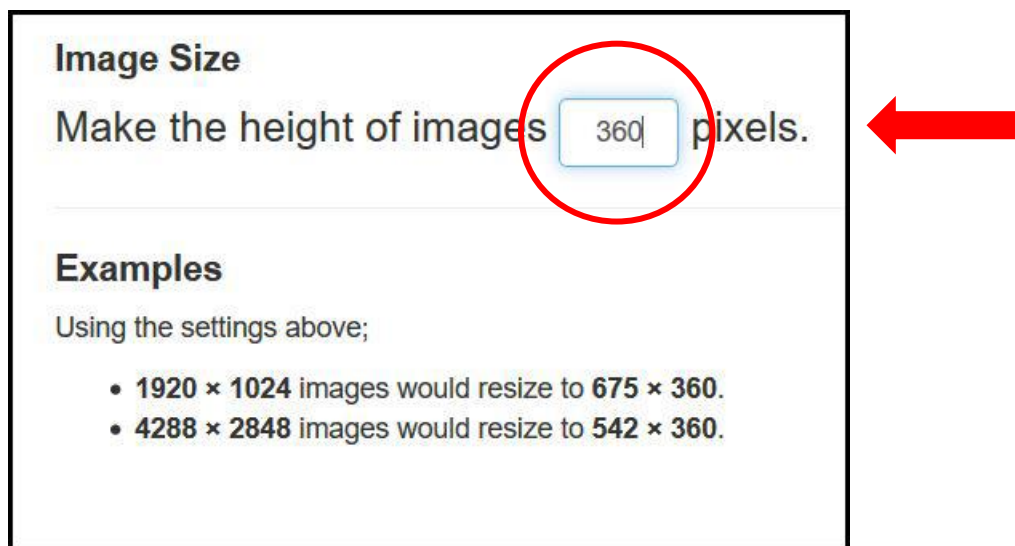


When you click that button the options on the right of the blue box change. Under the “Image Size” title there is a tiny box where you can add your chosen size.

I tested sizes of 360 Pixels and that seems to be just right for the solutions when using the 10x8 book template I provided in the **EXTRAS** folder.

If you are going to use the 11x8.5 book template then the solutions can be a tad bigger at around 380 Pixels. That makes them small enough to fit in fours per page BUT still big enough to actually see the solutions.

You can add 360 or 380 Pixels in the box OR experiment and put in whatever size you prefer...this is just how I do it.

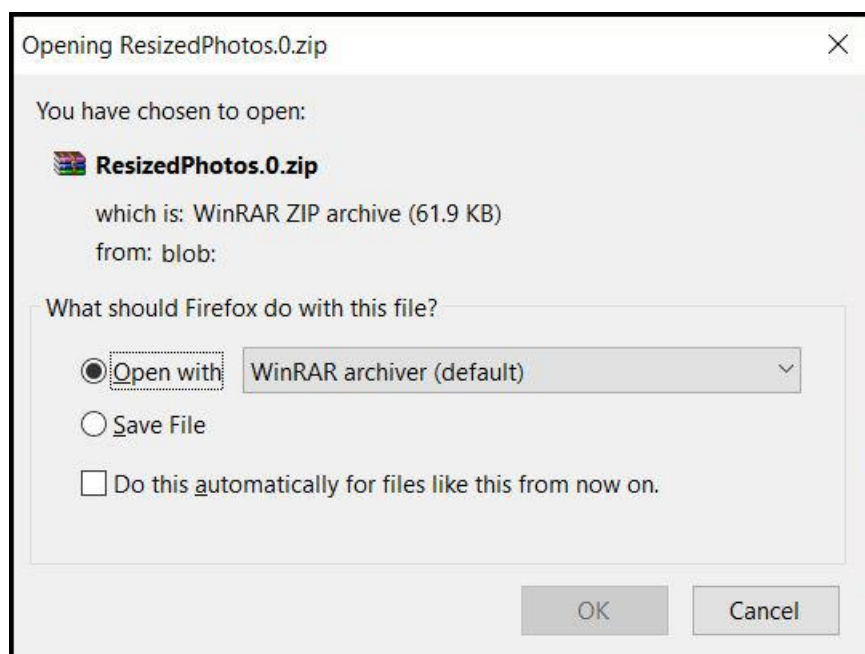
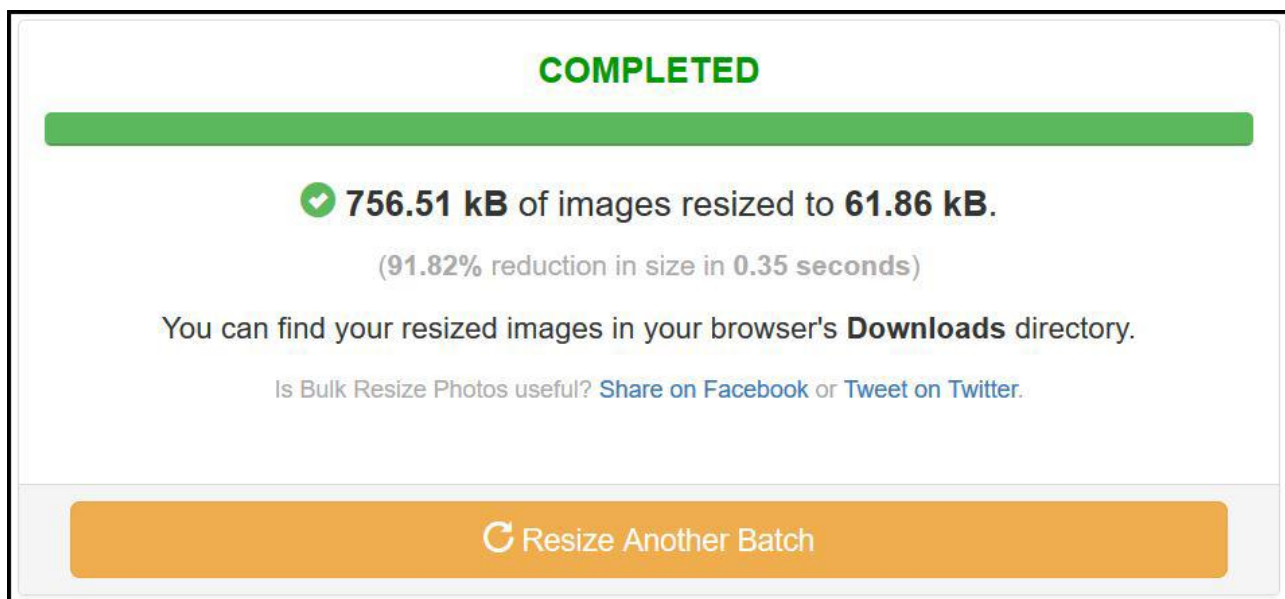


Now click the green “Start Resizing” button:



The resize process will complete fairly quickly depending on how many images you are resizing at once. When done you will see the

green “Completed” text and your files will pop up in a download box as before. Just click OK and download to your computer.

STEP FOUR

YOUR NOW READY TO CREATE A BOOK

Give yourself a pat on the back for getting to this STEP.

I know the first time you go through this course you may feel a little intimidated BUT if you keep at it then things will begin to fall into place. It does get a lot easier so hang in there!

LET’S BEGIN YOUR BOOK CREATION!

Go into the **EXTRAS** folder and choose one of the prepared templates. It doesn’t matter which you choose...I find both sizes to be quite popular in this niche on Amazon but maybe 10x8 is just that much more common.

Open up your chosen book template and as you can see I have added some simple instructions on certain pages so as you can adapt the template to however you want it.

Both templates have been fully formatted so you don’t need to do anything else except for add whatever written content you want and insert your worksheet images...it’s that simple.

Let’s take a closer look at a template:-

Front Page – Here is where you will add the title of your book, a sub-title and the name of your book series, (if you plan on creating a book series).

Also, if you have a brand website address then at the bottom of this page would be the perfect place to add it.

Blank Page Spaces – The page spaces in the template are important because it is how the book is formatted in order to be created into a print book. Do not add any content in those blank page spaces.

Copyright Notice – This is just a basic copyright notice so you can change it to whatever you want. You can find examples of copyright pages by searching Google. Type in “copyright notice for books samples” and you should get a lot of search results to choose from.

Table Of Contents – This can be easily edited to suit your needs and you can even delete the whole thing if you don’t want a TOB.

The TOB has already been formatted in the templates but you can edit the settings by right clicking anywhere in your table of contents and choosing “**Edit Field**” in the popup.

NOTE: *When you have completed adding all your content to the book don’t forget to go back to the table of contents page and to update the list. You do this by right clicking on the text and this time choosing “**Update Field**” in the popup. You then can choose which type of update you want. I usually just click “**Update Entire Table**”.*

Introduction – It is not necessary to add an introduction but I think it is a good idea to add at least a page of introduction material to explain the purpose of the book and why you decided to create the book, etc.

How To Use This Book – Again, you don’t need to add any instructions for your book but readers may appreciate some details of the best way to use the book and maybe add some tips on teaching children, etc..

Page Title – There are around 250 free pages for you to add content and they all have text at the top. You can add whatever text you want here or remove the page titles entirely if you wish.

If you are creating something like a numbers book or alphabet book the page title would be a good place to add the main number or alphabet letter.

So as an example, in the case of an alphabet book you would add each letter of the alphabet at the top of each individual page. You could have the full alphabet in uppercase letters and then the full alphabet in lowercase letters.

Adding New Pages - To add new pages do not use the “Return” key. What you will need to do is click near the end of the previous page and then on your keyboard hold “Ctrl” and click “Return”. Doing this will bring up a nice clean page.

Book Back Matter – This is where a lot of people mess up. The back matter of your book can be very beneficial in helping to getting repeat sales. This back area of your book is where you can advertise your brand and other books in your catalog.

If you are just starting out you will begin to see the benefits after you have a few books in your catalog but it is well worth the wait. If you have an email list set up then you can add an opt in address where people can sign up. You would offer a free gift of some sort to entice readers to sign up to your list.

If you don’t have a list you can add your book website address where people can go to view all your other books. What I do is add my Author Central url and ask people to go check out all my books on that page on Amazon. **You can learn how to set up your Author Central Page by reading the Amazon Author Central Tutorial in the EXTRAS folder provided with this course.**

Adding images of all your books is also a good way to catch the eye of your readers to entice them to look at your book catalog. I left examples at the end of the template to give you an idea of what you could do with your book cover images.

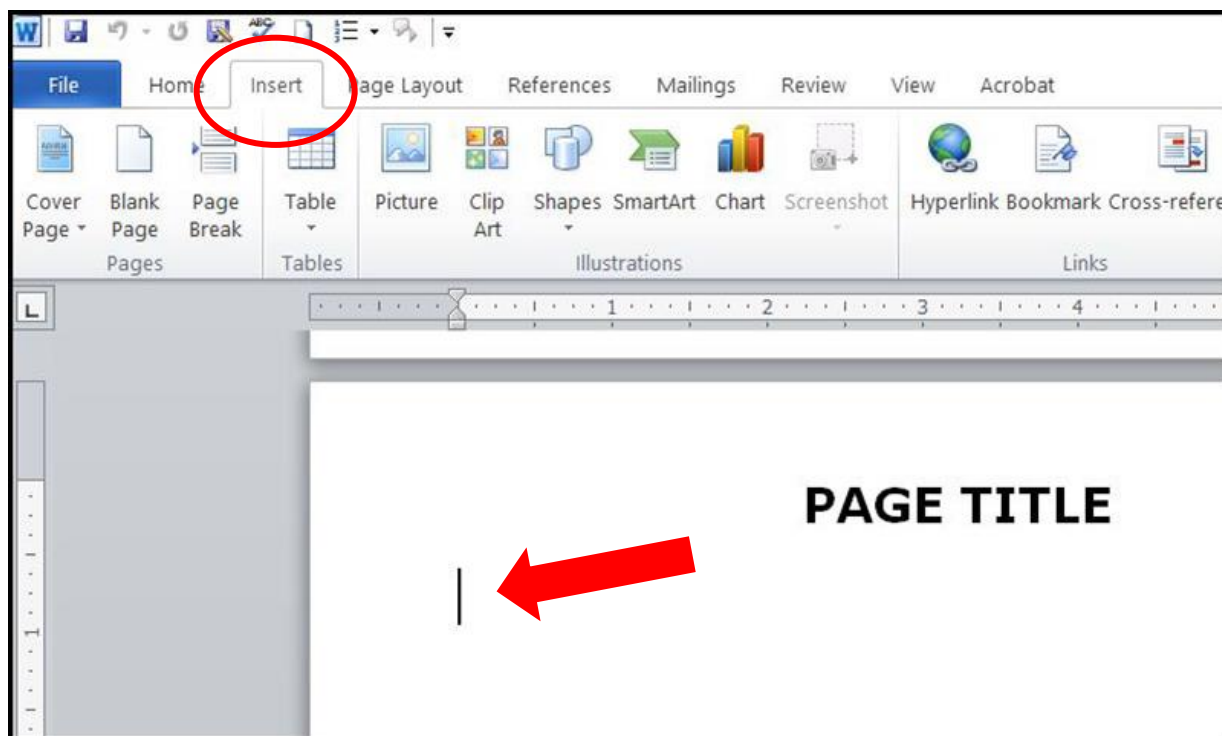
Adding Credits – Don’t forget that the creator of <http://worksheetgenius.com> is allowing you to use all the tools on his site FOR FREE. You will be able to sell and make money from the worksheets that his software creates. So please make sure to credit his site by following what I mention on Page 71 of this course. He is one of the “good guys” in this space so let’s help him to continue what he is doing.

INSERTING YOUR WORKSHEET IMAGES

You now understand the layout of your template which means there is only one thing left to do...add your images and complete your book content.

Images should be inserted by using the **Insert>picture** function found in the top left of the Microsoft Word ribbon. If you are using Open Office or some other word processor then use their insert option in the menus. There are some explanations for adding images using OpenOffice [HERE](#)

Click onto your book template and scroll down to the first title or page. Click beneath that title or click at the top of the page, then click INSERT / PICTURE, select your image, click INSERT button and your image will now be inserted into your page. Repeat for all your other pages and images.





Remember...the images may look like they are not centered in the template but this is normal regarding print books. When you insert an image you will notice that one of the side margins will be wider than the other. This is done on purpose in order to account for the central spine of a printed book.

So don't adjust any of the margin sizes to the template because the layout is supposed to look like that.

5

STEP FIVE

CREATE A BOOK COVER

A lot of authors/publishers tend to fall short when it comes to adding quality covers to their books. This is a shame because they may have an amazing book but no one would buy it because the cover looks terrible.

Yes, the cover of a book can make a HUGE difference when it comes to sales. Whatever is on the cover of your book is the first thing a potential buyer will see...if the cover looks real bad then people will just move onto the next book.

It doesn’t matter how good your book is if your cover looks terrible...people will not look past the cover to notice. So how you choose your finished book to look is VERY important. You need to spend a bit of time researching other books in your genre to get an idea of what style of covers seem to be the most popular.

In other words, you want to create covers that are similar in design to the top selling books. Let’s face it, one of the reasons why those books are top selling IS because of their covers. It certainly is a factor.

Let’s take a look at some of the popular books in this children’s workbook niche and see what type of covers they have. Remember, some of these authors employed professional designers to create their covers BUT you do not need to go to all that expense. You just need to get an idea of what colors, images and text to use.

It may take a few goes to get it right but if I can do it - (I am not a cover designer but I gradually taught myself how to create a good cover) – then you can certainly do it.

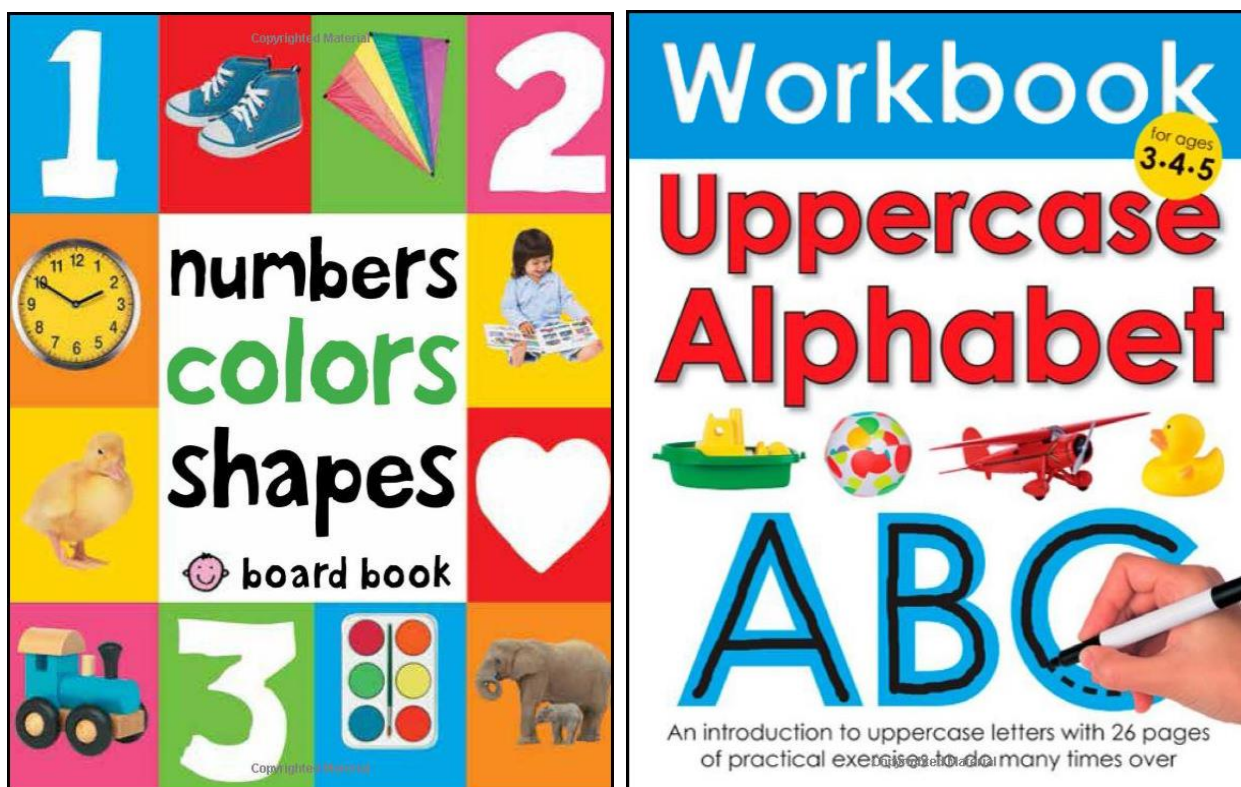
Here are a few examples...look at the colors used, look at the fun images, look at the interesting text. Sometimes keeping it stupid simple is the best way to go.



Notice that the covers have very vibrant colors and large images. When it comes to children’s workbooks “images” tend to be more important than the “title”. Look at how the titles only take up a small percentage of the cover space.

It only makes sense because the first thing that will attract a child to a book is the image on the cover and not the title; kids don’t care what the text on the cover says! Even though the adult does

the buying they know what kind of cover will entice their child to be interested in a workbook.



Some book covers have smaller images BUT they make up for that by creating colorful and fun looking text font. There are no rules when it comes to children’s book covers except for – “Make sure your covers are relevant to what’s inside”.

Never create a book cover just for the sake of “getting more sales” if what’s inside is not related to the cover. The last thing you want to do is “bait” potential buyers into buying something that is not what they thought it would be.

This is a sure way to tick buyers off and you can expect bad book reviews to start rolling in. Put as much relevant information on the cover as you can WITHOUT making it look too cluttered.

The above ABC book on the right is a good example. It’s a very simple cover with simple colors. The title and images give a perfect example of what to expect inside the book and there is even a small text paragraph at the bottom to provide even more information.

The buyer will know exactly what they are getting here and because of the bright colors and fun images a child will most likely be drawn to the book too.

If you don’t want to do your own cover designs you can pay someone on [Fiverr.com](https://www.fiverr.com) to do all that stuff for you. Might cost you about \$10 and the cover probably won’t be amazing but at least it’s a start.

Having said that, YOU DO want to have a rough idea of how you want the cover to look, even if you are not creating it yourself. If you are using an outside source to create the covers for you then you will need to provide them with some detailed instructions of how you want your book cover to look.

This is why you need to do some research first. Personally if you plan on making something of this business method, if you plan on growing your own little children’s book empire then I would suggest you at least learn how to create your own covers...over time.

It won’t cost you anything....except for your time! If you want to create your own covers but you are a total beginner then don’t worry because there is a super easy way to do this.

In the original text I went on to describe how to upload your book manuscript to Createspace in order to have it printed. Unfortunately, that platform has now closed so publishers now use Kindle Direct Publishing, (KDP), for this process.

Yes...KDP now do print books...which is great news!

So when it comes time to upload your book to KDP just head on over to the **EXTRAS folder which came with this course.**

In the folder you will find the **KDP PRINT ON DEMAND TUTORIAL to help you step by step through the process.**

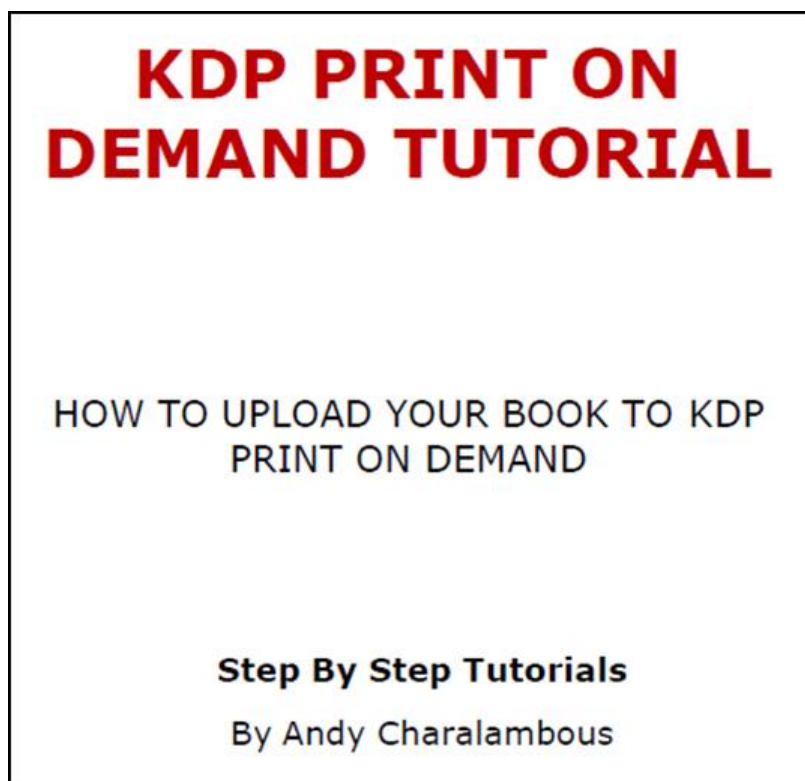
Overall, when you look at the top 100 children’s workbooks in Amazon you can see that there are some similarities in color, font use, font size and image use. The trick is to keep it simple and this is especially so if you have zero experience in design. Don’t try to design something that is beyond your skill level.

Keep your book covers stupid simple and don’t forget your main targets are the children. You need to catch their attention. If you get their attention then you will get mum and dad’s attention too.

The cover for your physical book is a one-piece, wraparound cover that includes your front cover, back cover and spine.

Your front cover should have the title, subtitle, if any, and author name. It may also have whatever image you chose for your cover.
