This is a children’s non-fiction course that involves very little, if any, writing and it is in a sub-niche that is very profitable. Follow this course as I have laid it out and you will make money!

The best part is that it will take a lot less effort than you think because one of the great things about non-fiction is that you don’t have to rack your brains trying to think up stories and develop characters. You certainly don’t have to pay for expensive children’s book illustrators.

Nope...this course avoids all that stuff and instead provides you with the tools to build your very own profitable, non-fiction kids book business.

INTRODUCTION

CHILDREN’S BOOKS FOREVER!

In 2016 the children's print book market made over \$500 million dollars and was the biggest year for children's books for the third year in a row.

The children’s books yearly market value has increased by £120m over the last 10 years, a jump of 44% and the pre-school book sector alone saw a growth of 8.5%. That’s quite impressive!

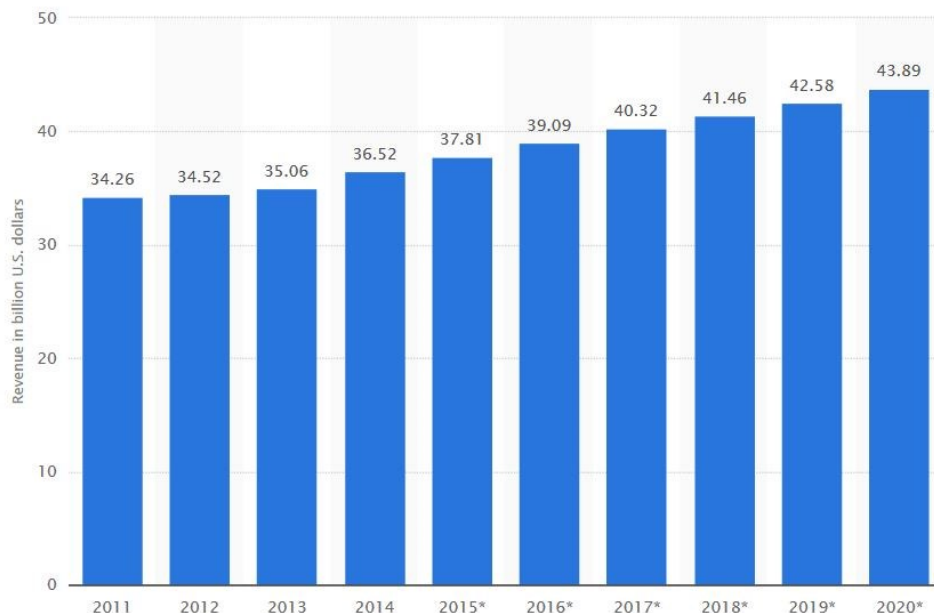
At Nielsen’s annual Children’s Book Summit in New York City, industry experts and executives discussed important issues in children’s publishing. They spoke about consumer trends and forecasts in the children’s publishing market and below are two of their most important insights:

- The children’s book market shows more growth than the overall U.S. book market: While the overall book market has grown 33 percent since 2004, the children’s book market has grown 52 percent growth since 2004, with a four percent compound annual growth rate.
- Children’s book sales are still going strong in 2016/17 with print children’s books up five percent over 2015. In particular, juvenile fiction and juvenile nonfiction have shown growth.

So the kids book market is still growing but as a solo publisher creating books in all categories would be too much of a daunting task. You need to focus on one area and dominate it.

But what category in the children’s book niche is hugely profitable yet requires very little writing?

CHILDREN’S EARLY LEARNING BOOKS



Parents understand why early learning is important. Simply put, a child’s early years lay the foundation for all that is to come. In recent years, researchers have learned that the human brain develops the vast majority of its neurons, and is at its most receptive to learning, between birth and three years of age.

When children are young, they are learning sponges. Every new experience, every word they learn, every behavior they adopt, is an investment in a more fruitful future.

You can never have a greater impression on a person than when they are in their early childhood years. Most parents have always inherently understood this and that is why they are part of the

rabid buyers of these evergreen early learning children’s books. There are multiple benefits for children who are taught to study or learn at a very early age. Some of the many advantages are:-

- *Neurological*
- *Educational*
- *Psychological*
- *Social*
- *Linguistic*

Neurological Reasons

Early learning helps to develop a young child's brain. In the first six years, children learn at a much faster pace than at any other time in their lives.

The direct result of stimulation the child receives through early learning experiences, form the basis of all future learning and intellectual ability.

As parents talk, sing and read to their children, existing links among brain cells are strengthened and new links are formed. At a younger age, learning is faster than it will be as the child grows older. When a child is taught to read and write, the process of learning has a profound influence on the entire functioning and development of the brain.

You, as an early learning children’s book publisher, can play a critical early role by providing quality early learning books that parents and guardians can use to instil not only reading, writing

and ability skills but more importantly, instilling a lifelong love of learning.

Educational Reasons

Numerous studies have shown that strong oral language skills are the basis for literacy development. When children learn to read and write at an early age, they have greater general knowledge, expand their vocabulary and become more fluent readers and writers. They also have improved attention spans and better concentration. Early readers and writers can recognize a larger number of words by sight, which enables them to learn more from and about their environment.

It is interesting to note that early readers and writers not only become lifelong readers, but also lifelong learners. Studies have shown that early learners continue to get higher grades than their peers through grade school.

Psychological Reasons

A child who learns to read and write joyfully at home, at an early age, with a loving parent or caregiver, grows in self-confidence and independence. This promotes greater maturity, increases discipline and lays the basis for moral literacy.

It sparks curiosity about people, places and things and also satisfies the child's curiosity by providing explanations of how things work. It exposes the child to a range of problem-solving techniques. In

addition, early learning ignites the child's creativity and imagination.

A child who begins with early learning books has a distinct advantage over his or her peers. One of the big advantages being there is no psychological pressure. The formal school system has yet to kick in, in most parts of the world. So, the parent can teach their child to read and write a little each day, in a leisurely manner.

Social Reasons

Even at a young age, children have social awareness. They know who is more popular. They can tell who can do what. If there are a few children in kindergarten who know how to read, they may receive awards and certificates, be called upon to choose books or encouraged to write, illustrate and read aloud their own stories. In some schools, they may even be asked to help other children, who may still be struggling with basic letter recognition.

Early learners have the opportunity to relate to their peers on a more confident, more competent level as they are already being recognized for their superior accomplishments. Such experiences increase the child's social status among peers as well as his or her self-image and self-confidence.

Linguistic Reasons

The sooner children learn how to read and write, the more books, knowledge and ideas they will be exposed to. The result? Improved linguistic skills in the form of a richer vocabulary, correct grammar,

improved writing, better spelling and more articulate oral communication. Such children have the opportunity to develop a wider vocabulary to describe their knowledge, observations and experiences. It has been shown that children with a richer vocabulary do far better in scholastic areas, especially in the early years. Their stronger reading skills also enable them to communicate more effectively orally as well as in writing.

“Young children need writing to help them learn about reading, they need reading to help them learn about writing; and they need oral language to help them learn about both.”

What did I write before? Parents understand why early learning is important. That’s right, they know what’s going on and they want the best for their children. A parent who wants the best for their children will want them to get started with learning at an early age...they will research and hunt for resources and tools...they will buy products that help them to better develop their child.

The books that you will create following this course...your books...will be a big part of the tools a parent or guardian will need to teach their children.

Everyone is a winner!

The parent will be satisfied that they did the best they could to build a strong learning foundation for their child.

The child will have fun using your books and at the same time will develop his or her brain.

And you...well, you can finally go on that two week vacation with your family!

GET STARTED

In this course you will learn how to create and publish low content children’s books...specifically early learning tracing workbooks. These are considered low content because they are mainly image based books which means you don’t have to do much writing. In fact, apart from the introductions at the start of your books you literally don’t have to do ANY writing!

If you are not a big fan of writing but really want to build your very own self-publishing business then I think you are going to like this system.

As I mentioned above, the children’s book industry is massive and VERY profitable but as a solo publisher it would be unwise to delve into ALL children’s book categories...there are just too many.

Instead you will be focusing on a children’s sub-niche that is just as profitable in its own right but a more acceptable sub-niche to break into for a newbie or solo publisher.

The very simple steps in this tutorial will show you how to create and publish these children’s tracing workbooks from content creation, cover design all the way to the end publishing process.

I will be focusing on publishing print books only because the types of books you will be creating do not translate well to Kindle. Don’t worry, I provide templates to make this whole process a breeze. Also, in my experience, children’s books do a hell of a lot better in print format anyway...Amazon statistics may state otherwise but

going by my own personal stats that has been the case for many years.

A SIMPLE PROCCESS

This course book is split up into two sections. The first section comprises of **4 STEPS** that you can follow to create books that DO NOT have images in the content.

The second section comprises of **3 STEPS, (starting from Step 5)**, that you can follow to create books that DO have images in the content.

I wanted to provide you with detailed information for both varieties so as you can adapt your books to however you want. By understanding both methods you will be able to create both types of books and experiment with your own styles.

I have done my best to keep the information as easy to follow and concise as possible. Read through each step as I have laid them out and don’t forget to use any of the included images as helpful guides.

If this is your first time publishing a book then this course will be the perfect stepping stone up towards your book creation business empire! I think you are going to have a blast creating these books and not only that but you will be earning too. What more can you ask for?

As for all you intermediate and pro publishers this course will help you to increase your income and add another book category income source to your list.

Remember, I have provided all that you need to know to help you create your books. You have ALL the tools, you have ALL the instructions...the rest is up to you.

You don’t need any skills but the three things that will help you succeed here are:-

- Patience
- Determination
- Perseverance

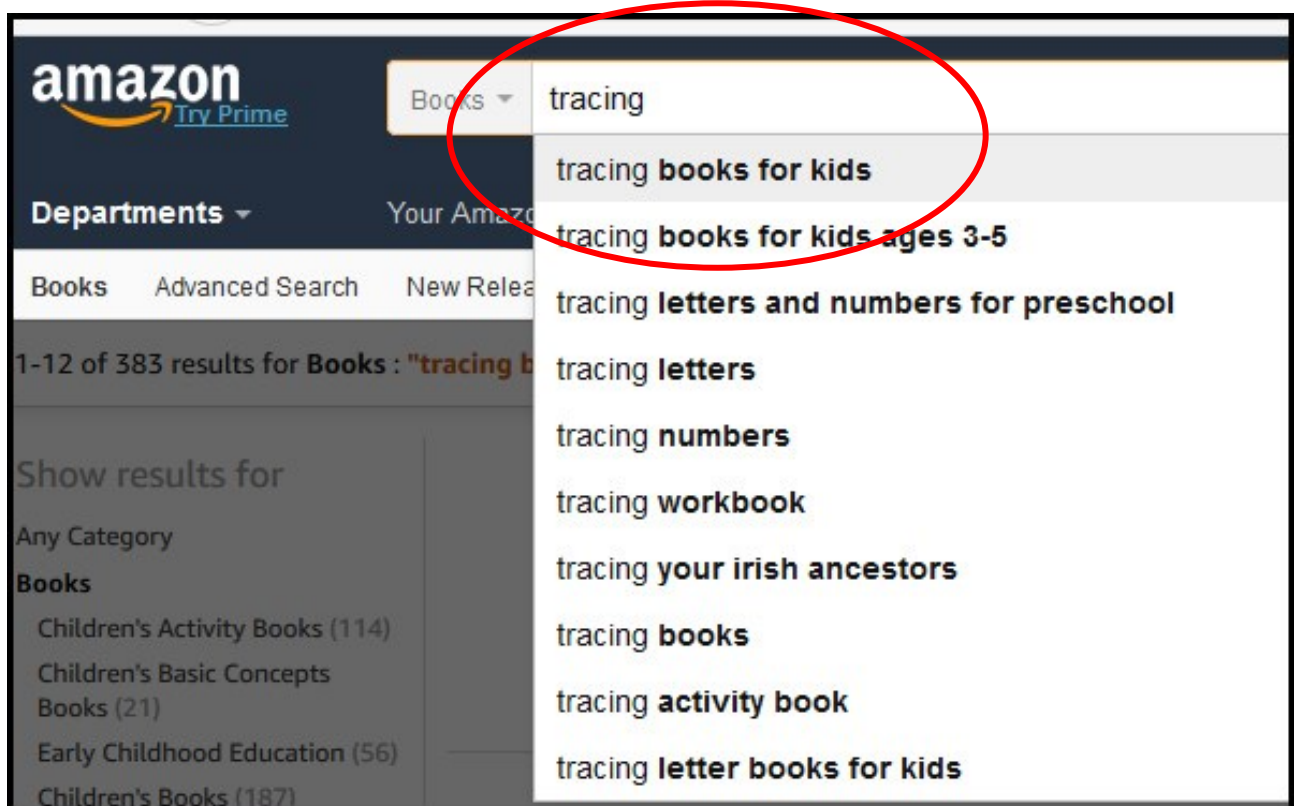

8. If you click on any of those subcategories and check the rankings of a handful of books you will notice that even books that are on page 5, 10 or even further down that list have pretty good rankings.

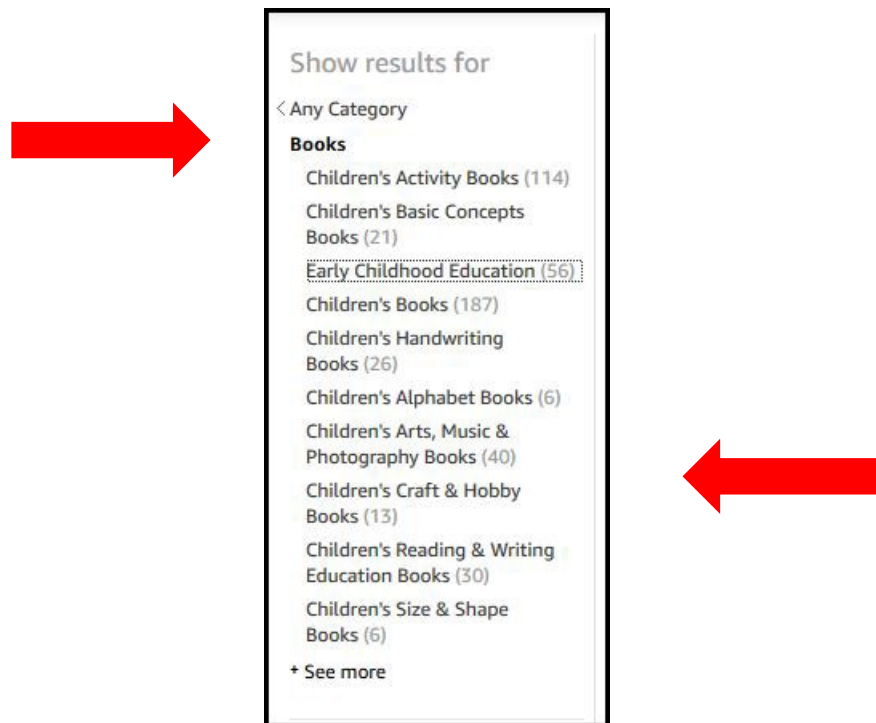
So we can see that all these categories are highly profitable but we don't want to compete with all of them...it would just be too

difficult. So let’s delve deeper and pick out a more specific style of book.

9. Scroll to the top of the page to the Amazon search bar and type in “Tracing Books For Kids”. Before you even finish typing the word “Tracing” Amazon would have provided you with keyword suggestions. Notice that keyword is right at the top. Click on it.



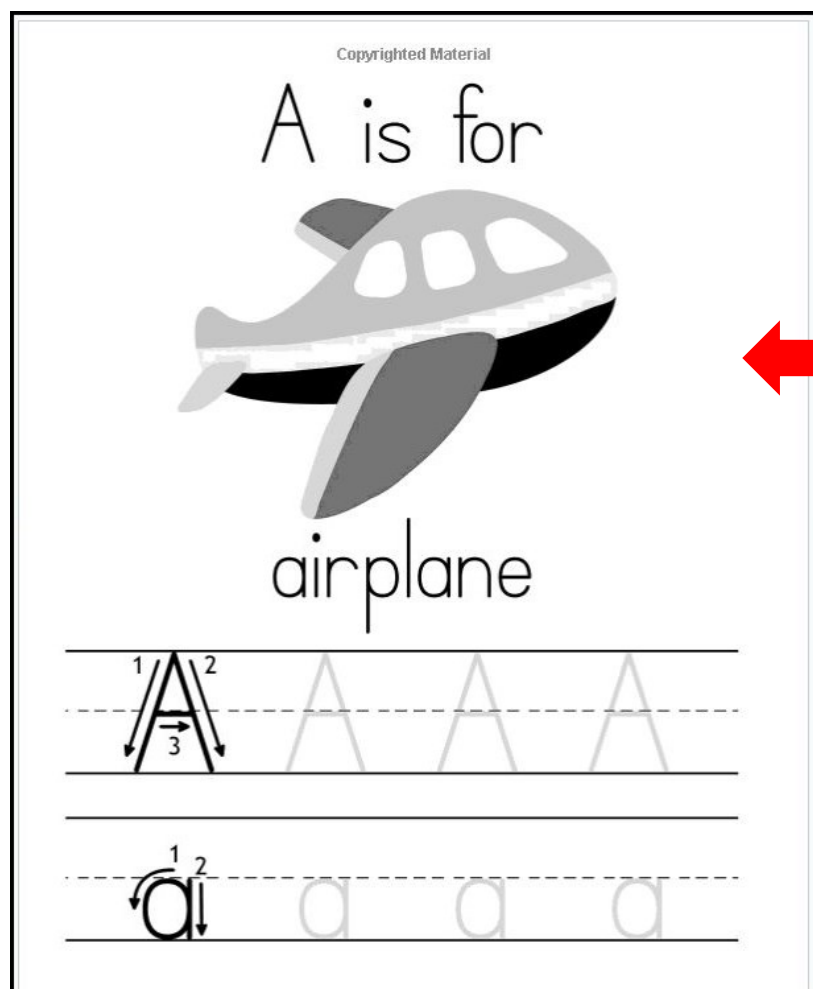
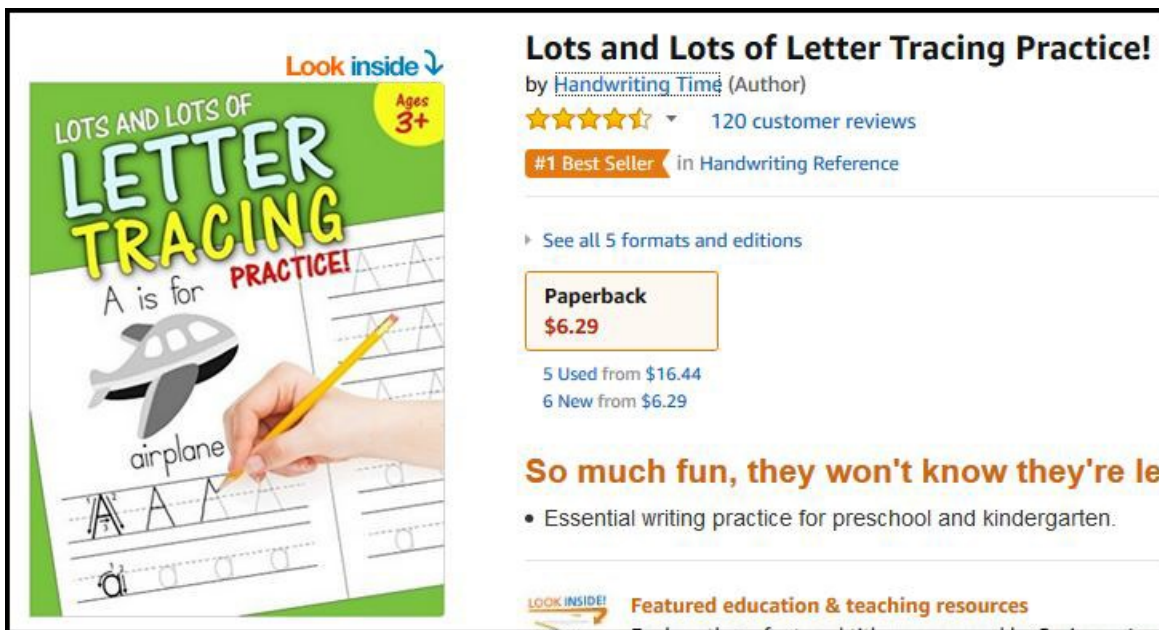
10. If you look at the sidebar again you will now see even deeper categories. You can click on any of those and you will notice the type of books that you will be creating in this course.



- 11.** Take a look at the books in those categories and notice their high ranking, which means they are selling like crazy. Browse through the books and get some ideas for your own books.

On the next page you can see one of the top early learning tracing books ranking at #590 in Books. Let’s take a look inside to see how involved the content is.

With the right instructions, this type of book will not be difficult to create!

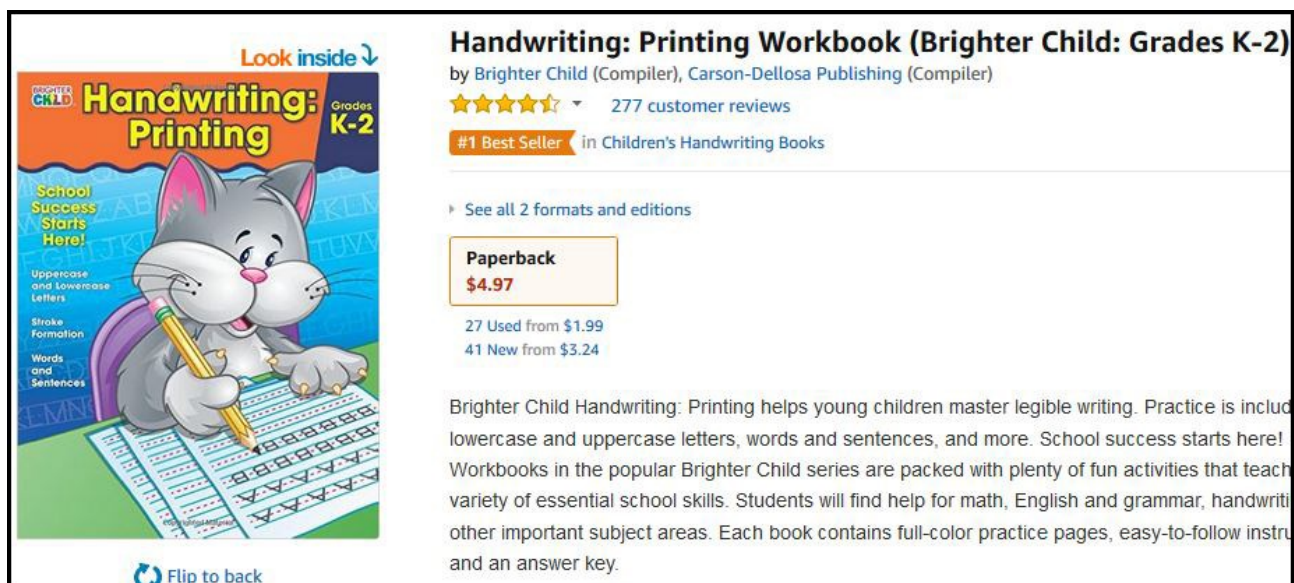


That is the first page of the book. A huge airplane and two rows of the letter A...all in black and white! Let me repeat....**this book is ranking at #590 in Books!!!!** The book is priced at \$6.29...just guess the daily earnings from that one book!

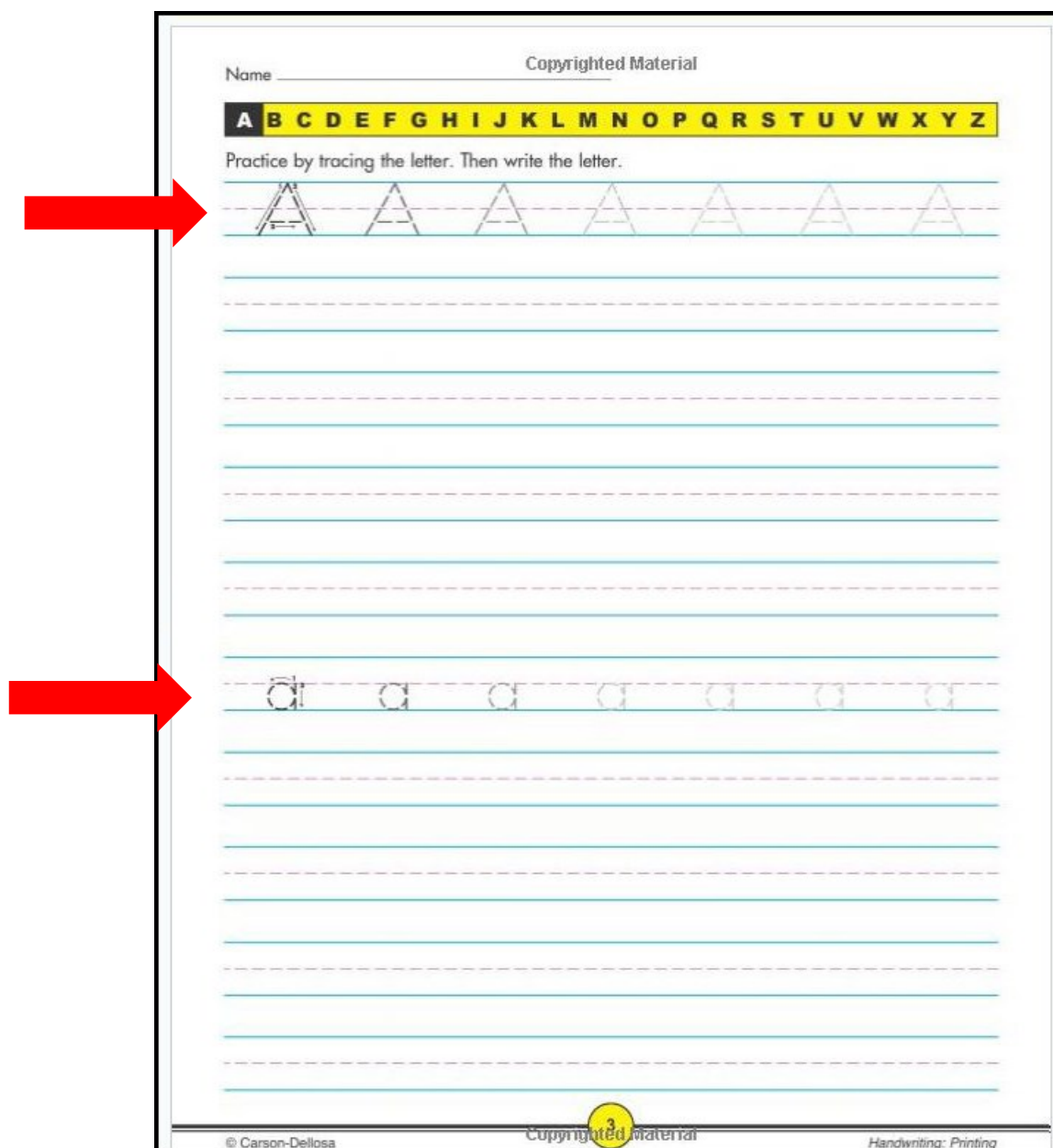
Even better...ask yourself if you can create a similar book...because I am about to show you how in this course!

Let’s look at another book.

This next book is ranked at #297 in Books.

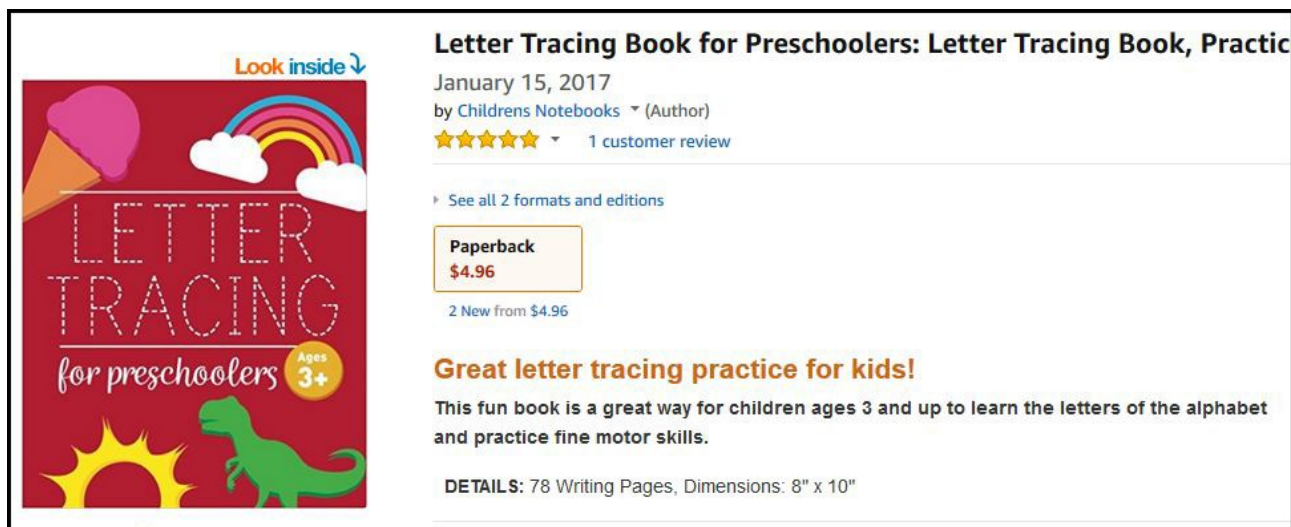


Nice cover, let’s take a look inside. I wonder if the contents is too involved and complicated to put together.

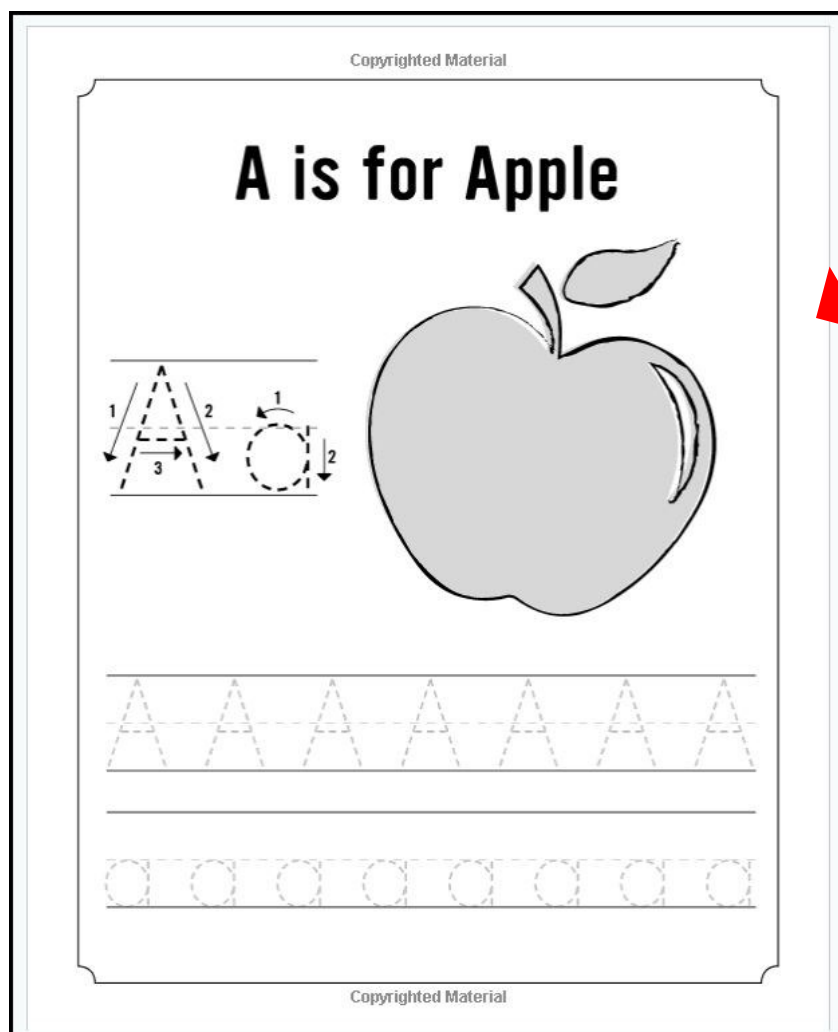


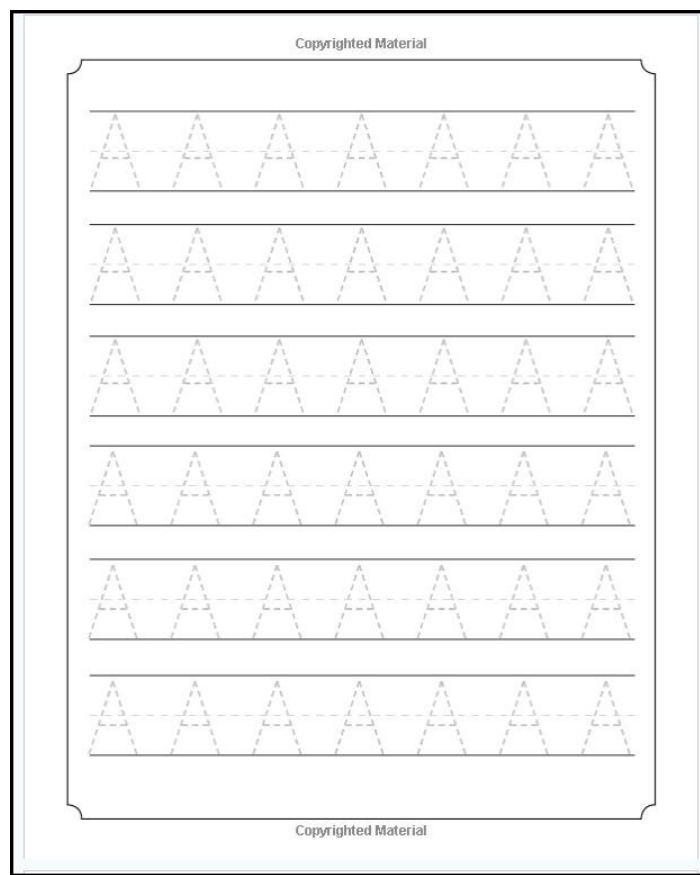
So the contents is a bunch of tracing lines. This book is also a bestseller and is priced at \$4.97. **Another happy author right there!**

Here is another book currently at #9,902 in Books. Ok, it is not ranking as high but any rank under 10,000 is going to still be a good earner. Also, this book was published via Createspace so it was created by a self-publisher...just like you and me!



Let's look inside.





There are a ton more books just like these with very little written content that are hugely popular and selling like crazy! I think you get where I am coming from...I don't need to show you any more...you can look for yourself on Amazon and be amazed at the simplicity of these books.

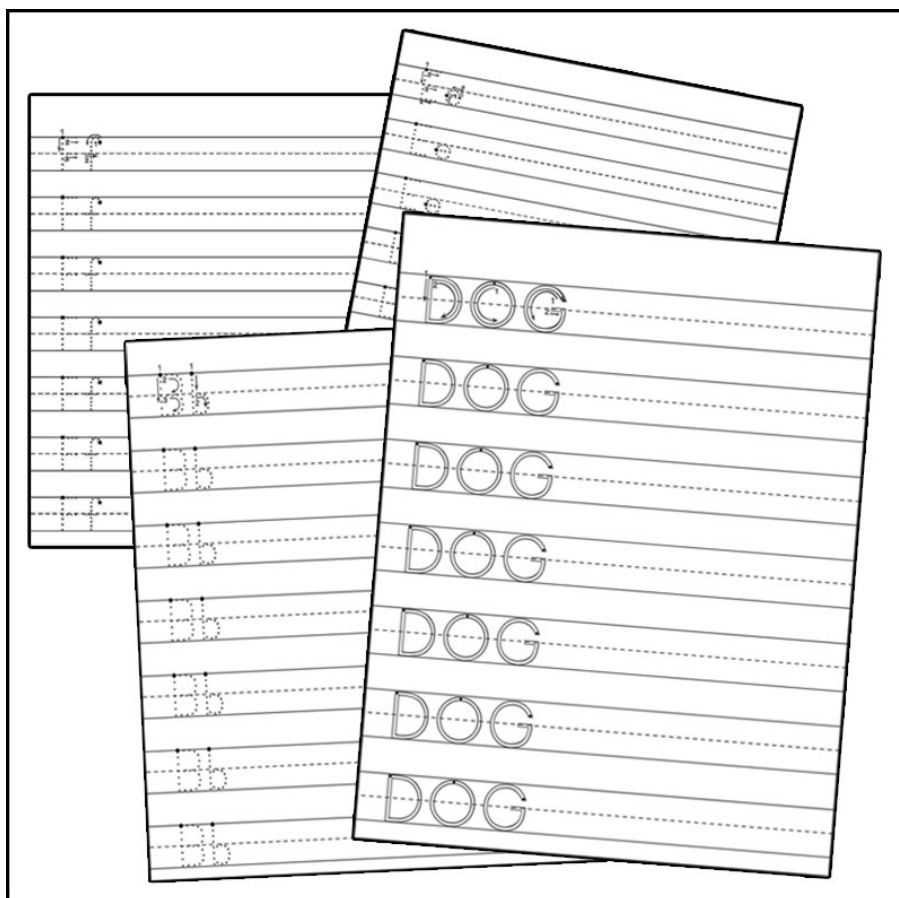
You are going to create and publish early learning tracing workbooks like these and you are going to gradually grow your income with each book.

ALSO...what you will learn does not just restrict you to this style of early learning workbook....you can experiment and even create books for older kids, or even younger kids. The sky is the limit!

STEP ONE

CREATE YOUR WORKSHEET

I am going to show you how to create a basic worksheet using the [Handwriting Practice](#) online tool. Before you begin I just want to share with you what I have found to be the best browsers to use for this software.

Generally, you can use any browser you want but not all of them will be perfectly compatible with the handwriting tool. Below I have listed the browsers that I have tested and preferred.

CHROME – This is my chosen browser when it comes to using the handwriting tool because it seems to load faster and there are no issues regarding the worksheet printing process.

SAFARI – This is not a browser I use often but it seems to work well with the handwriting tool and there are no issues regarding the worksheet printing process.

MICROSOFT EDGE – I don’t use this browser often but it also works fine with the handwriting tool. While testing I did notice that when in “print” mode I had to switch the option from “Adobe PDF” to “Microsoft Print To PDF”. This is not a big deal and in fact the PDF was created faster. I will explain this process later on.

FIREFOX – This is my primary browser and most of the time it works great but sometimes, usually right after an update, Firefox can be a little buggy. Not a big deal because I just restart the computer and all is good. However, if you are having trouble during

the printing process then it may be best to just switch to another browser...Chrome being the best choice here.

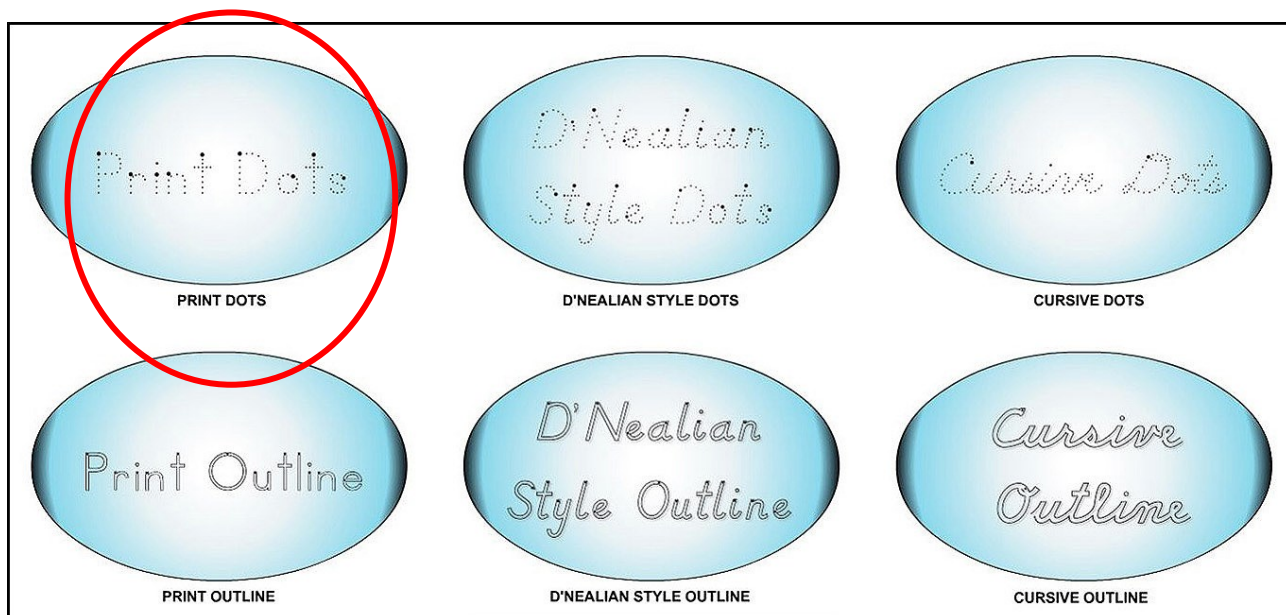
Anyway, all will become clear as I explain further later on in the course.

Begin by opening your chosen browser. I will be demonstrating using Chrome but you can use whichever you want because the process is very similar with all browsers.

1. Go to [Handwriting Practice](http://handwritingpractice.net/handwriting/index.html) -

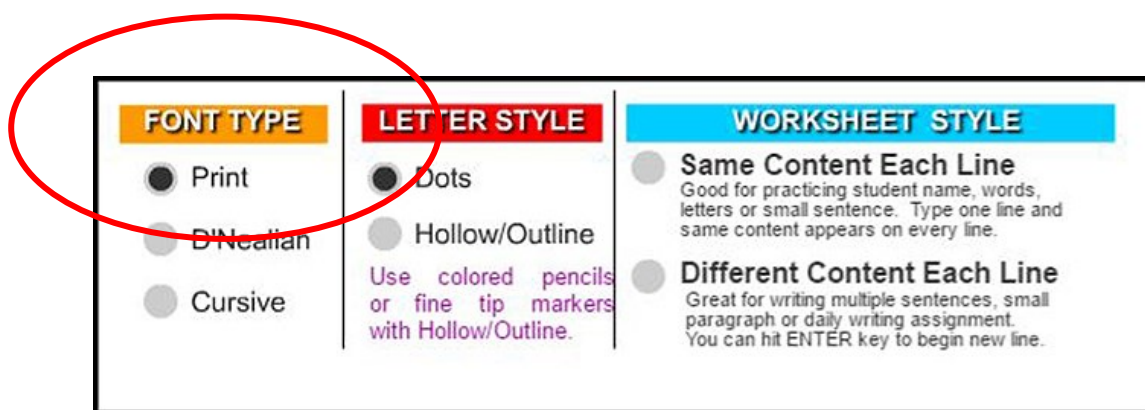


Choose the writing style that you want to use by clicking on the appropriate oval shape button. I will be using the “PRINT DOTS” option.



You will be taken to a new screen where the creator options can be seen in the top left corner and a worksheet template will be on the center right of the screen.

2. In the options first you must choose your “FONT TYPE”. Click on the circle next to your chosen type.




Next you want to pick your “LETTER STYLE”. As before, just Click on the circle next to your chosen style.

5. Choose your letter size under the title option “CHANGE LETTER SIZE”.
6. In the next option, “PAPER LAYOUT” choose “Portrait”.
7. Under “PAPER SIZE” I usually pick “US Letter” but either option will be fine.
8. In the “COLORS” section leave everything as default because you won’t be creating colored worksheets. Keep everything in black and white because it keeps the printing costs down which in turn means you have more options when it comes to pricing your book.
9. Before you press “Print” button move over to the left where it says “CHANGE TITLE HERE”. I recommend not adding a title because a title takes up room but you can add one if you wish. To remove any text in the title area just click in the rectangle box below the title and push the space key on your keyboard once. This will remove the title and leave a blank space.

- 11.** As soon as you add your text you will see it appear on the worksheet template on screen. At the same time another options screen will appear showing the row options.

- 12.** To change the row options for each line just click on any of the circles in each row. You can only have one option chosen per line and they can be all different or all the same. Play around with the options to design the worksheet to how you want it.

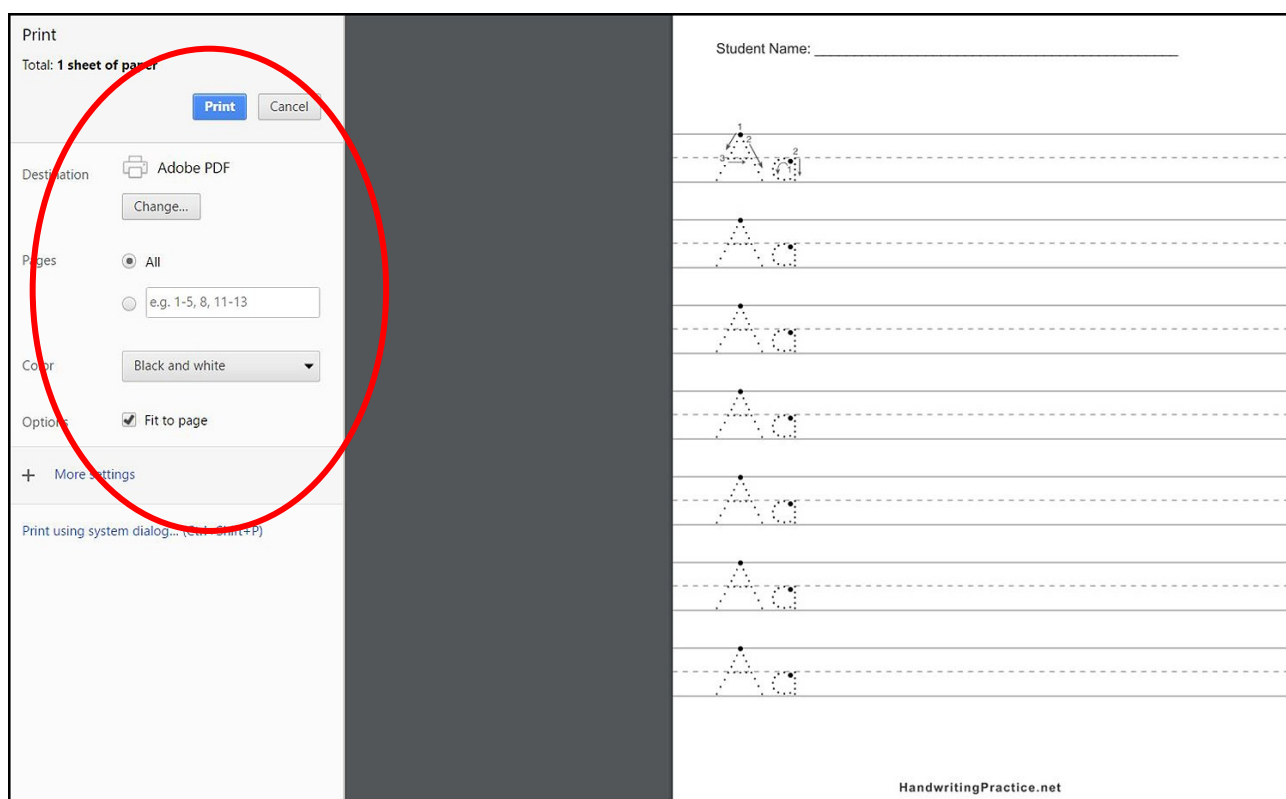
As you choose each appearance you will be able to see what it will look like in the worksheet template to the right of the rows.

- 13.** When you are done just click the green “Print” button in the top right of the screen – make sure to avoid that annoying moving ad.

GOING TO PRINT

After you clicked on the “Print” button you will begin the process of printing the worksheet into a PDF. A couple of the browsers I mentioned above have a slightly different process but all are very simple to understand. Let me go through them:

- In Chrome – If you are using the Chrome browser you will see a popup screen similar to this:-

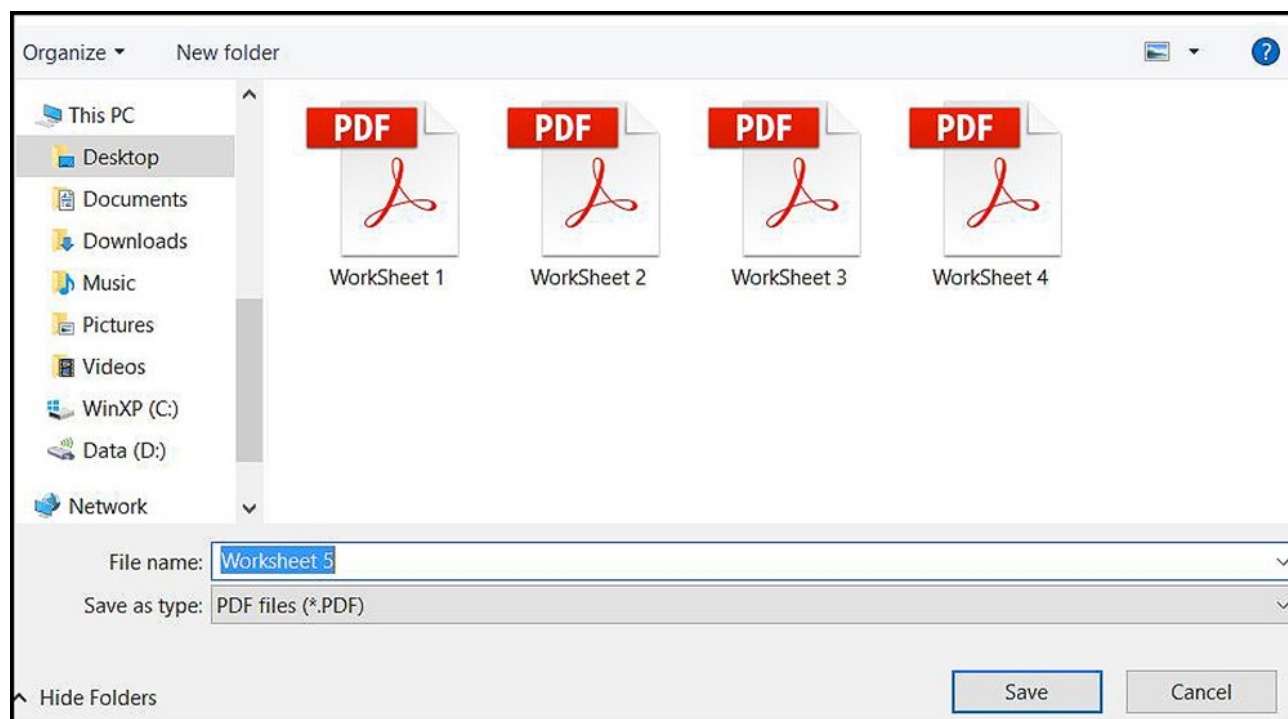


You should be able to keep everything as default. Make sure that the color is set for black and white. All you have to do now is click the blue “Print” button above.

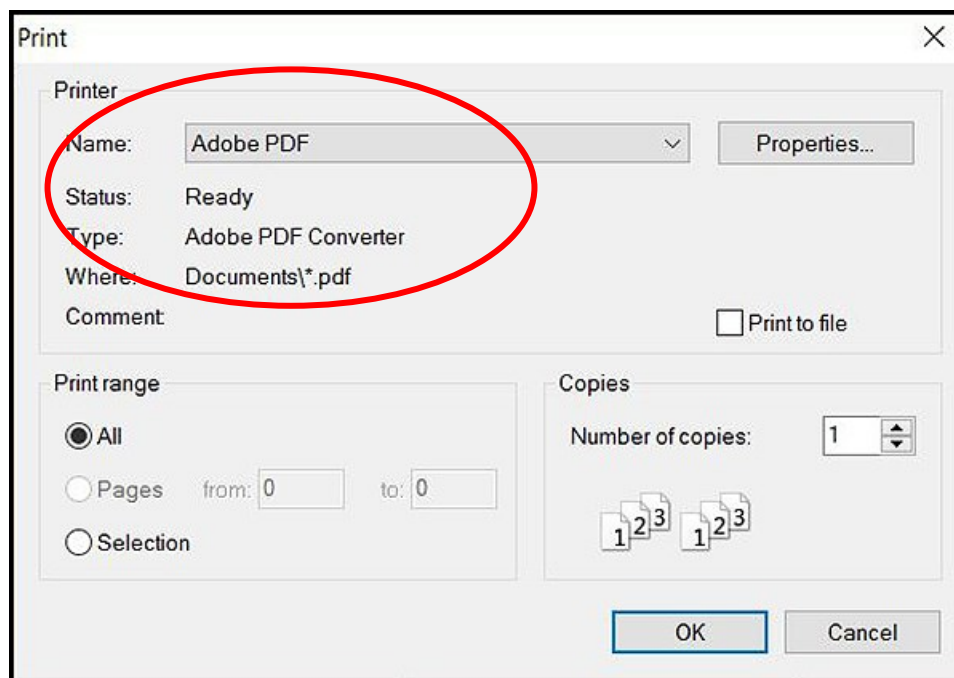
As soon as you do that a folder window will pop up and this is where you can choose where you want to save your PDF. You can keep it as is or change the folder as you please.

I would keep all your PDF’s in a specific folder for each book you create so as to keep everything neat and organized.

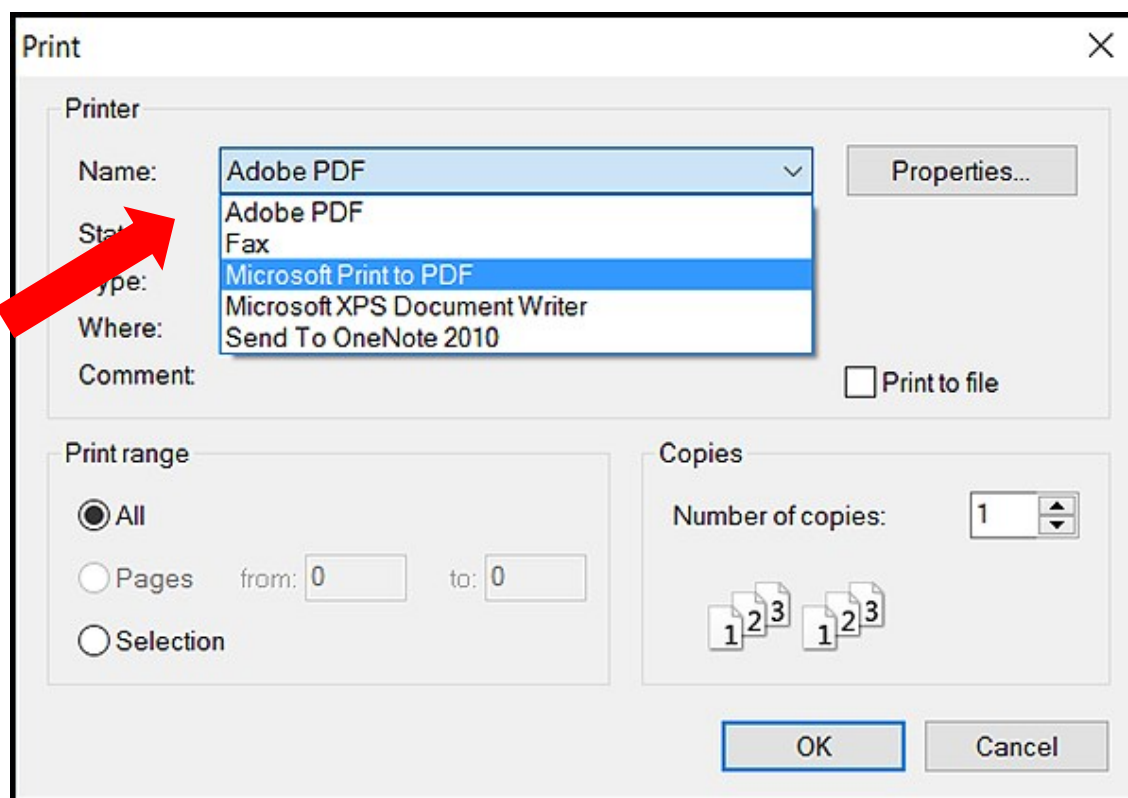
Name your PDF and click “Save”. Done!



- In Safari & Firefox – If you are using either of these browsers you will see a popup screen similar to what you see on the next page after you click the green “Print” button:-

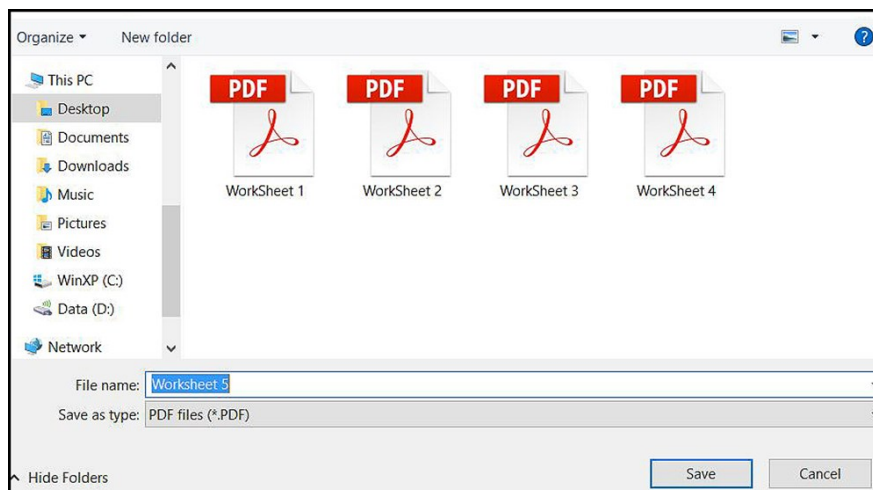


Leave as default and click "OK". Or you can change the print from Adobe PDF to Microsoft Print To PDF.



As with the Chrome setup a folder window will pop up and this is where you can choose where you want to save your PDF. You can keep it as is or change the folder as you please.

Name your PDF and click “Save”. Done!

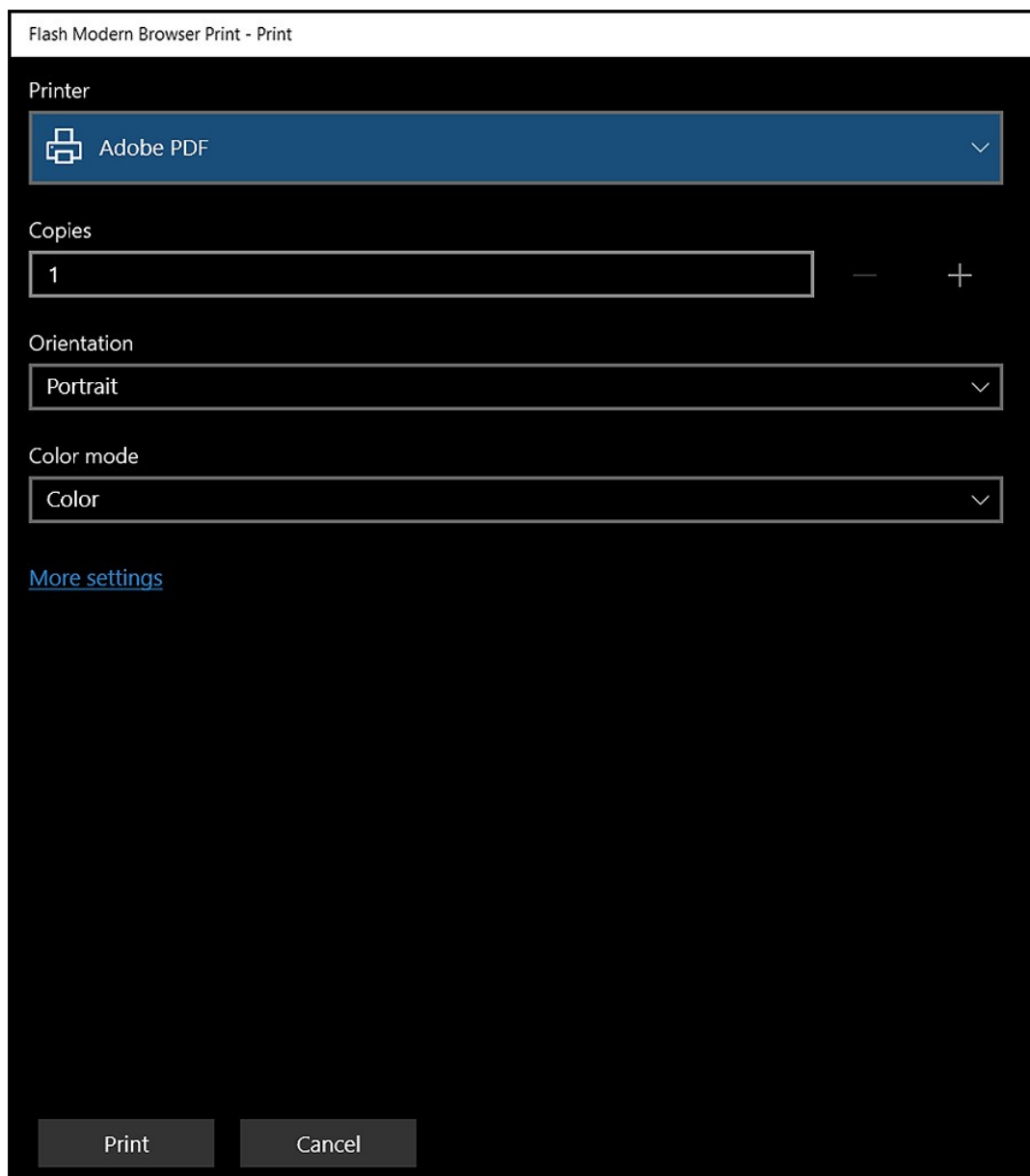


If you are using Firefox and having issues printing you can try switching to Microsoft Print To PDF. If that doesn’t work then try this:-

Go to the top left menu in your browser and click “File” – “Print”. The little popup box will appear as before. Just click “OK”.

The folder window will appear and you can now name and save your PDF. Done!

In Microsoft Edge – If you are using the Edge browser you will see a popup screen similar to this nest image after you click the green “Print” button:-



Just leave the options as default. Make sure the orientation is set to "Portrait" and the color mode is set to "Monochrome". Click "Print" The folder window will appear and you can now name and save your PDF. Done!

STEP TWO

CREATING THE WORKSHEET IMAGES

At this point you will have all your generated PDF worksheets in one folder. You now need to convert those PDF sheets into individual images so that you can insert them into your book template.

There are three ways of converting your PDF’s to images and I will explain what they are below:-

Photoshop CS – This option will be the fastest and easiest and saves time but of course you will need a version of Photoshop which is quite expensive.

You can literally drag and drop a PDF into Photoshop and you can save it as an image..job done. Another great thing about this method is that you can bulk convert all your PDF’s to images in a matter of seconds.

If you own this software then you would most likely be advanced enough to know how to convert your PDF’s to images.

Adobe Acrobat Pro – This is another fast and simple option but not as complete as Photoshop but it’s close enough. As with Photoshop Acrobat Pro is expensive but I have found it to be super helpful with regards to my publishing business.

With Acrobat you have the option to convert your PDF’s to images at a click of a button. I am not fully knowledgeable with this

software so I am not sure if you can bulk convert but at a guess I would say it probably can do that.

Using A Free Online PDF To Image Converter – This is likely to be the option that most of you will opt for because it won’t cost you a penny and does not require any software skills.

Before the actual conversion process I want to save you even more time by showing you how to first merge all your PDF’s into one. By doing this you will literally be able to bulk convert with ease.

Your PDF files will now be merged into one PDF. Once you have merged your PDF’s you can see how to quickly and easily convert it into individual images using this free option in the video below.

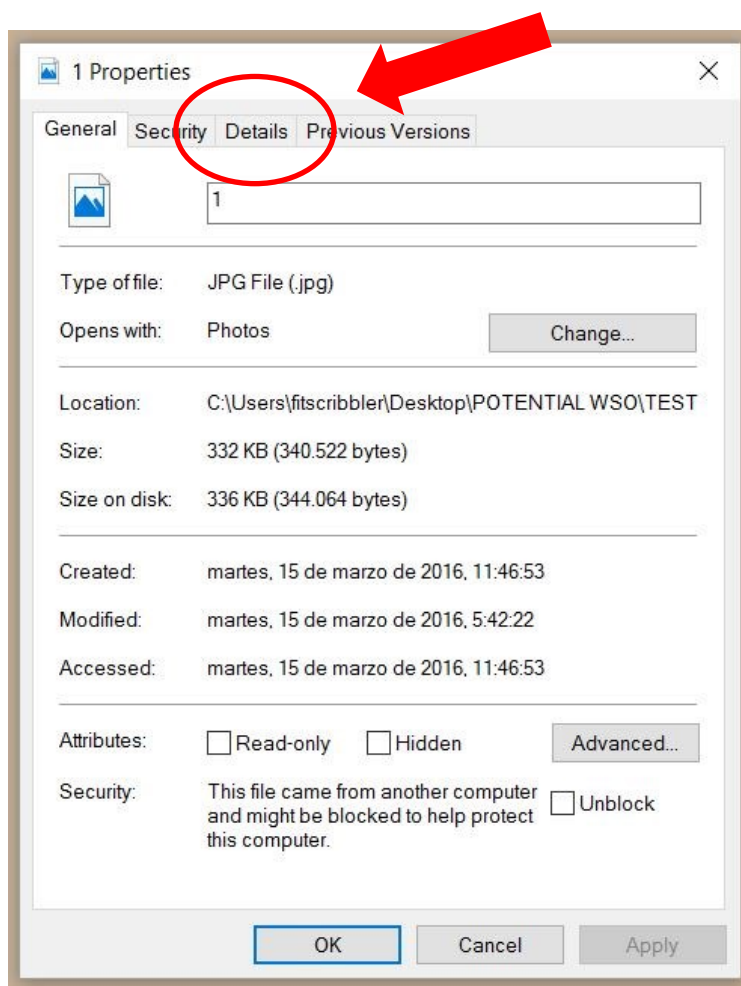
By following the above video tutorials you will have not only jpg images but images that have been automatically converted to 300dpi.

NOTE ABOUT IMAGE DPI

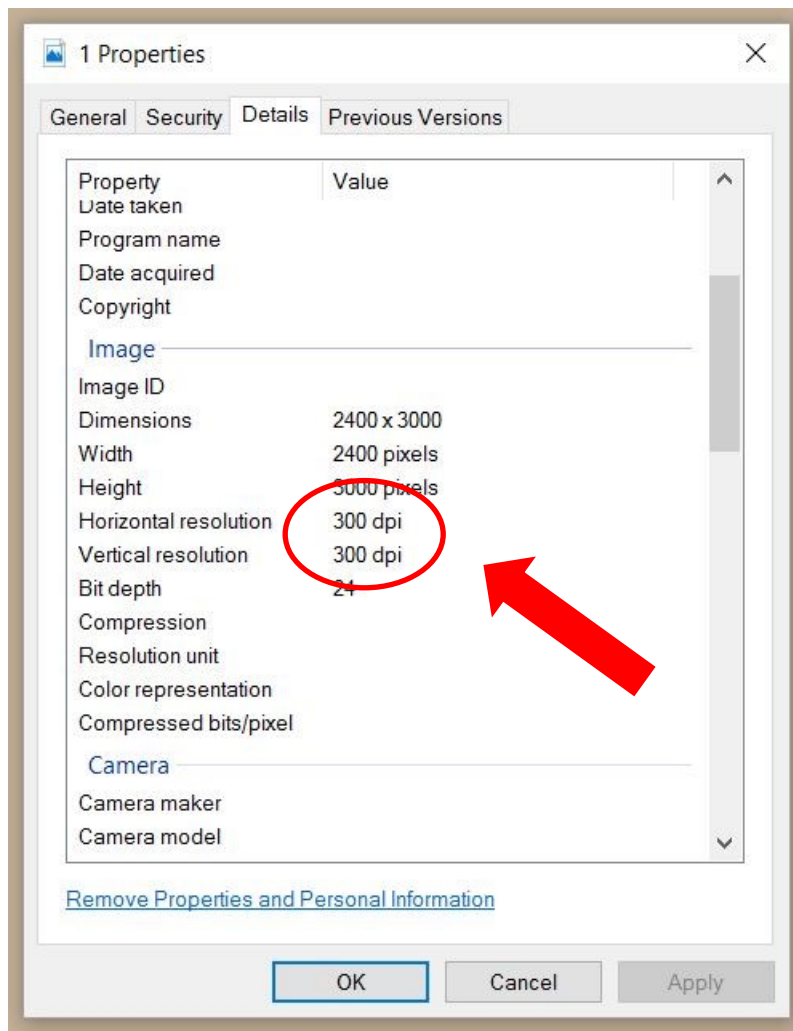
You are creating children’s workbooks that will be ready to print. In order to make sure the images within your book are printed in the best quality you will need to make sure they all have resolutions set at 300dpi.

The reason for this is because Createspace want your images to be at its highest quality and 300dpi is their chosen minimum. If you followed my video tutorials then all your images should already be set to 300dpi. If you wanted to check one of your images to make sure you can...

- 1.** Go into one of your image folders and right click on any image.
- 2.** A box will pop up. Then click on the “Properties” option, (it is usually located at the bottom of the popup box).
- 3.** You should now see something like the image below. Click on the “Details” tab.



4. You should now see something like the box on the next page. Scroll down until you see the “Horizontal Resolution” and Vertical Resolution”. Beside those is the image dpi. If it is less than 300dpi then you will need to change that.



HOW TO CHANGE THE IMAGE DPI

If you used one of the other options for converting your PDF to images, i.e. you used Adobe Acrobat or Photoshop, then the dpi would not have automatically changed to 300.

So, if you are not sure how to change the dpi on an image below are two videos from my puzzle book courses that will show you the simple method.

Changing the dpi to your images is very easy. These two short video tutorials show you how to do it using the image software “Paint.net” and “Photoshop”. You can use any image software you like but I have found these two to be the simplest for me.

If you do not have Photoshop then you can download Paint.net from the link I provided below.

You can do batch image conversions instead of one at a time but you may need to download a special Paint.net plugin to do so. I believe this is the plugin although I have never tried it:

You can batch convert images instead of one at a time but that involves setting up the Photoshop “Actions” tab.

You may notice that when you change to 300dpi your image will be automatically enlarged. If you find the image to be way to big all

you have to do before you save is drop the image size to whatever you prefer.

CROPPING YOUR IMAGES TO FIT THE BOOK TEMPLATE

Your images are almost ready to be inserted into the book template. If you want, you can insert them as they are but I prefer to clean up any unwanted areas. These areas include the text at the top and bottom of each image – (Don’t worry, you may add a full page credit to the website at the front or back of your book if you wish).

To delete these areas you will need to use image software such as Paint.net or Photoshop. If you own Photoshop then I will assume you already know how to delete areas on an image.

For those of you who are newbies when it comes to imaging software then you can download the free [Paint.net](http://www.getpaint.net) - <http://www.getpaint.net> - program and watch the video below to see how to delete and crop with Paint.

You are very close to completing your first children’s early learning book. You have all the main contents completed...now it is time to put it all together.

STEP THREE

TIME TO PUT YOUR BOOK TOGETHER

Ok, now things get even easier because all you have to do is insert all the worksheet images into your book template, add an introduction, update the table of contents and you are done!

LET’S BEGIN!

Open up the prepared 8 x 10 book template provided with this course. As you can see I have added some simple instructions on certain pages so as you can adapt the book to however you want it.

The template has been fully formatted so you don’t need to do anything else except for add whatever written content you want and insert your worksheet images...it’s that simple.

Let’s take a closer look at the template:-

Front Page – Here is where you will add the title of your book, a sub-title and the name of your book series, (if you plan on creating a book series).

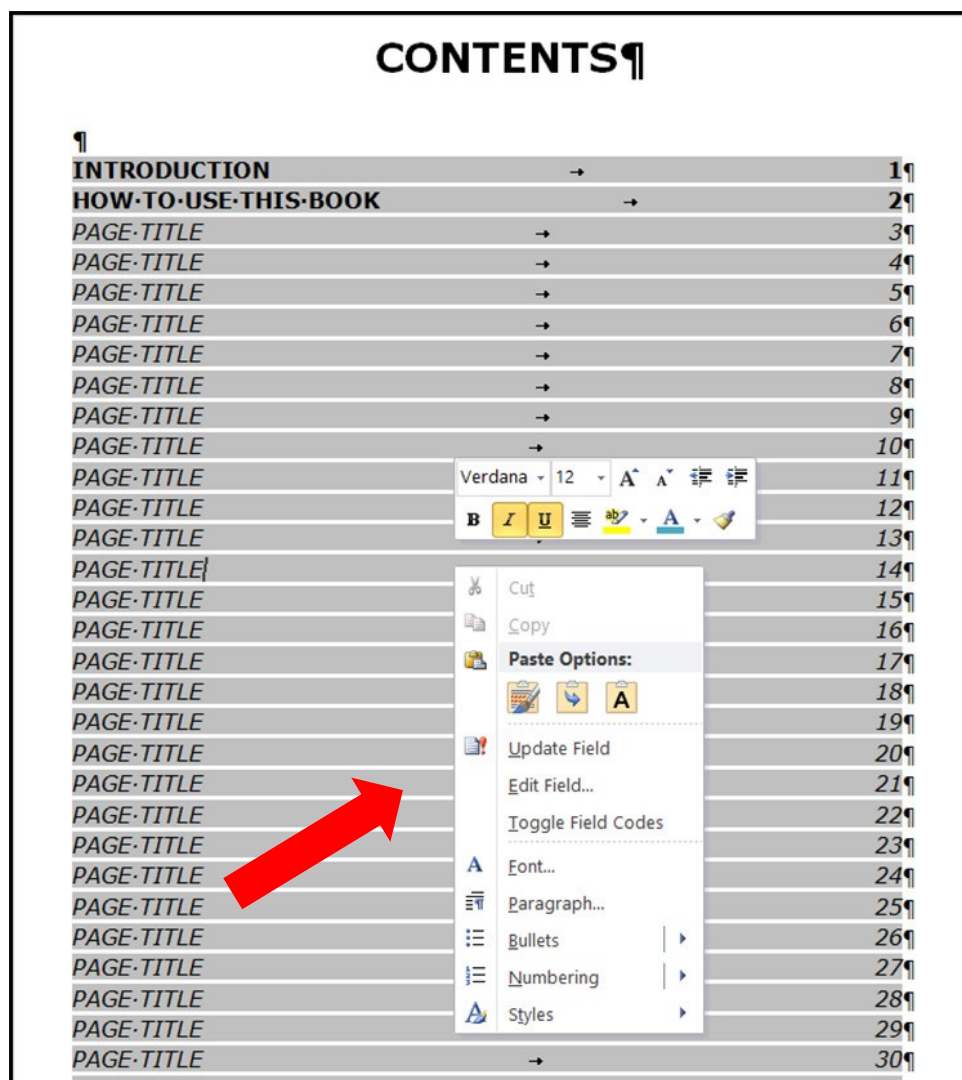
Also, if you have a brand website address then at the bottom of this page would be the perfect place to add it.

Blank Page Spaces – The page spaces in the template are important because it is how the book is formatted in order to be created into a print book. Do not add any content in those blank page spaces.

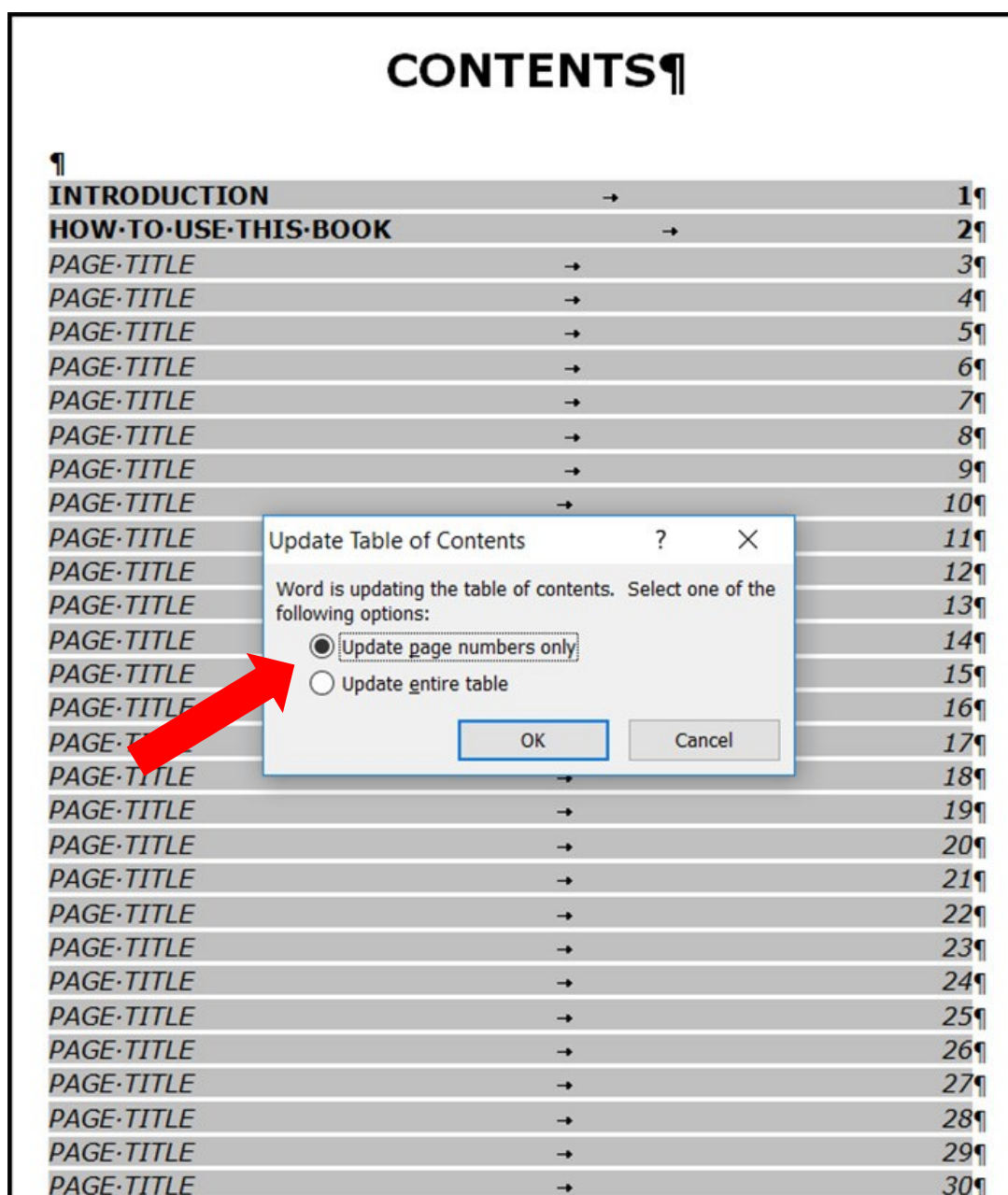
Copyright Notice – This is just a basic copyright notice so you can change it to whatever you want. You can find examples of copyright pages by searching Google. Type in “copyright notice for books samples” and you should get a lot of search results to choose from.

Table Of Contents – This can be easily edited to suit your needs and you can even delete the whole thing if you don’t want a TOB.

The TOB has already been formatted in the templates but you can edit the settings by right clicking anywhere in your table of contents and choosing “**Edit Field**” in the popup.



NOTE: When you have completed adding all your content to the book don't forget to go back to the table of contents page and to update the list. You do this by right clicking on the text and this time choosing **"Update Field"** in the popup. You then can choose which type of update you want. I usually just click **"Update Entire Table"**.



Introduction – It is not necessary to add an introduction but I think it is a good idea to add at least a page of introduction material to explain the purpose of the book and why you decided to create the book, etc.

How To Use This Book – Again, you don’t need to add any instructions for your book but readers may appreciate some details of the best way to use the book and maybe add some tips on teaching children, etc..

Page Title – There are around 350 free pages for you to add content and they all have text at the top. You can add whatever text you want here or remove the page titles entirely if you wish.

If you are creating something like a word book or alphabet book the page title would be a good place to add the main word or alphabet.

So as an example, in the case of an alphabet book you would add each letter of the alphabet at the top of each individual page. You could have the full alphabet in uppercase letters and then the full alphabet in lowercase letters.

Adding New Pages - To add new pages do not use the “Return” key. What you will need to do is click near the end of the previous page and then on your keyboard hold “Ctrl” and click “Return”. Doing this will bring up a nice clean page.

Book Back Matter – This is where a lot of people mess up. The back matter of your book can be very beneficial in helping to getting repeat sales. This back area of your book is where you can advertise your brand and other books in your catalog.

If you are just starting out you will begin to see the benefits after you have a few books in your catalog but it is well worth the wait. If you have an email list set up then you can add an opt in address where people can sign up. You would offer a free gift of some sort to entice readers to sign up to your list.

If you don’t have a list you can add your book website address where people can go to view all your other books. What I do is add my Author Central url and ask people to go check out all my books on that page on Amazon. **You can learn how to set up your Author Central Page by reading the Amazon Author Central Tutorial in the EXTRAS folder provided with this course.**

Adding images of all your books is also a good way to catch the eye of your readers to entice them to look at your book catalog. I left examples at the end of the template to give you an idea of what you could do with your book cover images.

Adding Credits – Regardless of whether you removed the “handwritingpractice.net” credit or not at the bottom of each page I still think it appropriate to add a full or half page credit to the program.

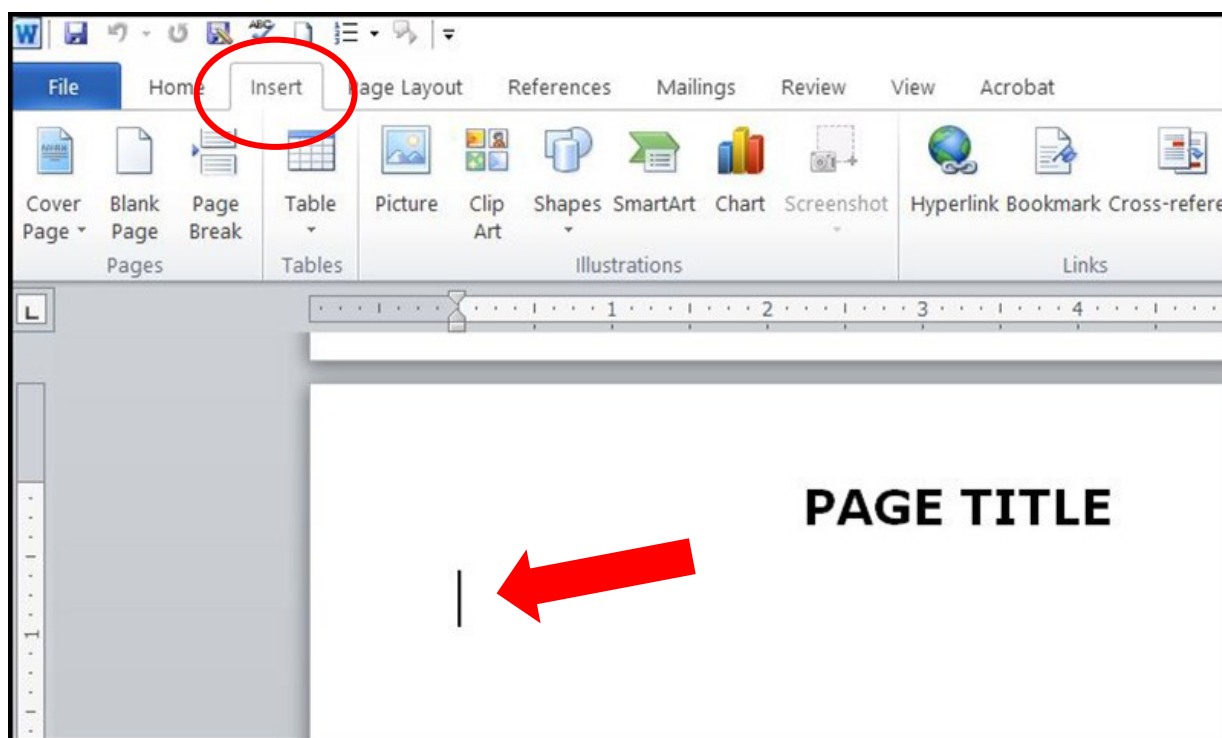
You can add something like “The worksheets in this book were created using handwritingpractice.net. An amazing tool that allows you to create a number of different handwriting practice worksheets for children”.

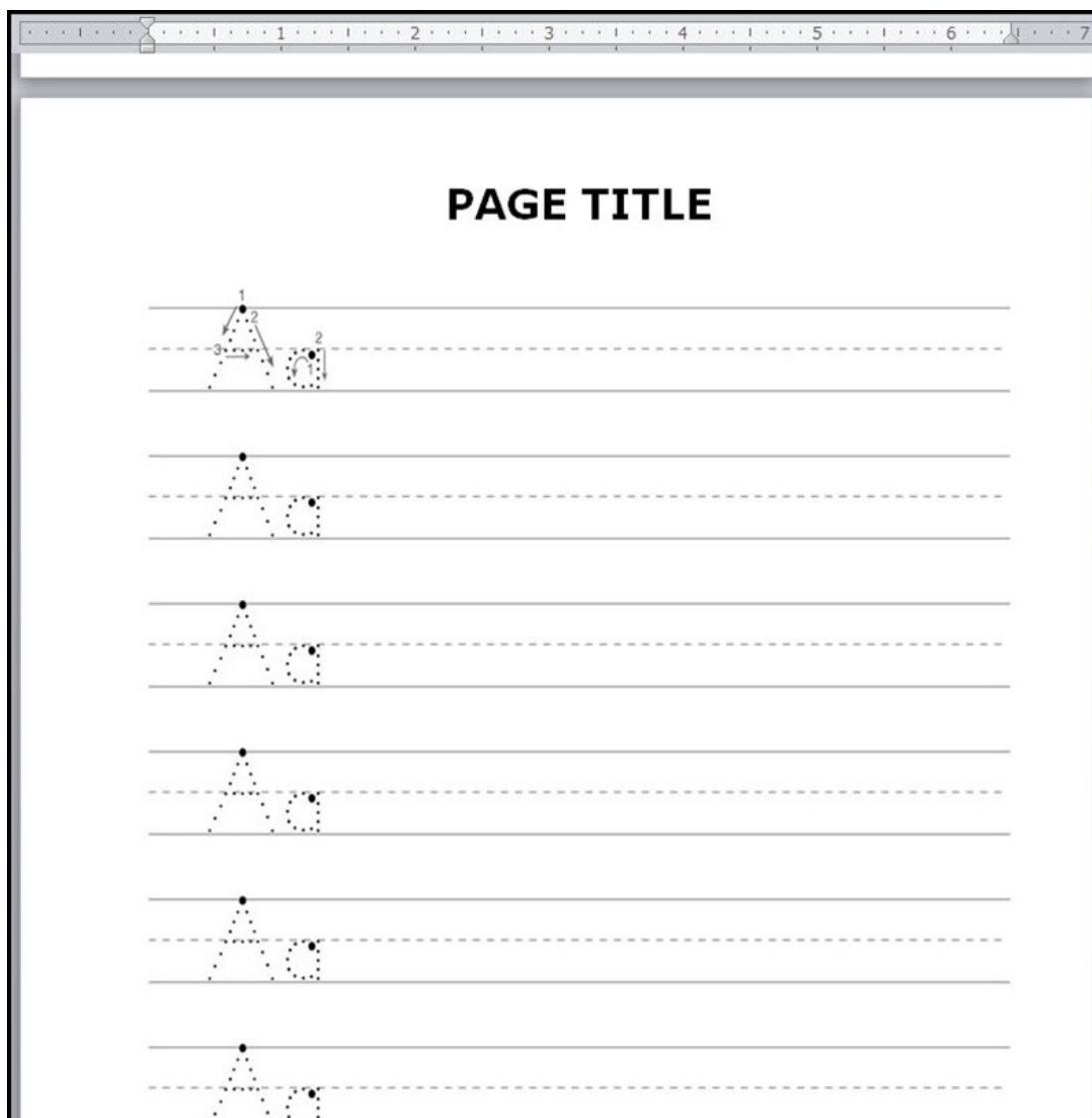
INSERTING YOUR WORKSHEET IMAGES

You now understand the layout of your template which means there is only one thing left to do...add your images and complete your book content.

Images should be inserted by using the **Insert>picture** function found in the top left of the Microsoft Word ribbon. If you are using Open Office or some other word processor then use their insert option in the menus. There are some explanations for adding images using OpenOffice [HERE](#)

Click onto your book template and scroll down to the first title or page. Click beneath that title or click at the top of the page, then click INSERT / PICTURE, select your image, click INSERT button and your image will now be inserted into your page. Repeat for all your other pages and images.





This part of the process can be a little tedious but keep at it and you will have the contents of your book completed in no time.

STEP FOUR

YOUR BOOK COVER

How you choose your finished book to look is VERY important. You need to spend a bit of time researching other books in your genre to get an idea of what style of covers seem to be the most popular.

In other words, you want to create covers that are similar in design to the top selling books. Let’s face it, one of the reasons why those books are top selling IS because of their covers. It certainly is a factor.

If the thought of designing your own book covers intimidates you, (I get it...I was like that the first time I designed a book cover), then have no fear because you don’t actually have to do any of the actual designing. You can pay someone on [Fiverr.com](https://www.fiverr.com) to do all that tech stuff for you.

Having said that, YOU DO want to have a rough idea of how you want the cover to look, even if you are not creating it yourself. If you are using an outside source to create the covers for you then you will need to provide them with some detailed instructions of how you want your book cover to look.

This is why you need to do some research first. Personally if you plan on making something of this business method, if you plan on growing your own little children’s book empire then I would suggest you at least learn how to create your own covers...over time. One of the reasons for this is because you will not have to wait on others

to provide you with your covers. If you find a good cover designer then chances are they will have a backlog of work which means you will have to get in line.

Also, there is no guarantee that you will like the cover the first time round...which means you have to wait another few days until the person gets it to look how you want it.

Another big reason why it is better to do your own covers is that it won't cost you anything....except for your time!

Having said all that, there is nothing wrong with outsourcing your covers as long as you find someone who can do a good job and not charge you a fortune.

If I wasn't such a perfectionist I would probably find myself a good designer and pay them to do all my covers but the truth is I enjoy creating my own covers...it gives me a sense of achievement...mostly because I learn something new every time.

Let's say you wanted to give it a go...you want to create your own covers but you are a total beginner when it comes to imaging software.

Not to worry, because a great way to start designing your own book covers is to use the in-built free cover design program within KDP. It's called the Kindle Cover Creator and it is very easy to use.

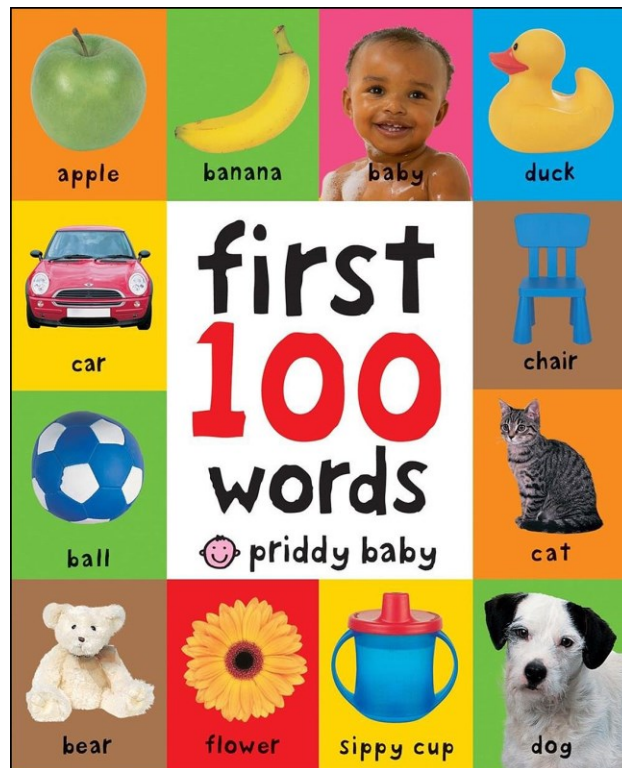

TIPS FOR A GOOD CHILDREN’S BOOK COVER

Just to help you along a little bit we are going to take a look at some of the big children’s book sellers within this early learning category. This will give you a better idea of what you need to be looking for when putting your book cover together.

This first book is a huge seller and is currently ranked at #13 in Books! That means this book alone is providing a pretty awesome monthly passive income for the author.

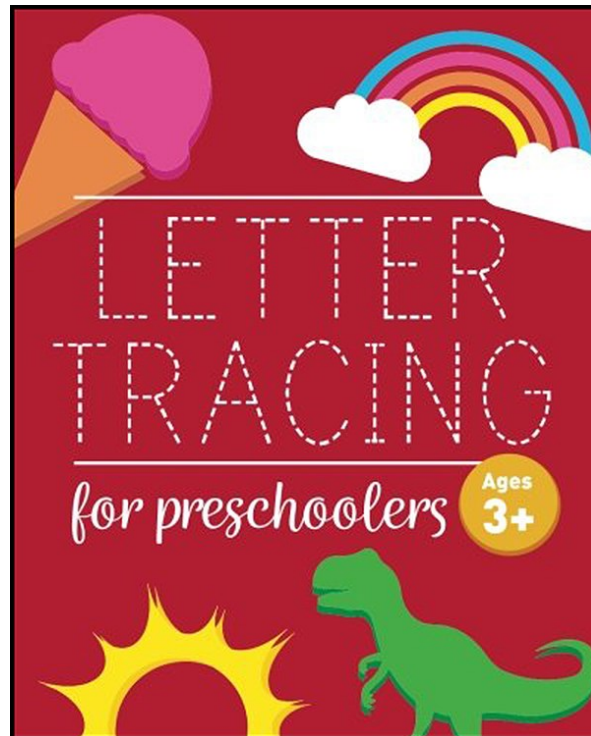
To be in the top 100 books is a dream come true for most authors and publishers. Anyway, take a look at this cover and think about what it is that makes it so special...or not so special for that matter.



Look at how colorful it is with some fun images and a very basic title. There is nothing amazing about this cover but it is eye-catching and bright...which is what you want in a children’s book cover.

Take notice of the baby smiling and staring right at you which kind of adds a personal touch to it. Come to think of it the dog and teddy bear are staring out too...I wonder if that helps with the cover. Kids love animals...kids love their teddy bears.

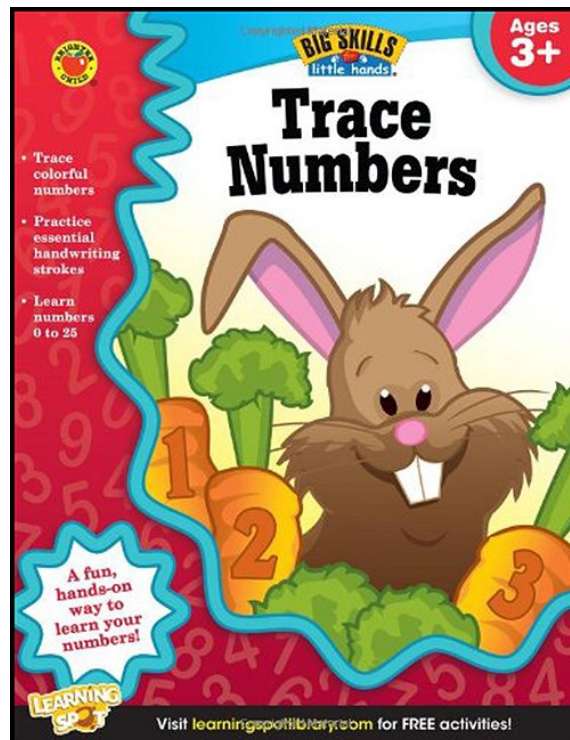
This next book is ranked at #12,057 in Books, which means it is also selling pretty well.



Just look at the simplicity of it with a very basic one color background, simple title text and general images that kids are drawn too.

You don't have to be an expert cover designer to create this but it does the trick by being easy on the eye with a large title that tells you exactly what you are getting.

Take a look at this next book. This particular book has been at the top of the bestsellers list for a long time and is still doing very well ranking at #618 in Books.

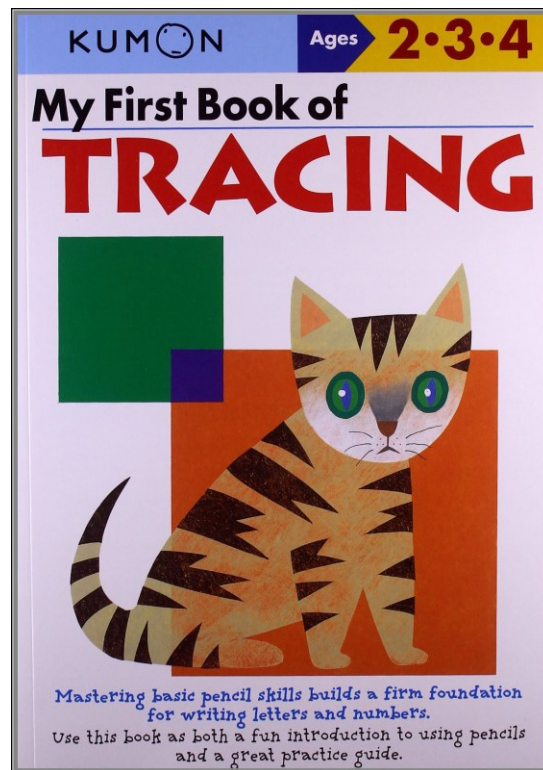


In my opinion this is an amazing cover and I would guess that a professional created it. The colors are spot on, the large images are fun and eye-catching and the placement of everything draws the eye to the bunny and the title above.

You can see the designer relied on the images to do the selling of the book because the title text is quite small. As well as the main images you can see lots of little bits of information about the book placed in colorful badges and circles.

If you can get your covers to look anywhere near this then you might be in for a boost in sales!

The last book cover I want to look at is ranked at #2,599 in Books. Out of all the above book covers this has to be my least favorite.



I am just not a fan of the colored squares in the background although I like the cat image. The large title font and the cat draw you in but the text at the bottom looks real bad to me. I understand the choice of font used but in my opinion it is risky for a book cover. Font needs to be clear and easy to read.

Having said that this book is selling like hotcakes so whatever I think about the cover matters not! Thousands of people must like it and there could be any number of reasons why.

Overall, when you look at these covers and others in the top 100 you can see that there are some similarities in color, font use, font size and image use. The trick is to keep it simple and this is especially so if you have zero experience in design. Don't try to

design something that is beyond your skill level...it will be noticeable. Trust me...I can vouch for that!

Keep your book covers stupid simple and don’t forget your main targets are the children. You need to catch their attention. If you get their attention then you will get mum and dad’s attention too.

The cover for your physical book is a one-piece, wraparound cover that includes your front cover, back cover and spine.

Your front cover should have the title, subtitle, if any, and author name. It may also have whatever image you chose for your cover.

BOOK COVER GENERAL TIPS

The tips below are just general and tend to work well with the inexperienced cover designer. As you become more experienced these general rules tend to get broken.

- The title should be big and easy to read because people will first encounter your cover on a screen, not on a shelf.
- Don’t forget to review a thumbnail image of the cover. Is the cover compelling at a small size? More people are buying books on a Kindle or mobile device, so you want the cover to read clearly no matter where it appears. You should also anticipate what the cover looks like in grayscale.
- No font explosions or special styling. Usually a cover should not use more than 2 fonts. Avoid the temptation to put words in caps, italics caps, outlined caps, all on one cover!

- Whatever images you use, the better the quality the better your book cover will look. Nuff said!
- Avoid gradients. Leave these to the pros.
- Avoid garish color combinations. Sometimes such covers are meant to catch people’s attention. Usually, it just makes your book look freakish.
- Avoid using too many colors. I usually stick to around a max of three maybe four if the colors are a little on the dull side.

NEW UPDATE: IN THIS NEXT SECTION – “UPLOADING YOUR BOOK & COVER” - HAS BEEN UPDATED DUE TO CHANGES REGARDING THE OLD CREATESPACE PLATFORM.

In the original text I went on to describe how to upload your book manuscript to Createspace in order to have it printed. Unfortunately, that platform has now closed so publishers now use Kindle Direct Publishing, (KDP), for this process.

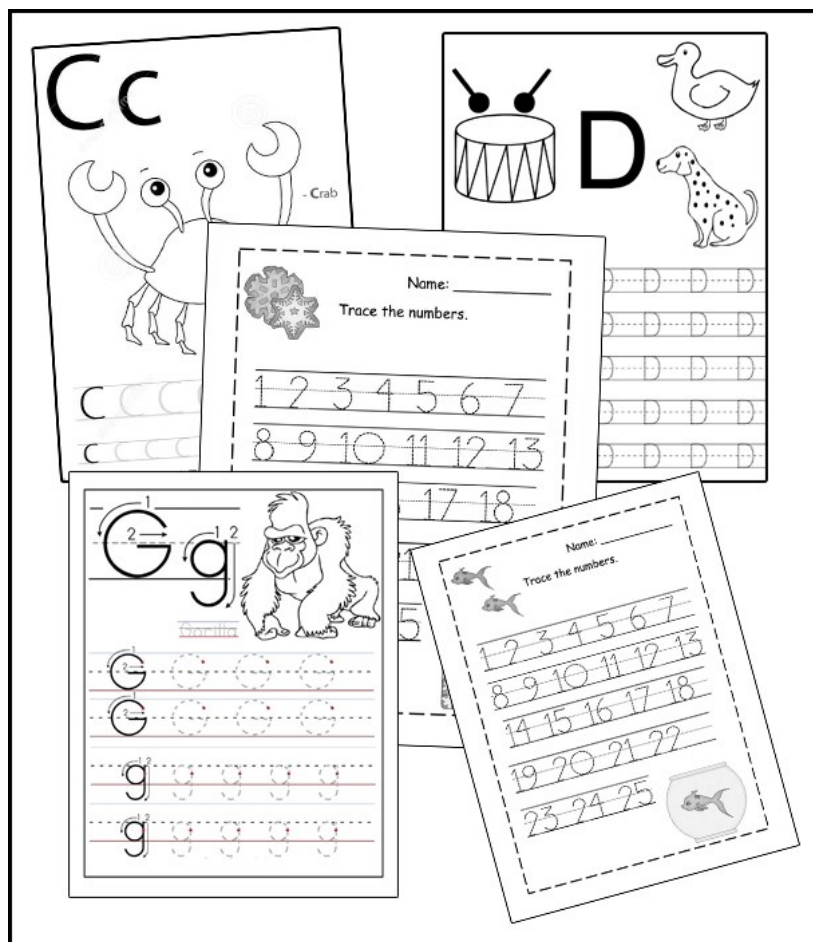
Yes...KDP now do print books...which is great news!

So when it comes time to upload your book to KDP just head on over to the **EXTRAS folder which came with this course.**

STEP FIVE

CREATE YOUR WORKSHEET

You can add images to your worksheets wherever you want and at whatever size you want. You can be as creative as you want when choosing your images.

For the purpose of this tutorial I will just be showing you how to add an image to the top of your worksheets. The worksheet creation process for creating books with images is pretty much the same as SECTION 1 but you will need to leave more available free space on the worksheet for you to insert an image.

This means you will have less room for tracing words, letters, numbers etc...but that is perfectly fine because these types of books cater for even younger children.

LET’S BEGIN!

The first thing you want to do is decide on what type of book content you are planning on focusing on. So for example, if you want to create word books you need a list of the words you will be using so as you can find the appropriate images to match those words.

Same goes for if you are doing an alphabet book or a numbers book...you are going to need images of all the alphabet and numbers that you will be featuring.

To find free images for your books check out the FINDING IMAGES PDF that comes with this course. The PDF is in the

EXTRAS folder and has a list of websites you can go to for free images and graphics for your books.

When finding images for your books make sure they are PNG files and make sure to save them as PNG files. The reason for this is because you want the image backgrounds to be transparent.

For this tutorial I will be demonstrating using animals as a book theme. So let’s assume you are creating an animals word tracing book.

1. As explained in the earlier steps from SECTION 1,(page 21), you will be using the Handwriting Practice website to create your worksheets but the choice in options will be slightly different this time. So, Go to [Handwriting Practice](#).
2. Choose the writing style that you want to use by clicking on the appropriate oval shape button.
3. In the provided options, choose your “**Font Type**”. Click on the circle next to your chosen type.
4. Next you want to choose your “**Letter Style**”. As before, just Click on the circle next to your chosen style.
5. Now you have to choose which “**Worksheet Style**” you want. Same process as before.
6. Choose your letter size under the title option “**Change Letter Size**”. Bear in mind that you will be adding an image on your page so decide whether you want larger text but less of them or smaller text but more of them.

This also depends on the age of the children you are targeting. The younger the child the larger the text. So for preschoolers I would opt for “large” to “super big” text.

7. In the next option, “**Paper Layout**” choose “Portrait”.
8. Under “Paper Size” I usually pick “**US Letter**” but either option will be fine.
9. Leave “**Colors**” as default.
10. Before you press “Print” button move over to the left where it says “**Change Title Here**”. I recommend not adding a title because a title takes up room but you can add one if you wish. To remove any text in the title area just click in the rectangle box below the title and push the space key on your keyboard once. This will remove the title and leave a blank space.
11. Now move up to the other rectangle above where it says “**Type Worksheet Content Here**” and add the text of your choice. Short text are best because you will be adding an image to the worksheet later.
12. Now your row options have appeared to the left of your worksheet. This is where you have to change things. You want the very first row to be blank in order to allow room for your image. So, in the rows options, for the top row, you need to click on the “**No Row**” option.

- 13.** Now you can click **"Print"** and follow the same printing options as mentioned in the SECTION 1 steps under the title **GOING TO PRINT** on page 29.

STEP SIX

DELETE & CROP ON YOUR WORKSHEET

Follow the exact same instructions as STEP 2 in SECTION 1, (page 35), regarding the merging of your PDF’s and their conversions to images. This process is the same.

Follow those instructions until you get to **CROPPING YOUR IMAGES TO FIT THE BOOK TEMPLATE** on page 40

You will need to crop your worksheets slightly different this time in order to allow the inclusion of your additional images.

Watch the video below to see how to set up your worksheet to allow for additional images. Even if you use Photoshop just take a look at the video to give you an idea of what you need to do.

Once you have cropped all your images make sure to save them all in one folder to keep things organized. In the next step you are going to learn how to insert an image on an image...in other words you will be adding your chosen images to each worksheet.

STEP SEVEN

INSERTING YOUR IMAGE ONTO YOUR WORKSHEETS

Before you start, make sure you have the correct number of PNG images saved in one place so you know where to find them.

Also, it may be a good idea to keep your PNG images at no more than 800x800 pixels because you will only be inserting it to a small portion of your worksheet. Depending on the shape of the image something around the 600 pixels mark should be big enough.

One more thing....make sure the images are quality and sharp. You don’t want blurry pictures in your books! So when choosing your images try to avoid the cheap looking ones because you don’t want people to complain about the quality of your books.

Go through your images and if any are huge then resize them in your imaging software. It is possible to resize after you inserted the image but you don’t want to be resizing down a 5000x5000 pixel image to a 800x800 image...that is just too much of a difference.

Do most of your resizing in your image software and then any small amounts of resizing can be done in the book template after inserting.

As I mentioned in the last step I will be demonstrating using Microsoft Word but the process is similar using other word

processors such as Openoffice. If you get stuck, go to the Openoffice link at the end of the last step and all is explained there.

Below is a video to show you the process of inserting your images to your worksheets.

CONCLUSION

All done! You can relax now. I know there was a lot to take in so it may be a good idea to re-read certain parts before you begin creating your own books because there may be some small details that you could have missed.

If you are a newbie to book publishing then just take your time and go through the steps carefully...I have left nothing out. All the instructions you need as well as all the tools are right here in this course.

Be patient when creating your books and remember that this is a long-term system that will help you to build your own book brand and passive income. Your first book may take the longest to put together but once you settle in by the time you are on your third book you would have found your own way of doing things and the process will get so much easier.
